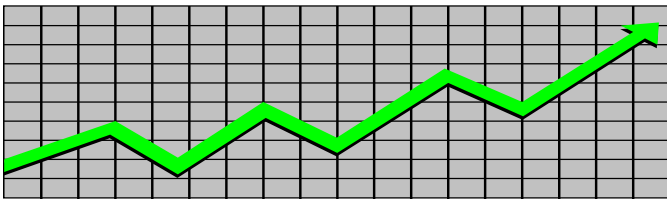

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## **DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS**

### **APRIL 2013**

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

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#### **WFNJ/TANF**

- As of the end of April, the TANF caseload had decreased by 1,985 cases, from 40,018 in April 2012 to 38,033 in April 2013, a decrease of 5.0%.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since April 2012 include Warren (4.1%), Salem (4.1%), and Somerset (3.5%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased since April 2012 were Morris (-17.2%), Sussex (-20.6%), and Hunterdon (-27.4%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 8,262 or 21.7% were child-only in April 2013.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,276), Camden (1,116), and Hudson (1,002).
- Essex (19,805), Passaic (12,362), and Hudson (11,222) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in April 2013.

#### **NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In April 2013, there were 426,646 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 25,673, or 6.4%, since April 2012.
- There were 859,353 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of April 2013, an increase of 54,264 or 6.7% since April 2012.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since April 2012 are Ocean (17.0%), Monmouth (12.7%), and Salem (10.4%).

#### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 6,692 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in April 2013, a decrease of 52 or 0.8% since April 2012.
- In April 2013, EA payments were made for 1,648 SSI recipients.

**GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

**GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 6,422 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in April 2013, a decrease of 667 or 9.4% since April 2012.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Essex (39.2%), Salem (28.1), and Middlesex (8.2%).

**GA Program**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 44,529 to 39,713 since April 2012, a decrease of 10.8%.
- There were 26,583 Employable GA and 13,130 Unemployable GA cases in April 2013.
- Salem (22.2%), Middlesex (12.4%), and Warren (4.7%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA cases since April 2012.
- In April 2013, GA cases showed a 0.5 percent decrease since March 2013.

**CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)**

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$325 million from January 2013 to March 2013, a decrease of 2.2 percent over the same period for FFY 2012.
- Total distributions decreased 3.4% from March 2012.

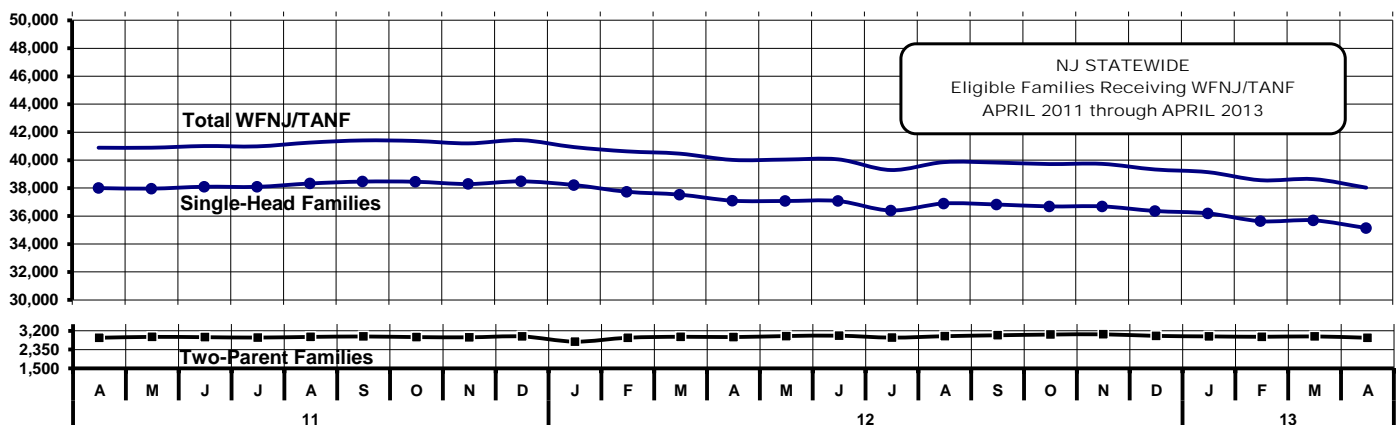
**WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of April 2013, there were 3,952 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 617 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (866), Camden (460), and Hudson (450).
- There were 3,720 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

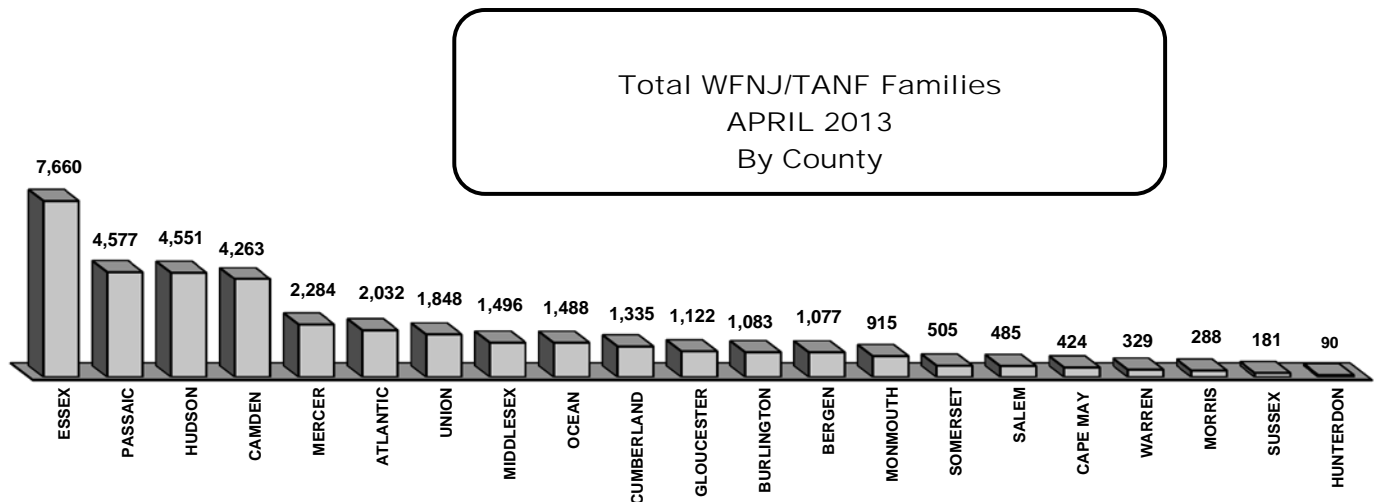

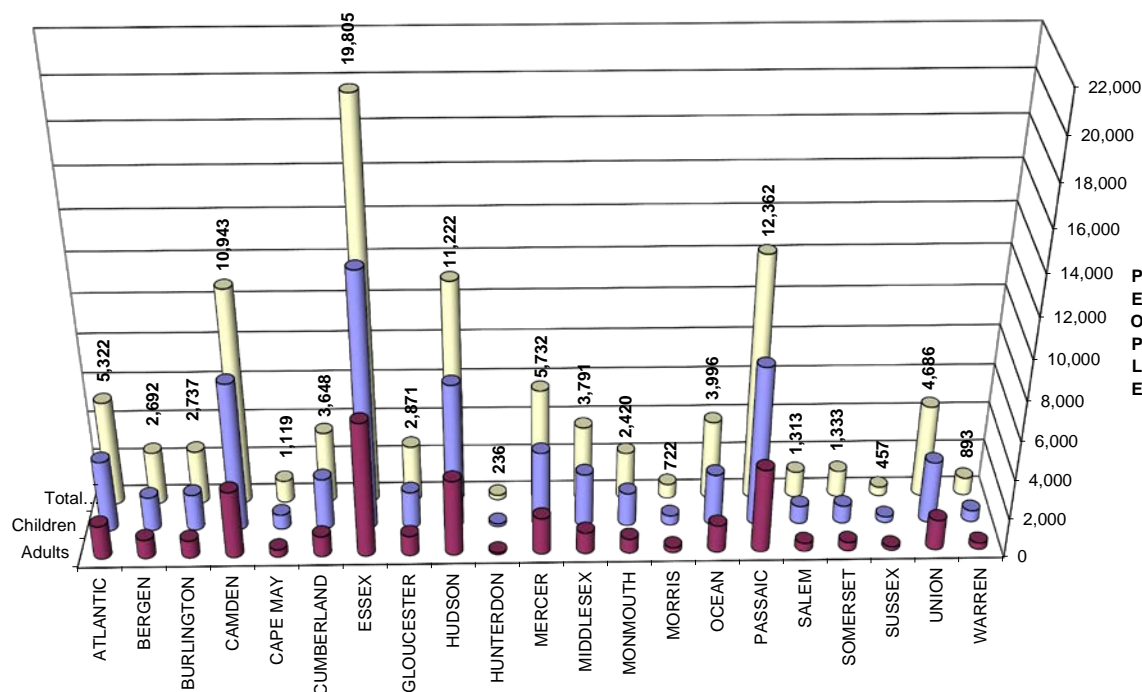

Ending With APRIL 2013**

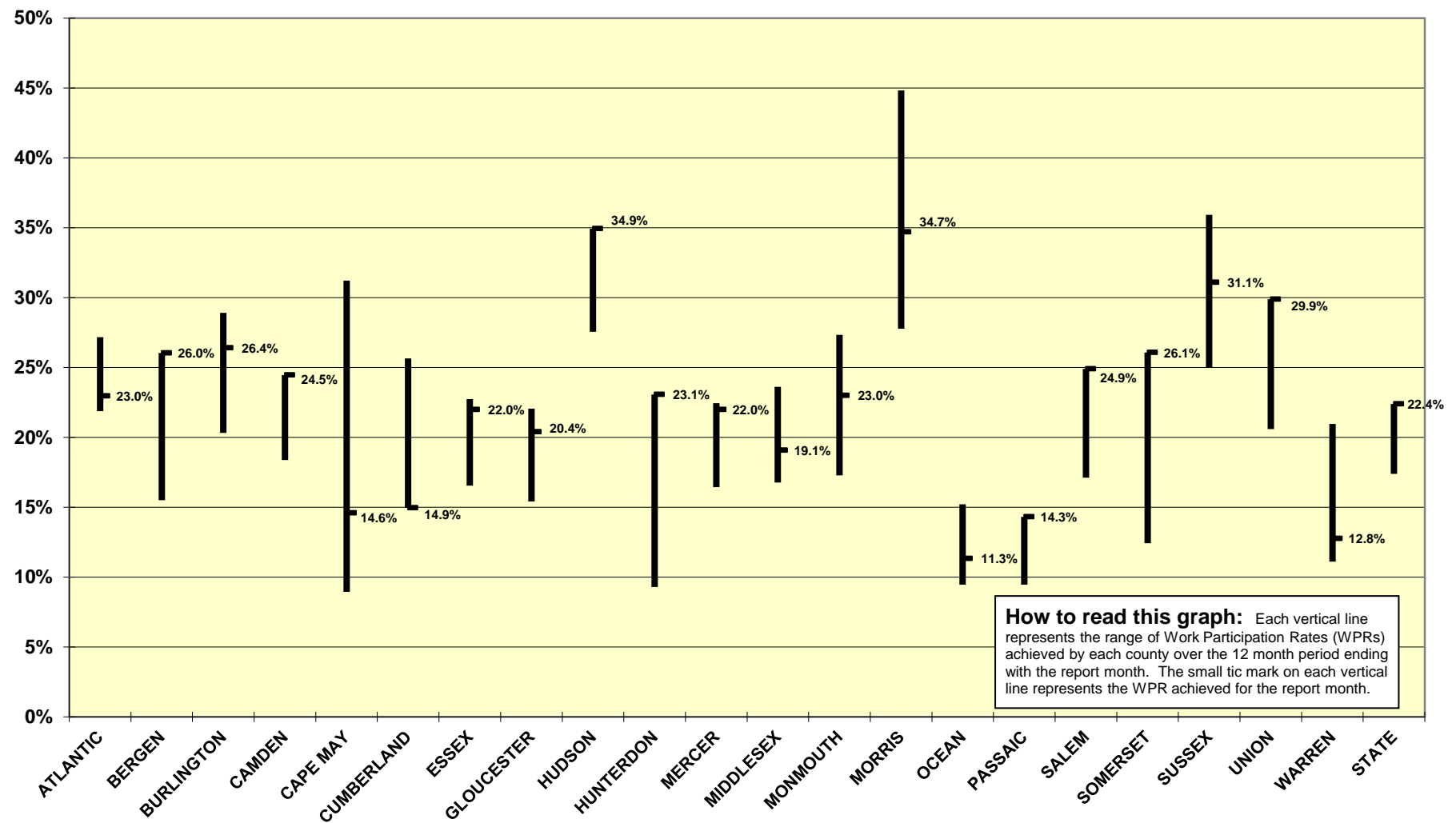
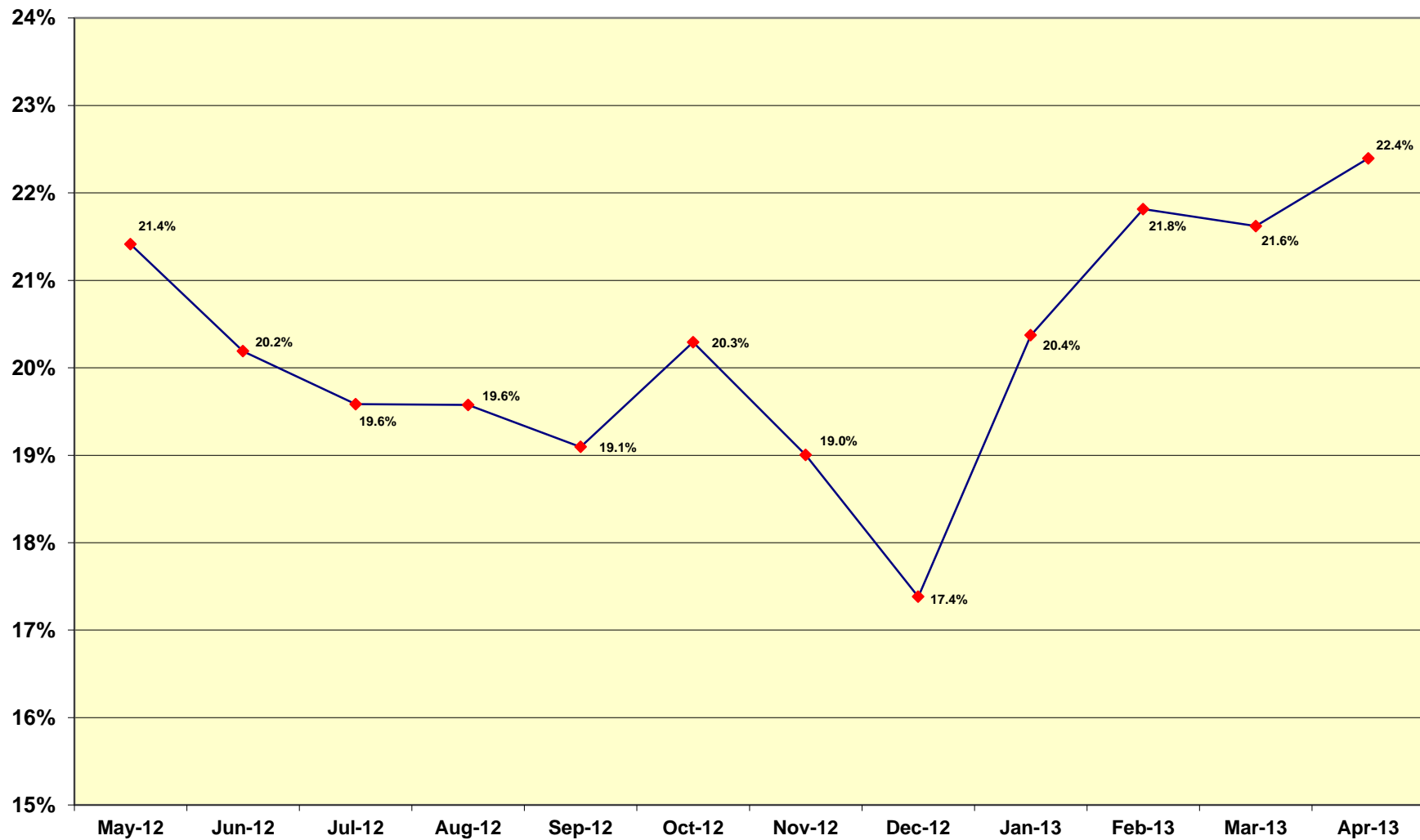

## **ACRONYMS**

**CASS:** Consolidated Assistance and Support System

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS:** Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS:** General Assistance Automated System

**NJKiDS:** New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE:** The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA:** Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ:** Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
