On March 28, 2002, the Commissioner of Education granted the application filed by the Board of Education of the Township of South Brunswick (hereinafter "Board") for an equivalency or waiver to "permit evaluation of tenured staff members through a comprehensive model including areas such as action research, peer coaching, mentoring and portfolio assessment." The South Brunswick Education Association (hereinafter "appellant") filed an appeal with the State Board of Education challenging that approval.

On September 27, 2002, the parties submitted a proposed settlement agreement in which the Board agreed that it would not utilize the waiver granted by the Commissioner, and the appellant agreed to withdraw its appeal.

We have reviewed the proposed settlement and find it to be in accord with the principles expressed in <u>In re Cardonick</u>, decided by the State Board of Education, April 6, 1983. We therefore approve the settlement in this matter.
