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DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS APRIL 2016

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of April, the TANF caseload had decreased by 6,913 cases, from 29,518 in April 2015 to 22,605 in April 2016, a decrease of 23.4%.
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since April 2015 were Ocean (-32.6%), Sussex (-35.3%) and Monmouth (-35.9%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 6,357 or 28.1% were child-only in April 2016.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (922), Camden (860) and Hudson (678).
- Essex (10,699), Passaic (7,252), Hudson (6,309), Camden (6,279) and Atlantic (4,047) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in April 2016.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In April 2016, there were 437,569 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 10,093 or 2.3%, since April 2015.
- There were 869,562 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of April 2016, a decrease of 20,277 or 2.3% since April 2015.
- The two counties having the highest caseload increase since April 2015 are Middlesex (2.6%) and Bergen (2.2%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 3,101 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in April 2016, a decrease of 2,651 or 46.1% since April 2015.
- In April 2016, EA payments were made for 643 SSI recipients.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 3,239 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in April 2016, a decrease of 1,893 or 36.9% since April 2015.
- The county that showed a percent increase in emergency assistance payments was Ocean (21.0%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 26,607 to 19,597 since April 2015, a decrease of 26.3%.
- There were 9,977 Employable GA and 9,620 Unemployable GA cases in April 2016.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since April 2015 were Cape May (39.0%), Monmouth (39.7%) and Somerset (46.7%).
- In April 2016, GA cases showed a 2.2 percent decrease since March 2016.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$336 million from January 2016 to March 2016, an increase of 1.4 percent over the same period for FFY 2015.
- Total distributions increased 0.7% from March 2015.


WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of April 2016, there were 2,407 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 429 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (600), Passaic (283) and Camden (280).
- There were 3,346 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period Ending With APRIL 2016






ACRONYMS

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, WFNJ/TANF for families with children, and WFNJ/GA (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
