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DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS FEBRUARY 2011

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Statistics.

WFNJ/TANF

- At the end of February, the TANF caseload increased by 2,211 cases, from 38,398 in February 2010 to 40,609 in February 2011, a 5.8% increase.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since February 2010 include Passaic (25.3%), Ocean (16.6%), and Morris (16.2%).
- The counties that decreased since February 2010 were Somerset (-3.1%), Monmouth (-4.3%), and Sussex (-6.4%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF families, 9,807 or 24.1% were child-only cases in February 2011.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,608), Hudson (1,249), and Camden (1,170).
- Essex (21,934), Hudson (11,867), and Camden (11,358) counties have the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in February 2011.

NJ SNAP (FOOD STAMPS)

- In February 2011, there are 355,763 households receiving food stamps. NJ SNAP households increased by 65,762, or 22.7%, since February 2010.
- There were 723,887 persons receiving food stamps as of February 2011, an increase of 134,341 or 22.8% since February 2010.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since February 2010 are Hunterdon (36.8%), Ocean (35.5%), and Middlesex (35.2%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 6,220 families receiving emergency assistance (EA) in February 2011, an increase of 869 or 16.2% since February 2010.
- In February 2011, EA payments were made for 1,242 SSI recipients.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 8,206 emergency assistance payments made to GA recipients in February 2011, an increase of 96 or 1.2% since February 2010.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Passaic (45.5%), Burlington (34.9%), and Ocean (25.9%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of persons for GA has increased from 51,971 to 55,023 since February 2010, an increase of 5.9%.
- There were 38,125 Employable GA and 16,898 Unemployable GA recipients in February 2011.
- Gloucester (35.1%), Hudson (31.4%), and Cape May (27.0%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA persons since February 2010.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about 301 million dollars from September 2009 to December 2010, an increase of 0.3 percent over the same period for FFY 2010.
- Total distributions increased over 1 percent from December 2009.


WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of February 2011, there were 3,695 families where at least one member is employed and an additional 476 families where WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active recipients were: Essex (885), Hudson (442), and Camden (353).
- There were 3,384 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period Ending With FEBRUARY 2011



WFNJ/TANF Work Participation Rates for 12-Month Period Ending with FEBRUARY 2011 Statewide



ACRONYMS

ACSES: Automated Child Support Enforcement System

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly The Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKIDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, Ingenix has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA establishes Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. The emphasis is on achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
