Custodian of Record: Stephen A. Pogany Requests Received by Custodian: July 1, 2020 GRC Complaint Received: September 22, 2020

Complaint Disposition: The Complainant affirmatively stated on the Denial of Access Complaint form that she instituted an action in the Superior Court of New Jersey challenging the same records denial decision at issue in the instant complaint before the GRC. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 47:1A-6, the GRC shall dismiss this complaint because an action is already pending in the Superior Court. See Lopez-Rodriguez v. Passaic Cnty. Prosecutor's Office, GRC Complaint No. 2008-23 (March 2008).

Applicable OPRA Provision: "A person who is denied access to a government record by the custodian of the record, at the option of the requestor, may: institute a proceeding to challenge the custodian's decision by filing an action in Superior Court . . .; or in lieu of filing an action in Superior Court, file a complaint with the Government Records Council . . ." N.J.S.A. 47:1A-6 (emphasis added).

This is the final administrative determination in this matter. Any further review should be pursued in the Appellate Division of the Superior Court of New Jersey within forty-five (45) days.
