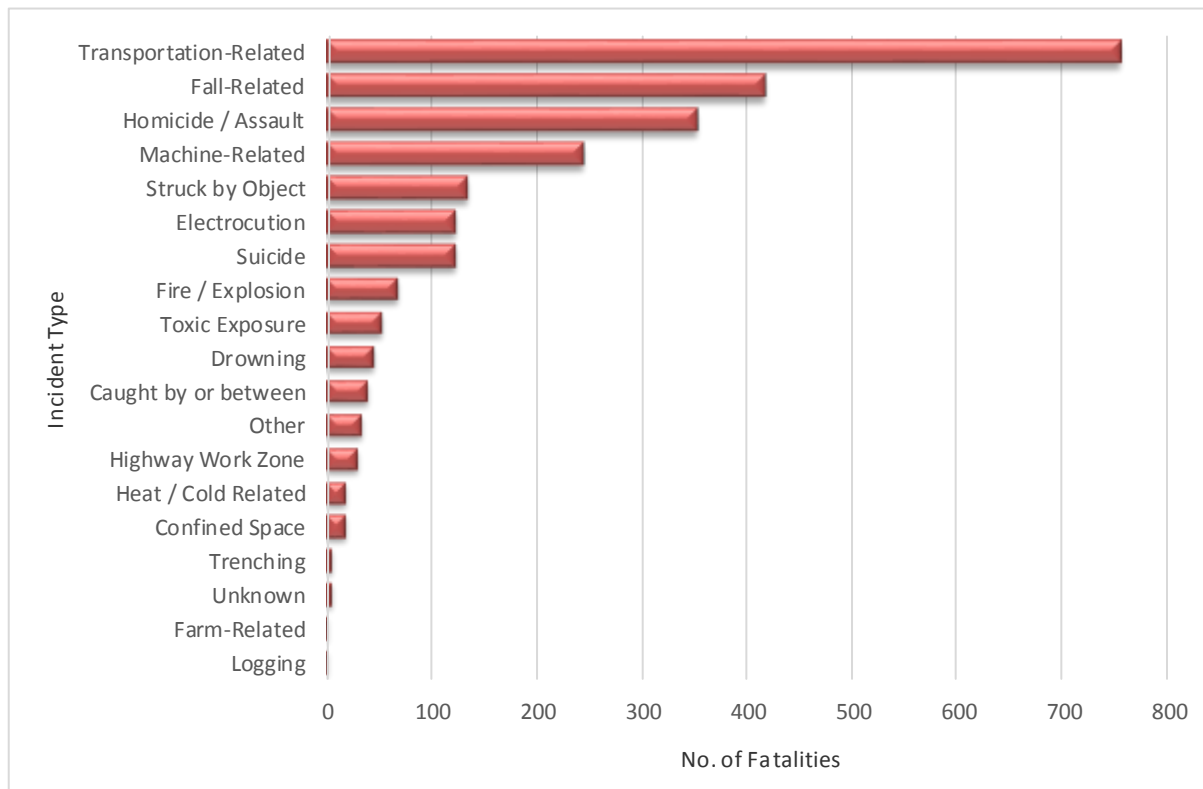


Types of Incidents

The types of incidents associated with fatal occupational injuries that have occurred in NJ during the period 1990 to 2013 are listed, in order of frequency below. Of the 2,470 fatal occupational injuries identified, the three leading incidents were Transportation-related (n=755, 30%); Falls (n=417, 17%); and Homicides/Assaults (n=353, 14%). Transportation-related incidents were the leading cause of death for both males (n=696, 28%) and females (n=59, 2%) as shown in the Table below.
