

Administrative & Support & Waste Management & Remediation Services Sector (NAICS 56)

Occupation

Forty-eight percent (n=98) of the victims of fatal work-related injuries in the Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services sector were in the Building and Grounds Cleaning and Maintenance occupations (see detailed description in second table); followed by Transportation and Material Moving (n=59, 29%); and Construction and Extraction occupations (n=20, 10%).
