Students do not need to take the Mathematics placement test if they provide proof of taking college level math course or equivalent math placement exam at another regionally accredited college or if they provide an SAT score report showing a math score in one of the following ranges:

• An SAT score report showing a math score of at least 550 (or ACT score of 23) places the student into Precalculus or Statistics, but the student may opt to take the placement test for possible placement into the Calculus sequence.




