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DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS APRIL 2012

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Statistics.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of April, the TANF caseload had decreased by 872 cases, from 40,890 in April 2011 to 40,018 in April 2012.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since April 2011 include Passaic (12.6%), Warren (6.8%), and Ocean (5.6%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased since April 2011 were Salem (-9.5%), Cumberland (-12.1%), and Monmouth (-13.8%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 8,891 or 22.2% were child-only in April 2012.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,420), Hudson (1,124), and Camden (1,138).
- Essex (20,921), Passaic (12,501), and Hudson (11,557) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in April 2012.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In April 2012, there were 400,973 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 31,427, or 8.5%, since April 2011.
- There were 805,089 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of April 2012, an increase of 54,164 or 7.2% since April 2011.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since April 2011 are Middlesex (14.3%), Camden (13.3%), and Passaic (11.9%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 6,744 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in April 2012, a decrease of 127 or 1.8% since April 2011.
- In April 2012, EA payments were made for 1,322 SSI recipients.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 7,089 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in April 2012, a decrease of 1,290 or 15.4% since April 2011.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Mercer (30.4%), Middlesex (5.8%), and Passaic (0.7%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 56,781 to 44,529 since April 2011, a decrease of 21.6%.
- There were 31,404 Employable GA and 13,125 Unemployable GA cases in April 2012.
- In April 2012, GA cases showed a 0.7 percent decrease since March 2012.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$332 million from January 2012 to March 2012, an increase of 3.5 percent over the same period for FFY 2011.
- Total distributions increased over 4.2% from March 2011.


WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of April 2012, there were 4,133 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 593 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (936), Camden (481), and Hudson (463).





Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period Ending With APRIL 2012




Total NJ SNAP Recipients APRIL 2012 By County






ACRONYMS

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, WFNJ/TANF for families with children, and WFNJ/GA (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
