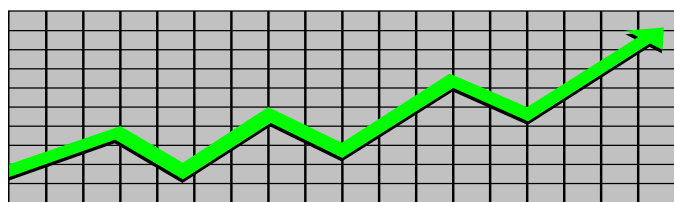

DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS
AUGUST 2014

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of August, the TANF caseload had decreased by 2,759 cases, from 36,365 in August 2013 to 33,606 in August 2014, a decrease of 7.6%.
- The counties where the family caseload percentage increased since August 2013 were Burlington (10.4%), Atlantic (7.1%), Cumberland (5.6%), and Middlesex (5.6%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since August 2013 were Ocean (-12.1%), Monmouth (-24.0%), and Passaic (-24.1%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 7,674 or 22.8% were child-only in August 2014.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,139), Camden (1,019), and Hudson (911).
- Essex (17,963), Hudson (9,924), Camden (8,915), Passaic (8,794), and Atlantic (5,600) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in August 2014.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In August 2014, there were 452,217 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 18,306, or 4.2%, since August 2013.
- There were 901,952 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of August 2014, an increase of 27,233 or 3.1% since August 2013.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since August 2013 are Union (12.5%), Monmouth (11.2%), and Burlington (9.8%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 6,368 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in August 2014, a decrease of 385 or 5.7% since August 2013.
- In August 2014, EA payments were made for 1,727 SSI recipients.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 5,318 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in August 2014, a decrease of 799 or 13.1% since August 2013.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Cumberland (71.9%), Burlington (55.2%), and Atlantic (22.4%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 36,461 to 30,738 since August 2013, a decrease of 15.7%.
- There were 18,721 Employable GA and 12,017 Unemployable GA cases in August 2014.
- Warren (18.6%), Bergen (12.8%) and Burlington (9.4%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA cases since August 2013.
- In August 2014, GA cases showed a 2.2 percent decrease since July 2014.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

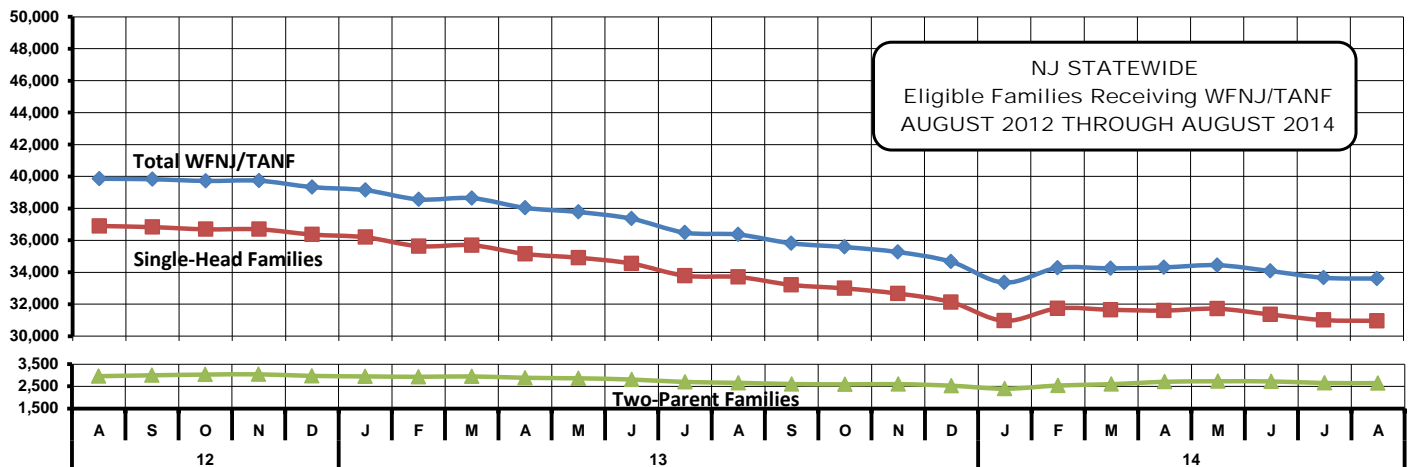
- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$332 million from April 2014 to June 2014, an increase of 0.8 percent over the same period for FFY 2013.
- Total distributions increased 0.3% from June 2013.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of August 2014, there were 3,789 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 527 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (951), Hudson (434), and Camden (368).
- There were 3,108 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

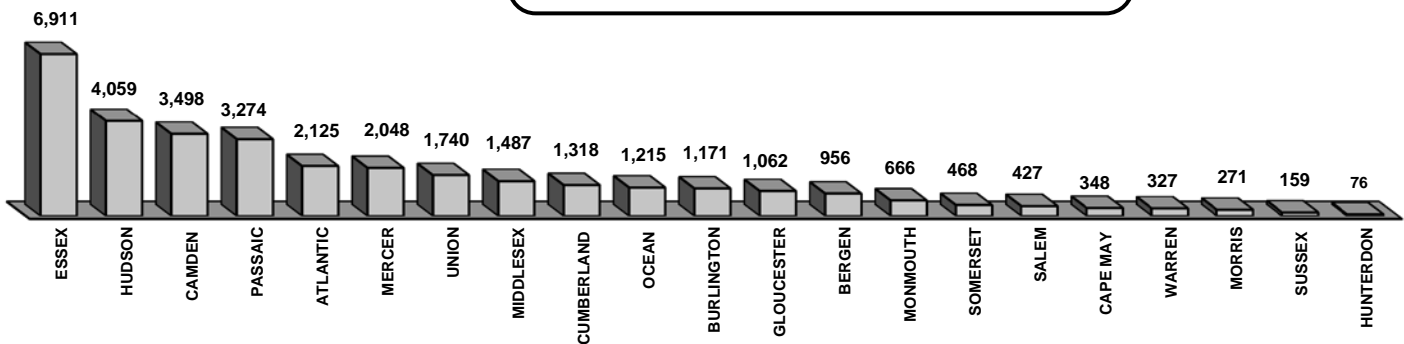

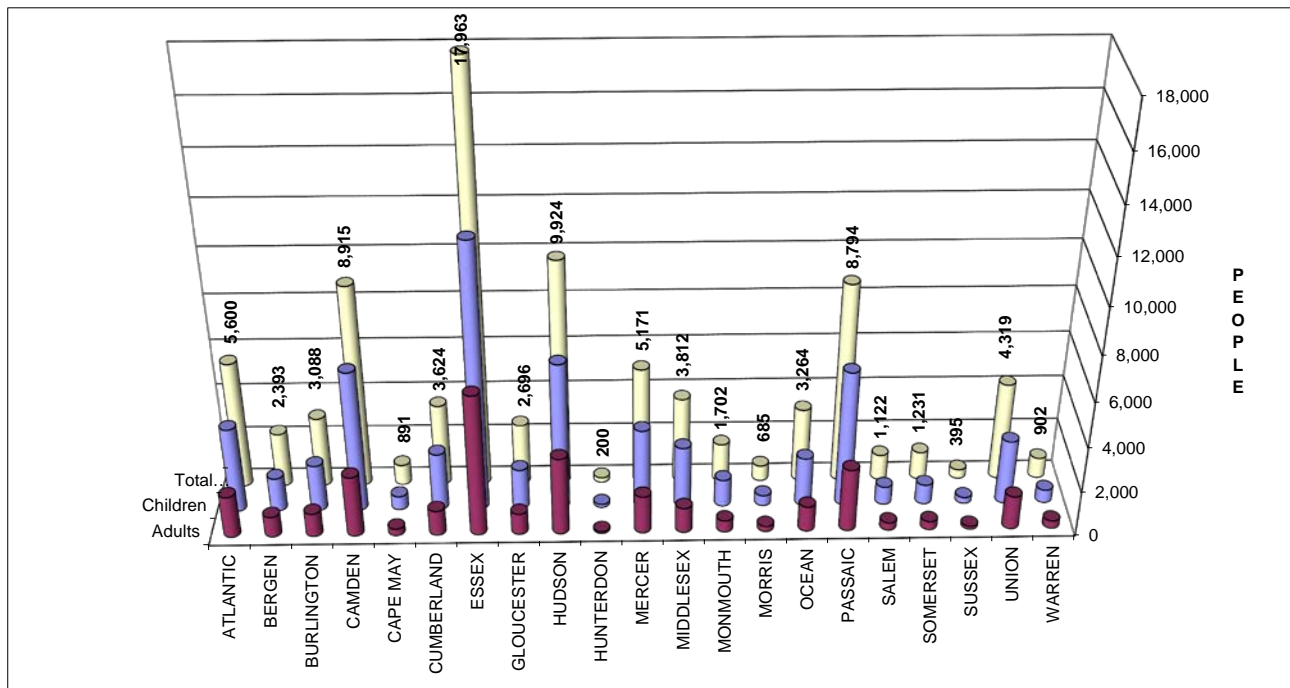

Ending With AUGUST 2014

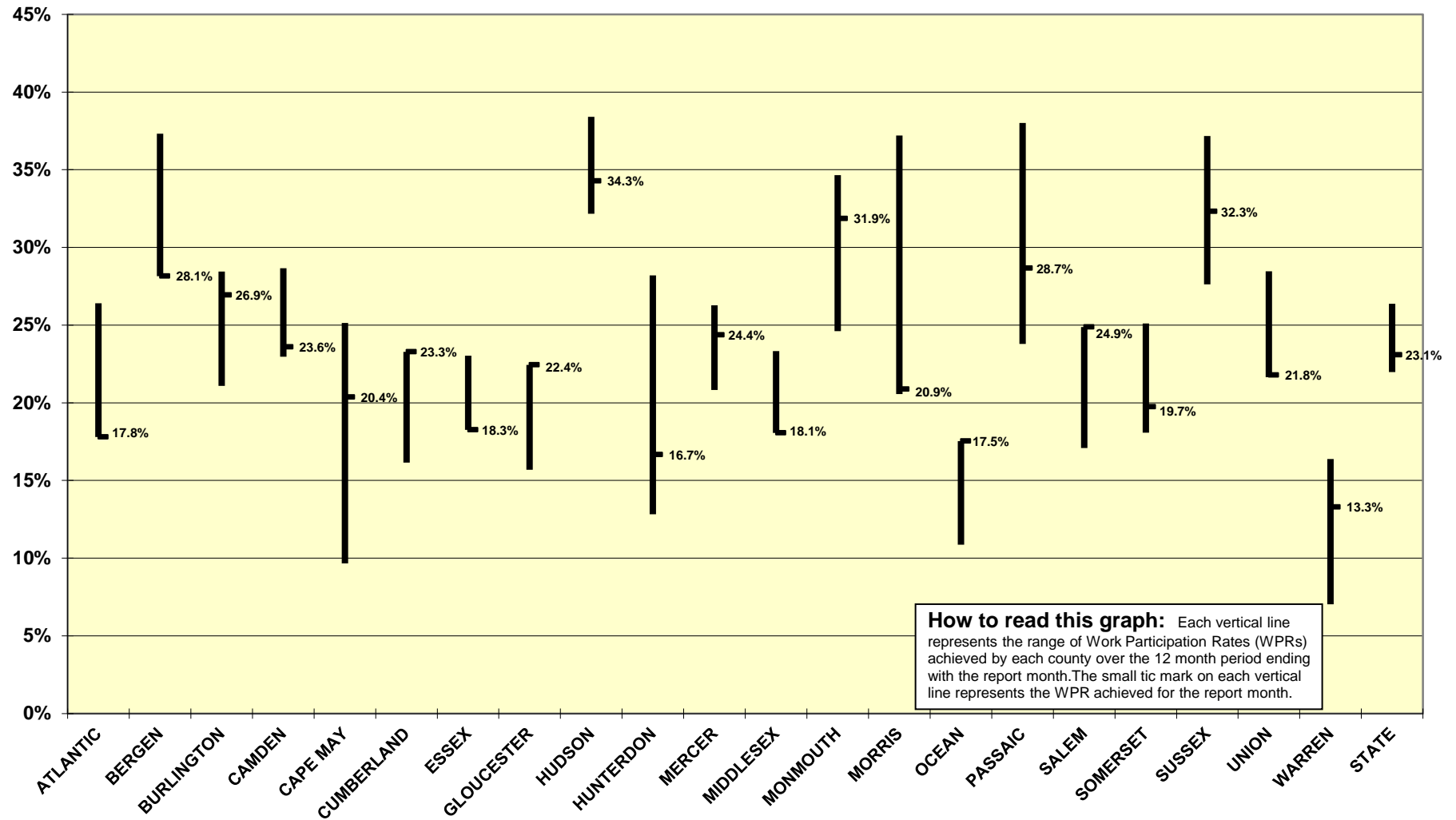
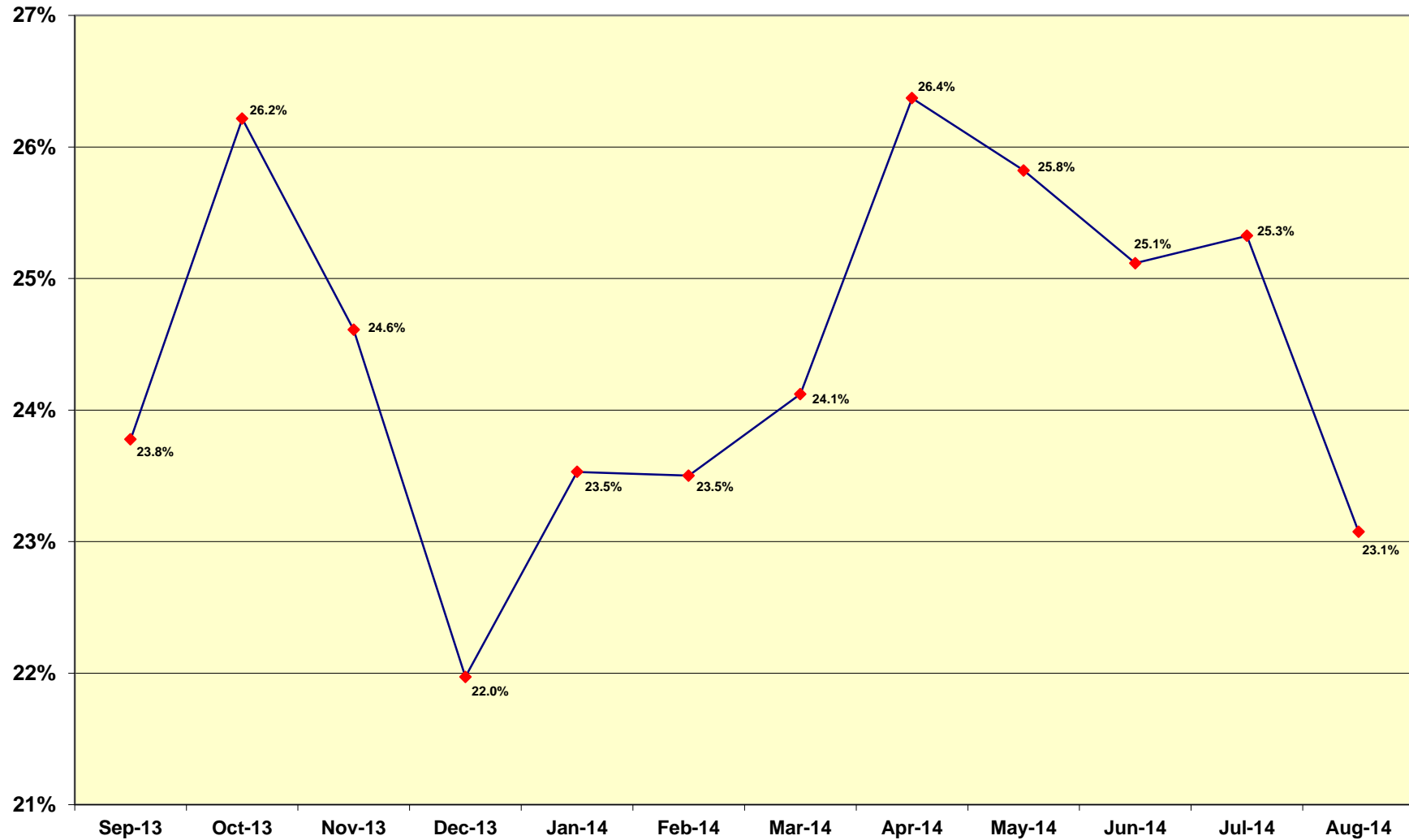

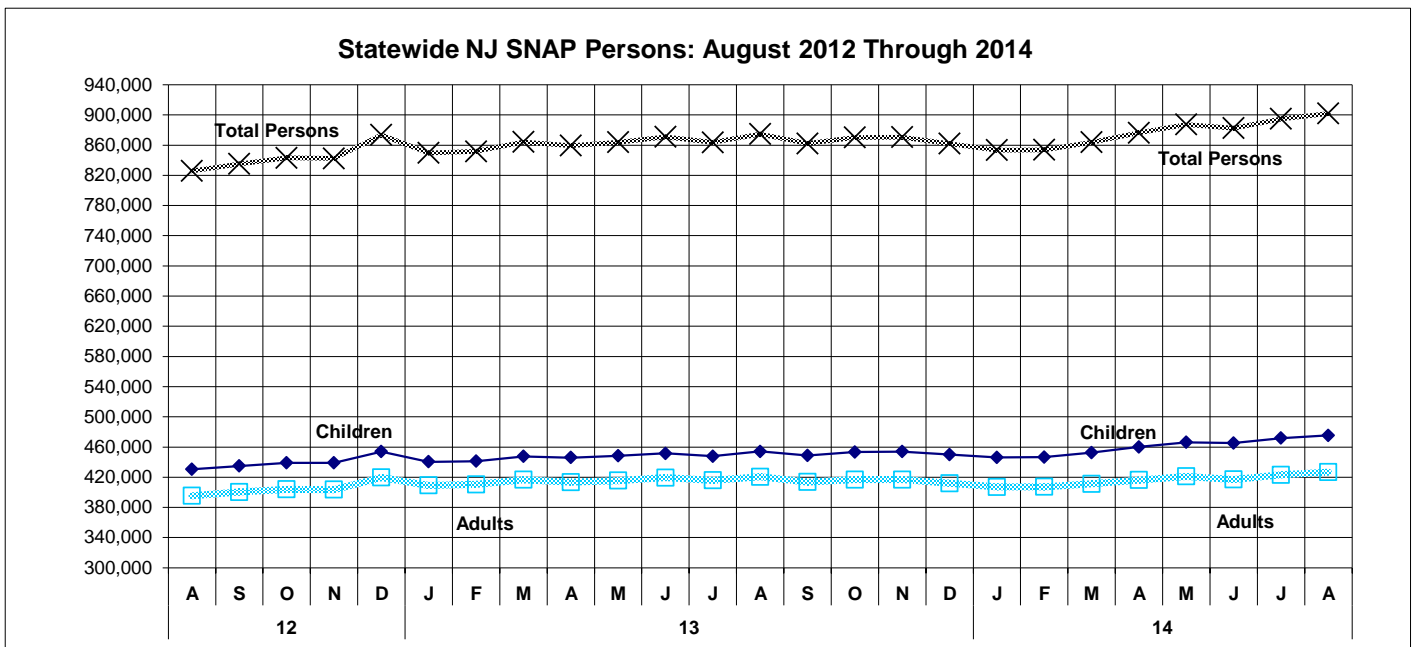

AUGUST 2012 THROUGH AUGUST 2014 (STATEWIDE)**



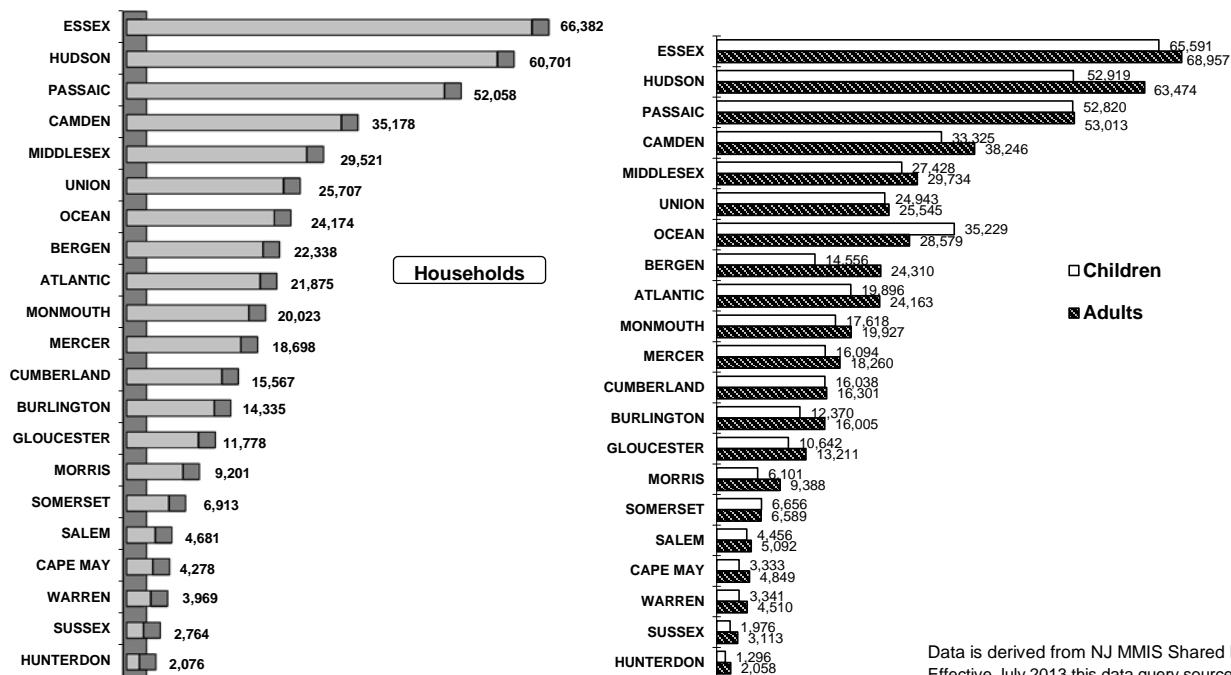

AUGUST 2014 By County

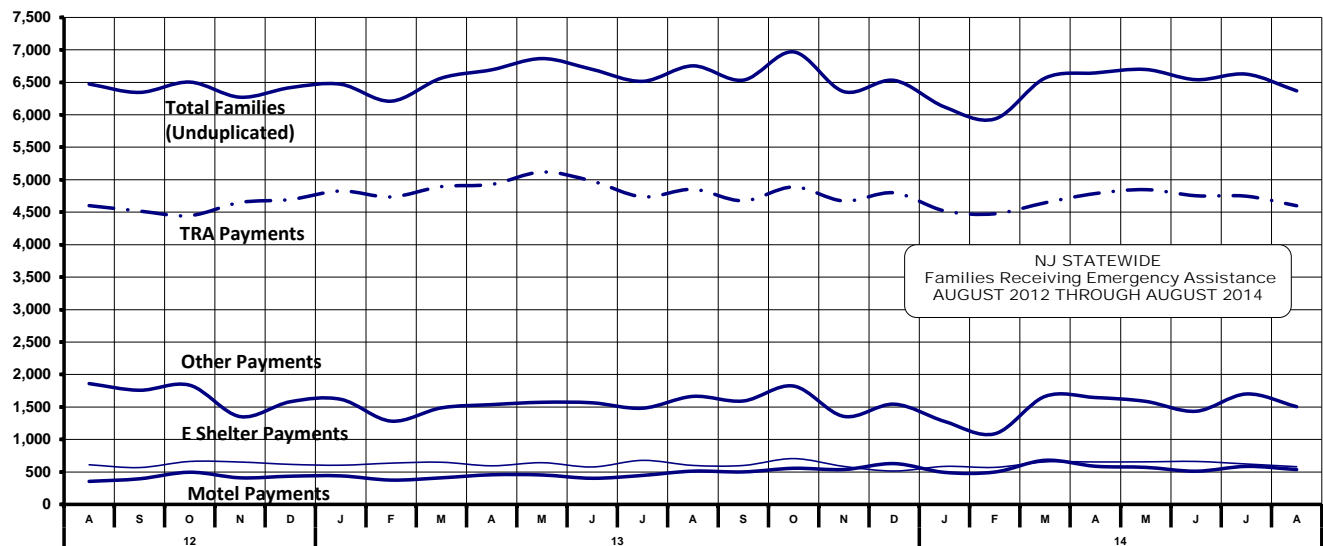

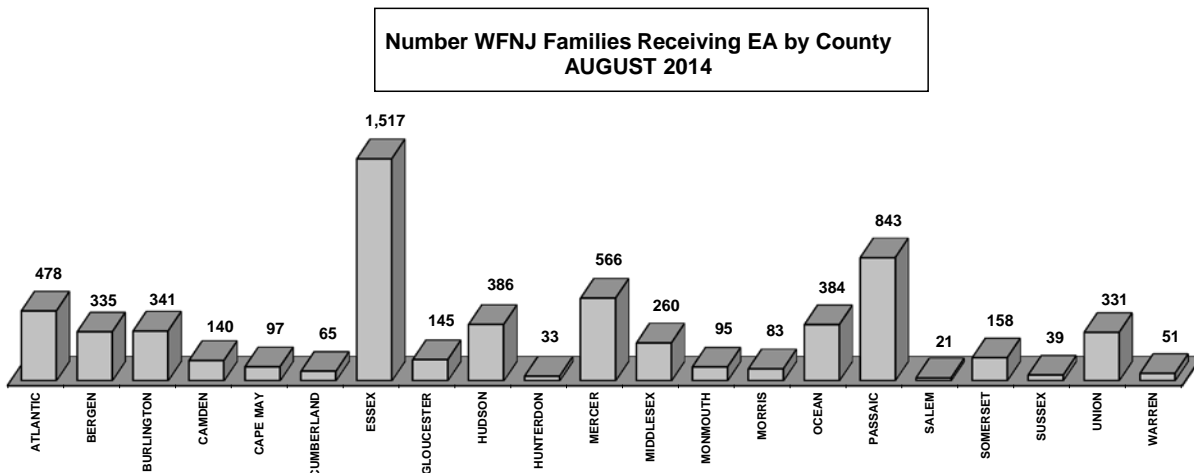
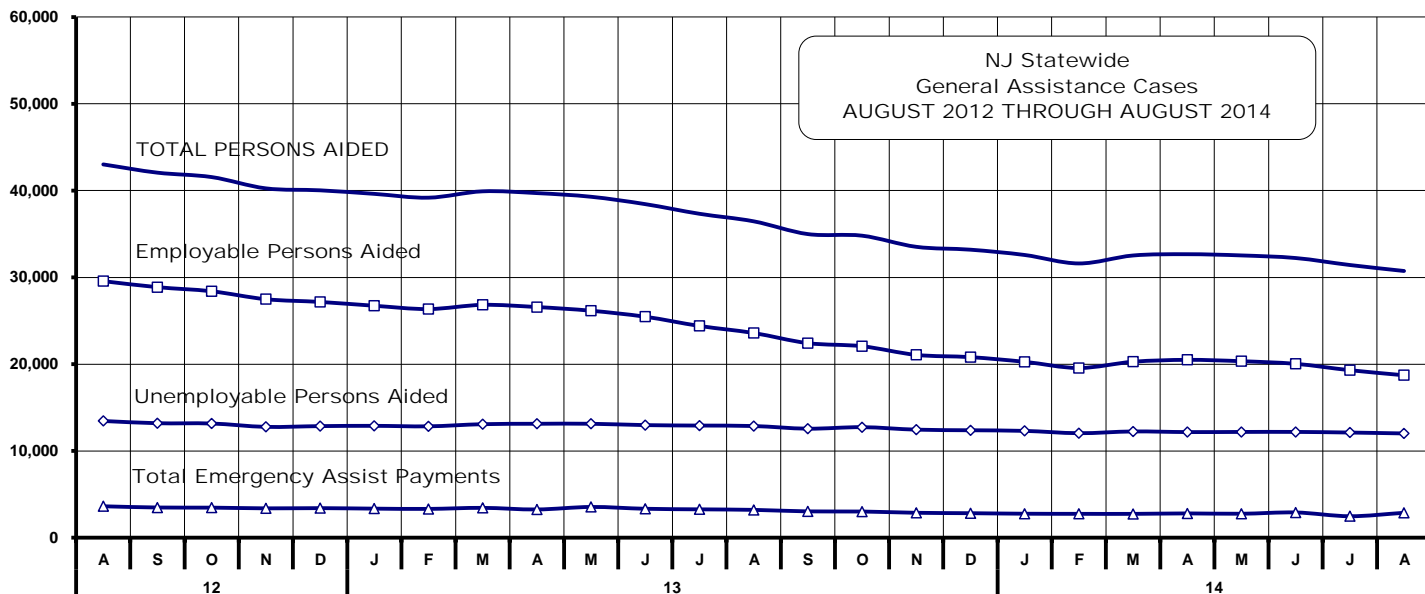

ACRONYMS

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
