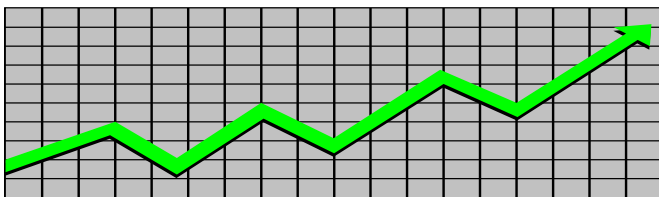

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

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**WFNJ/TANF**

- As of the end of April, the TANF caseload had decreased by 3,158 cases, from 16,946 in April 2017 to 13,788 in April 2018, a decrease of 18.6%.
- The counties where the family caseload percentage increased since April 2017 were Hunterdon (25.0%) and Morris (2.4%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since April 2017 were Passaic (-24.9%), Sussex (-27.4%) and Bergen (-30.2%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 4,610 or 33.4% were child-only in April 2018.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (705), Camden (697), Hudson (474) and Passaic (474).
- Essex (6,066), Camden (4,529), Passaic (4,109), Hudson (3,936) and Atlantic (2,680) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in April 2018.

**NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In April 2018, there were 373,172 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 28,124 or 7.0%, since April 2017.
- There were 743,476 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of April 2018, a decrease of 58,002 or 7.2% since April 2017.
- The counties having the highest caseload decrease since April 2017 are Sussex (-10.5%), Burlington (-12.0%) and Ocean (-12.0%).

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 1,795 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in April 2018, a decrease of 283 or 13.6% since April 2017.
- In April 2018, EA payments were made for 417 SSI recipients.

**DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS  
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- There were 2,216 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in April 2018, a decrease of 195 or 8.1% since April 2017.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Ocean (9.6%), Mercer (27.3%) and Salem (70.0%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Hudson (-18.8%), Passaic (-25.0%) and Cumberland (-75.0%).

**GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 14,756 to 12,396 since April 2017, a decrease of 16.0%.
- There were 5,217 Employable GA and 7,179 Unemployable GA cases in April 2018.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases were Monmouth (4.3%), Cape May (6.3%) and Hunterdon (17.9%) since April 2017.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since April 2017 were Union (-25.4%), Sussex (-26.3%) and Gloucester (-26.5%).
- In April 2018, GA cases showed 0.6% change since March 2018.

**CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)**

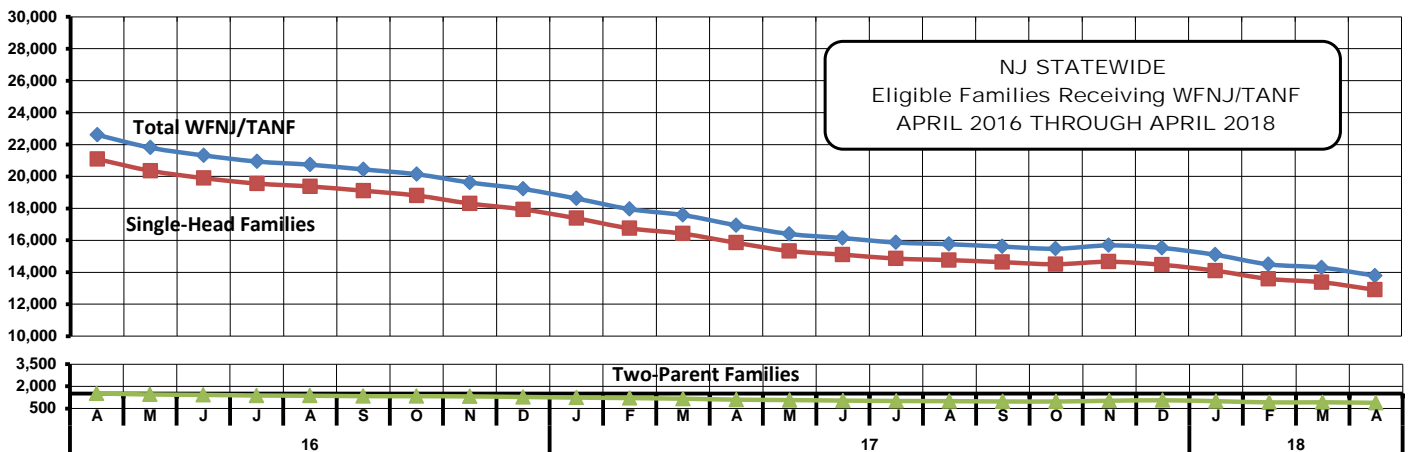
- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$315 million from January 2018 to March 2018, a decrease of 5.3 percent over the same period for FFY 2017.
- Total distributions decreased 6.5% from March 2017.

**WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of April 2018, there were 1,267 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 238 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (286), Camden (205) and Hudson (127).
- There were 2,790 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

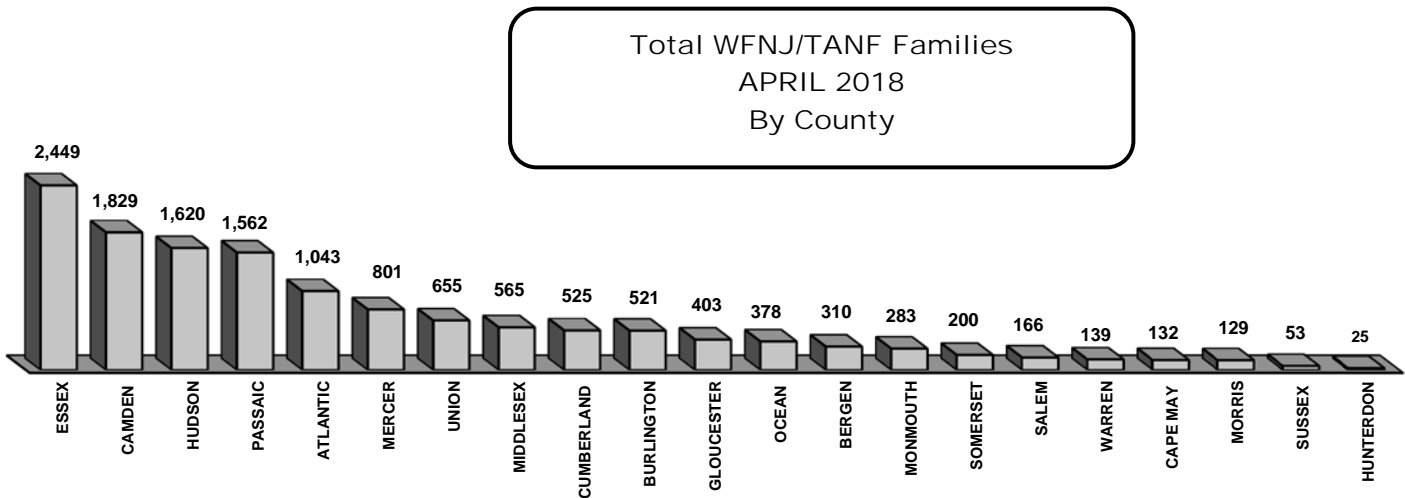

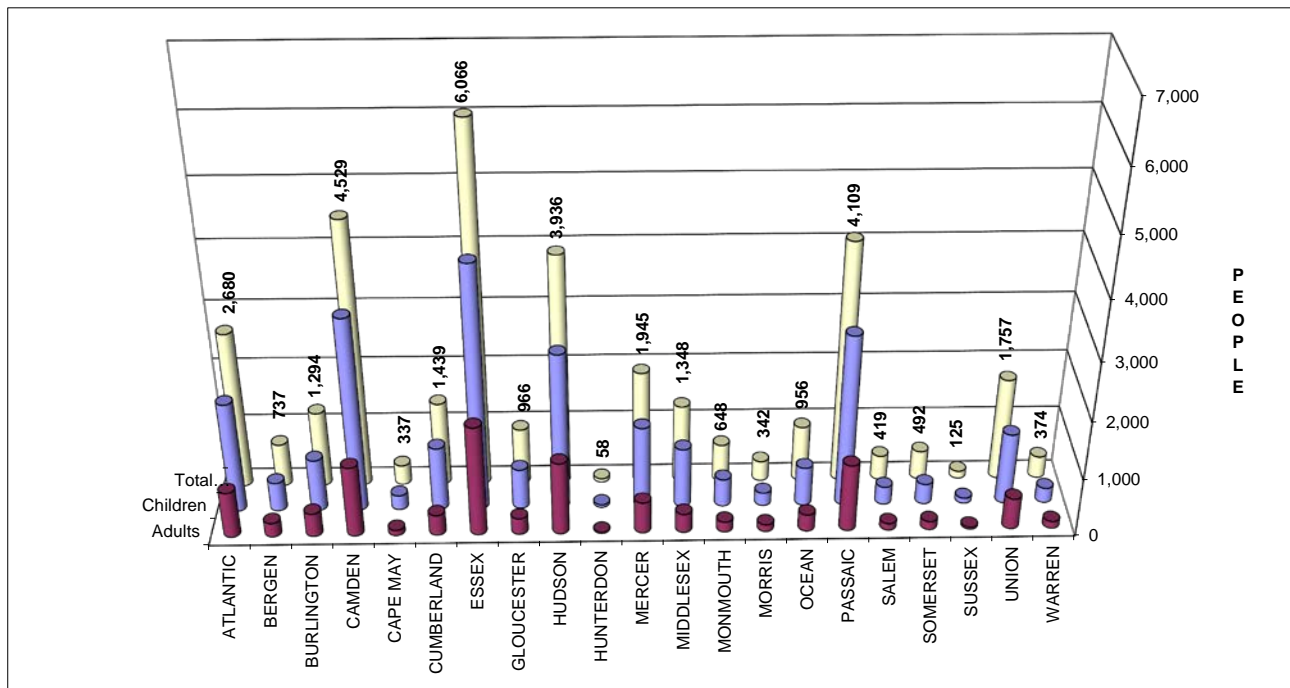

Ending With APRIL 2018

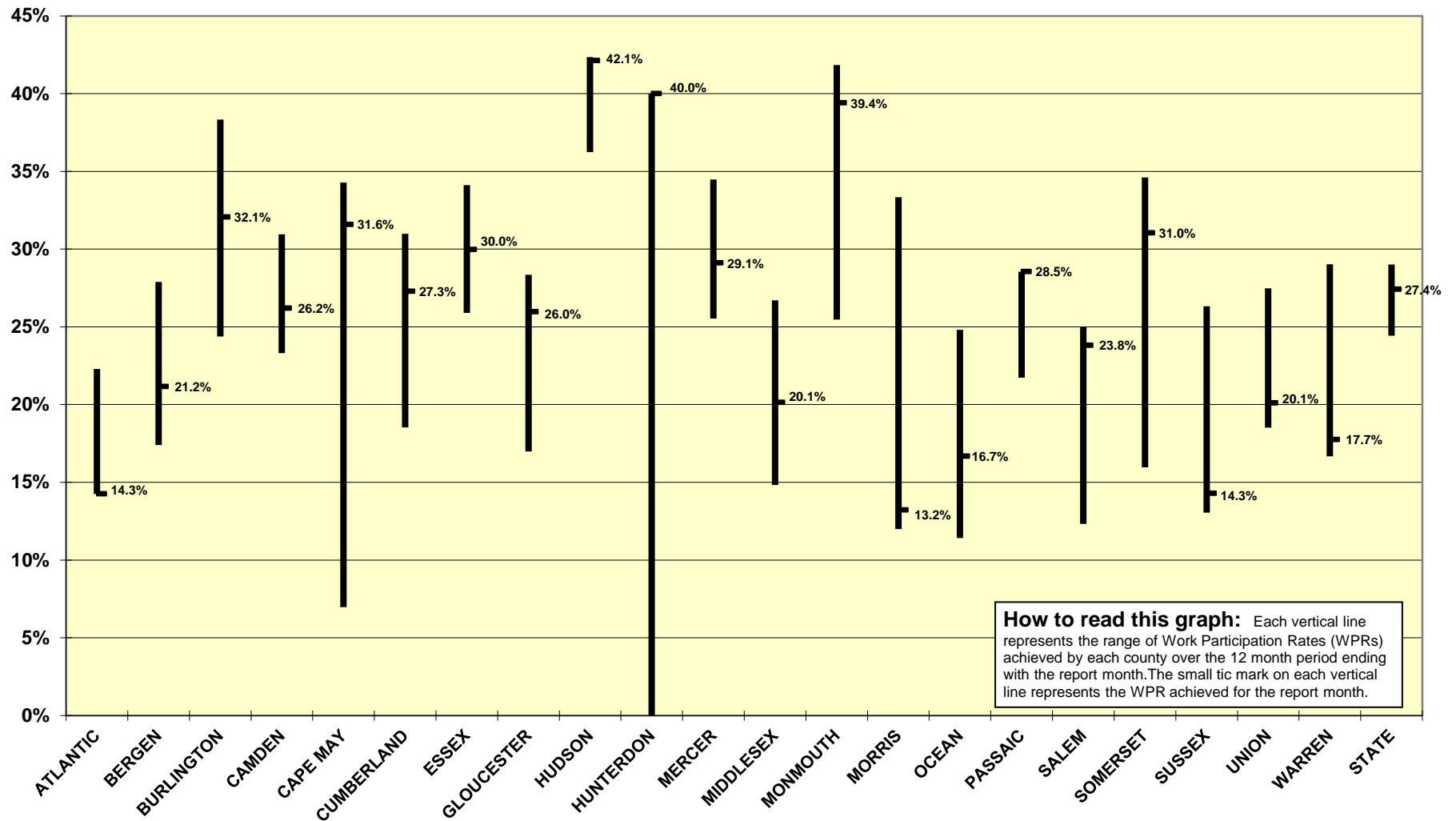
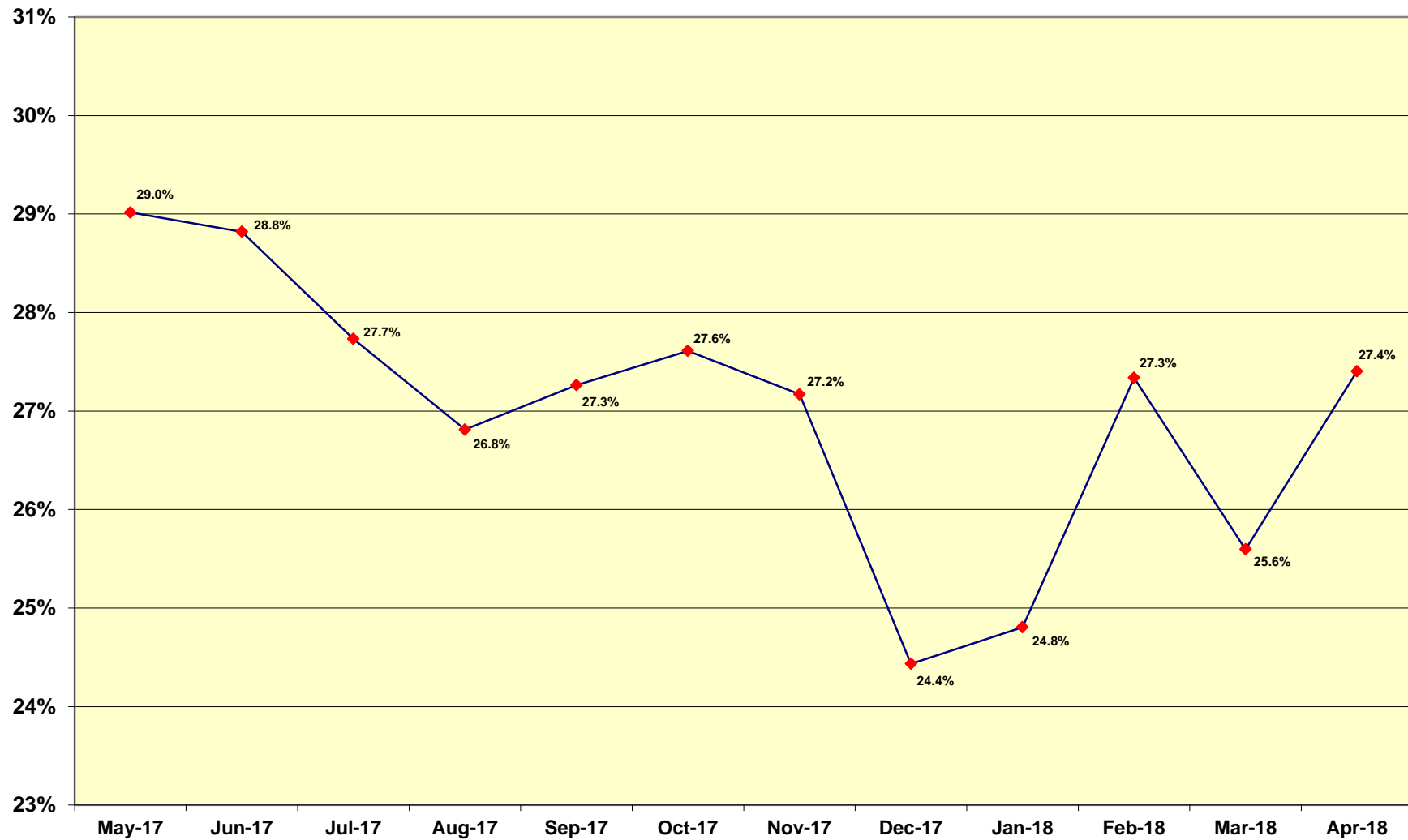

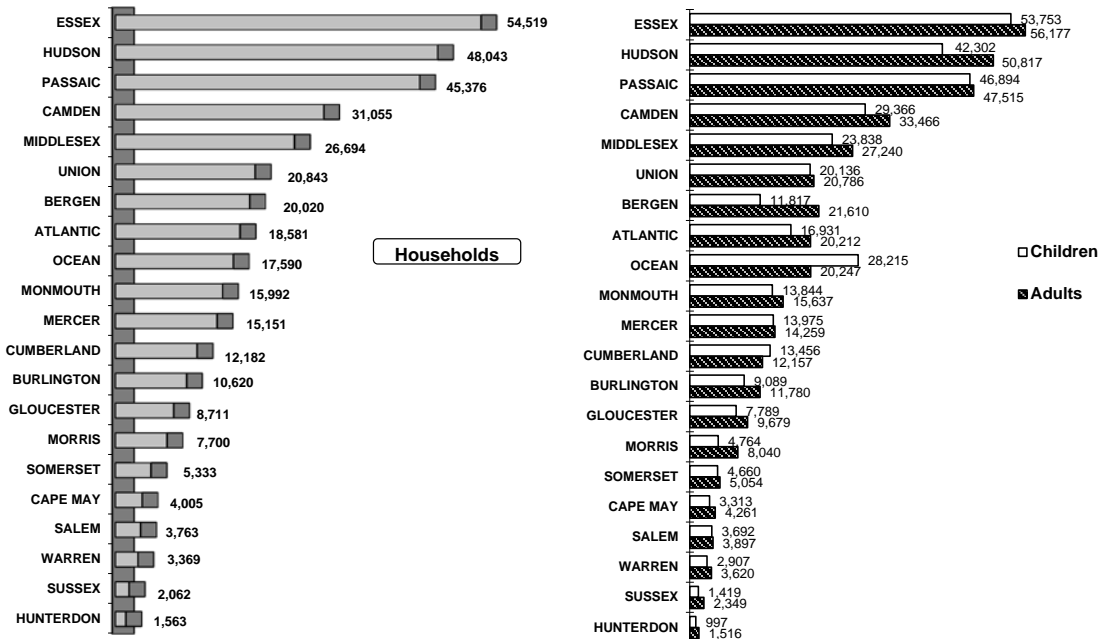

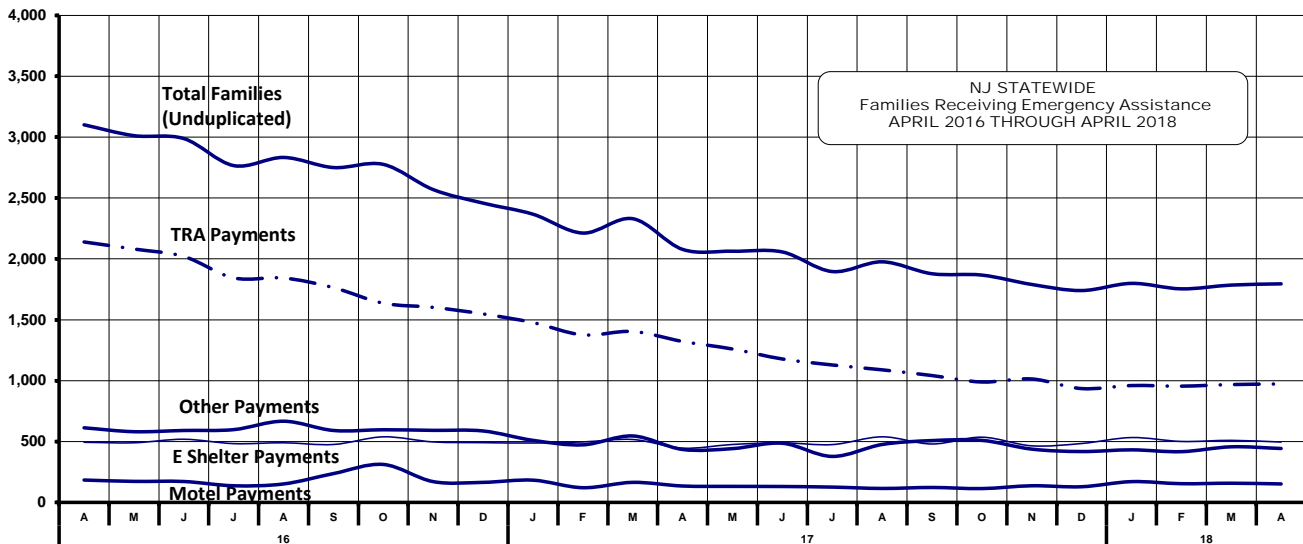

## **ACRONYMS**

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS:** Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS:** General Assistance Automated System

**NJKIDS:** New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE:** The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA:** Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ:** Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
