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18 New Jersey School Districts Receive Federal Grants to Improve World Language Instruction

Commissioner of Education William L. Librera today announced that 18 school districts are receiving nearly a half million dollars in grants to strengthen and enhance their world languages programs. The districts competed for the grants under the federal Elementary School Foreign Language Incentive Program.

"Congratulations to our school districts for their high level of success in competing for grants in this program," said Commissioner William L. Librera. "New Jersey has strong academic standards in world languages at the elementary school level, and we will continue to help our students obtain essential knowledge and skills in this core content area."

Dr. Librera noted that New Jersey received \$479,804 of a total of approximately \$6 million in grants made available nationally by the U.S. Department of Education.

The Foreign Language Incentive Program is part of a federal effort to support the expansion and improvement of educational programs that meet critical needs. Grant applicants had to offer at least 45 minutes of world language instruction for at least four days a week throughout the academic year in order to compete for funds.

Education research shows that world language study can increase children's capacity for critical and creative thinking skills, and children who study a second language show greater cognitive development in areas such as mental flexibility, creativity, tolerance and higher order thinking skills. Furthermore, studies report that children who have learned a world language in elementary school achieve expected gains and score higher on standardized tests in reading, language arts, and mathematics than children who have not studied a foreign language.
