Complaint Disposition: The Custodian certifies that he did not receive a records request from the Complainant. Additionally, the Complainant provided no credible evidence to refute the agency's certifications. Therefore, the complaint is without any reasonable factual basis to pursue.

Applicable OPRA Provision: "A request for access to a government record shall be in writing and hand-delivered, mailed, transmitted electronically or otherwise conveyed *to the appropriate custodian.*" N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5(g) (emphasis added). See Kossup v. NJ State Police, GRC Complaint No. 2014-299 (September 2015); Mitchell v. NJ Motor Vehicle Comm'n., GRC Complaint No. 2013-13 (August 2013).

"The council shall make a determination as to whether the complaint is within its jurisdiction or frivolous or *without any reasonable factual basis*." N.J.S.A. 47:1A-7(e) (emphasis added).

This is the final administrative determination in this matter. Any further review should be pursued in the Appellate Division of the Superior Court of New Jersey within forty-five (45) days.
