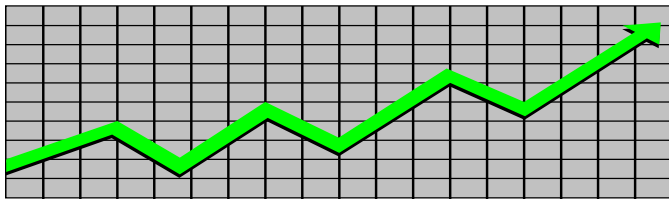

DECEMBER 2012**

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

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**WFNJ/TANF**

- As of the end of December, the TANF caseload had decreased by 2,094 cases, from 41,428 in December 2011 to 39,334 in December 2012, a decrease of 5.1%.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since December 2011 include Salem (5.5%), Ocean (4.1%), and Passaic (2.0%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased since December 2011 were Burlington (-18.9%), Morris (-20.4%), and Hunterdon (-24.2%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 8,312 or 21.1% were child-only in December 2012.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,327), Camden (1,113), and Hudson (1,025).
- Essex (21,220), Passaic (12,842), and Hudson (11,504) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in December 2012.

**NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In December 2012, there were 431,155 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 37,416, or 9.5%, since December 2011.
- There were 873,529 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of December 2012, an increase of 74,238 or 9.3% since December 2011.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since December 2011 are Monmouth (22.0%), Middlesex (19.8%), and Ocean (14.8%).

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 6,418 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in December 2012, a decrease of 1,044 or 14.0% since December 2011.
- In December 2012, EA payments were made for 1,508 SSI recipients.

**GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

**GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 6,190 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in December 2012, a decrease of 1,164 or 15.8% since December 2011.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Atlantic (15.9%), Morris (12.3), and Hudson (7.6%).

**GA Program**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 44,864 to 40,033 since December 2011, a decrease of 10.8%.
- There were 27,172 Employable GA and 12,861 Unemployable GA cases in December 2012.
- In December 2012, GA cases showed a 0.6 percent decrease since November 2012.

**CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)**

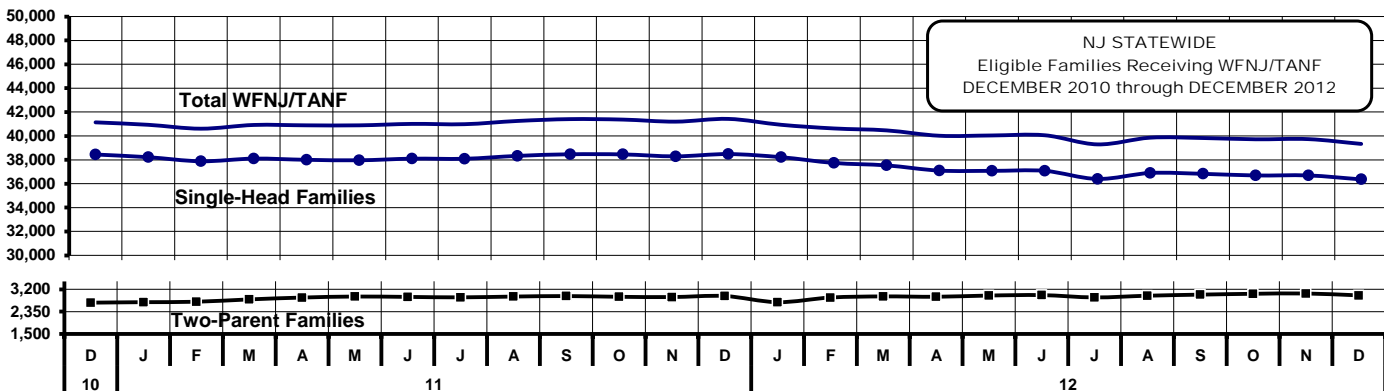
- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$316 million from October 2012 to December 2012, an increase of 2.7 percent over the same period for FFY 2012.
- Total distributions increased over 2.1% from December 2011.

**WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of December 2012, there were 4,202 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 491 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (940), Hudson (533), and Camden (513).
- There were 3,750 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

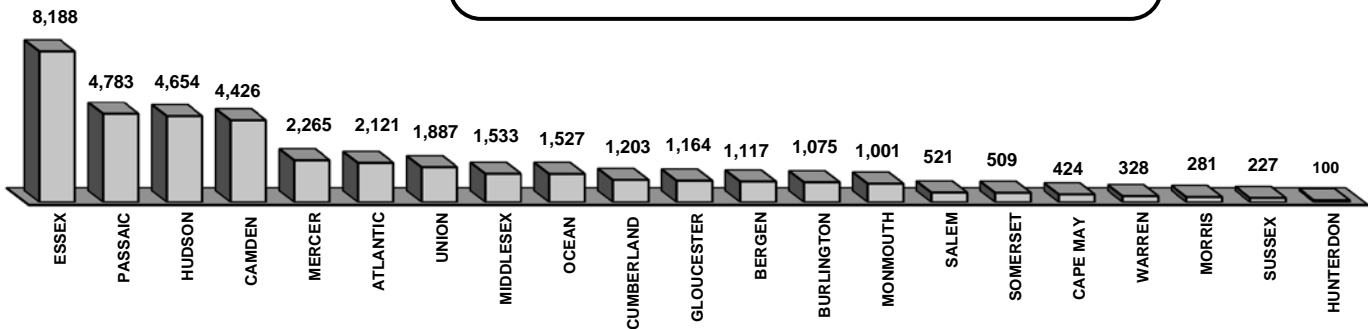

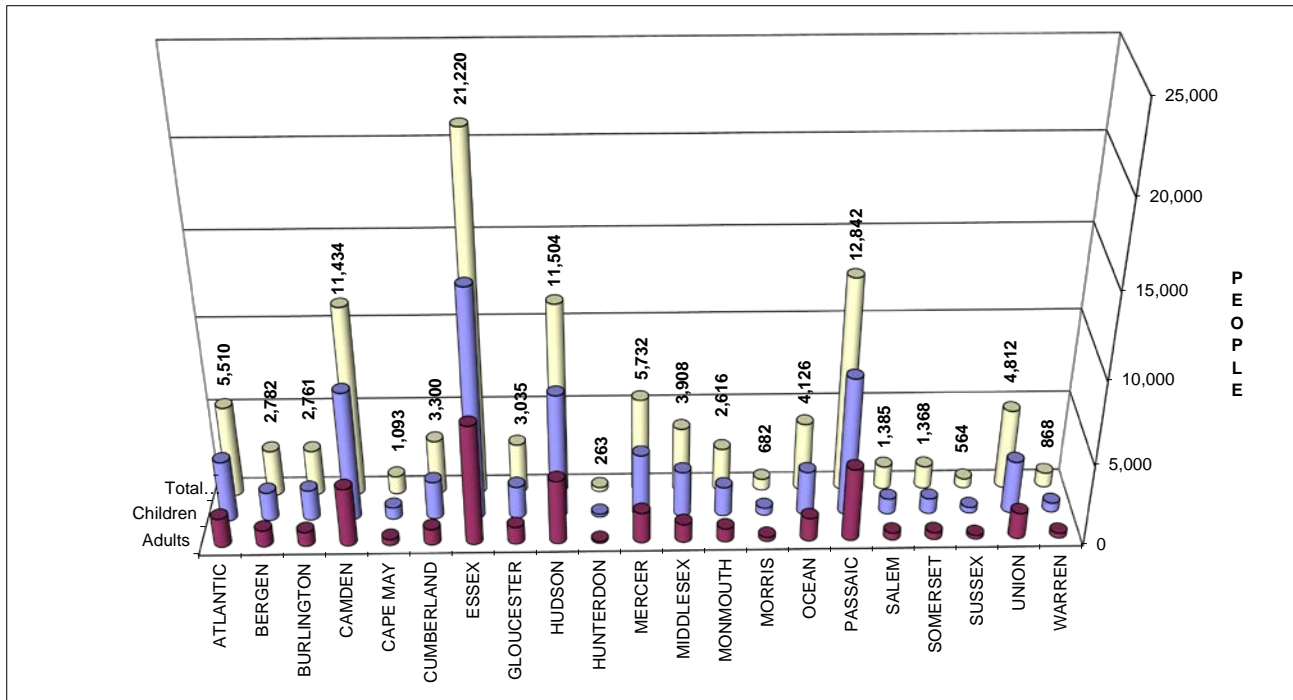

Ending With DECEMBER 2012

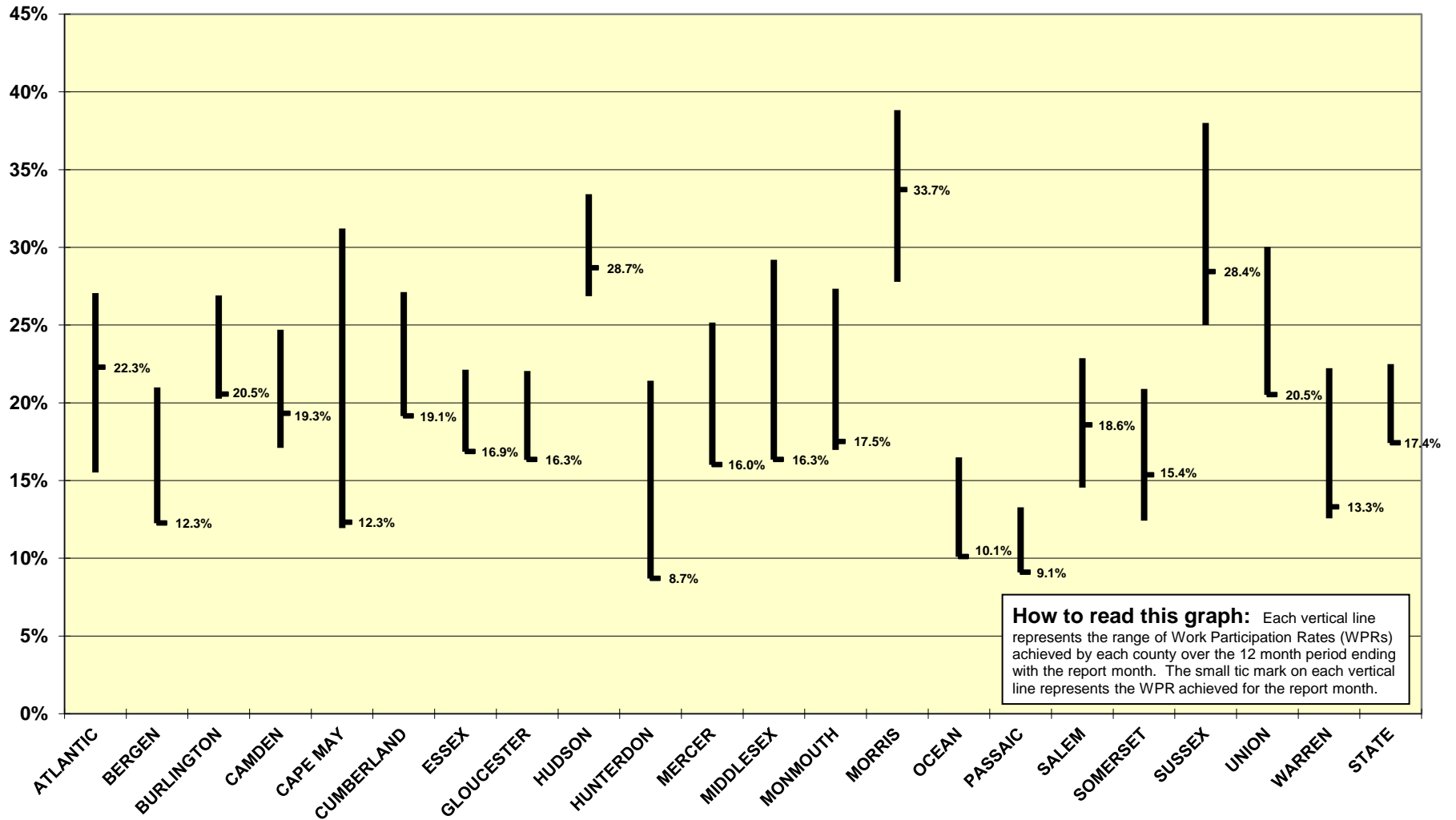
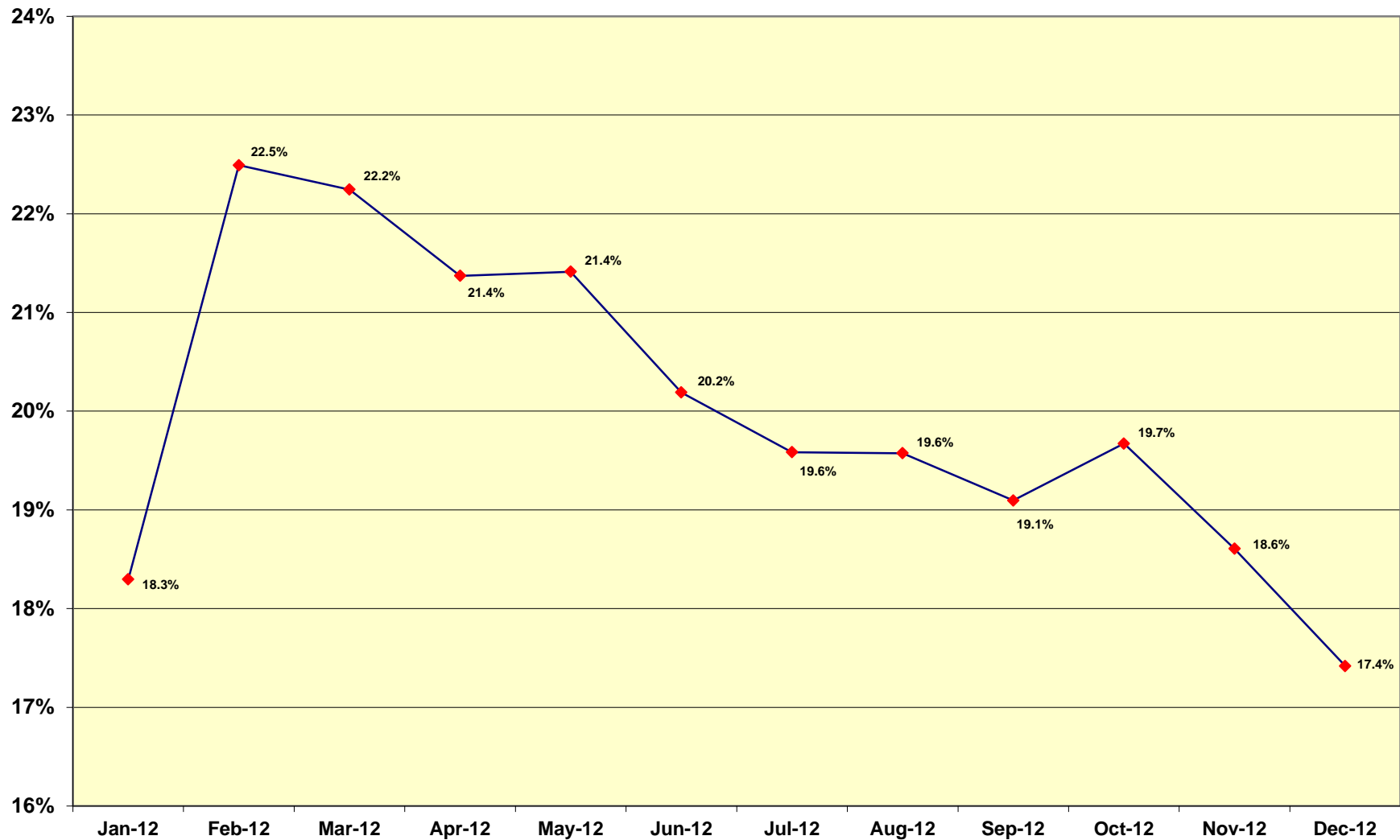

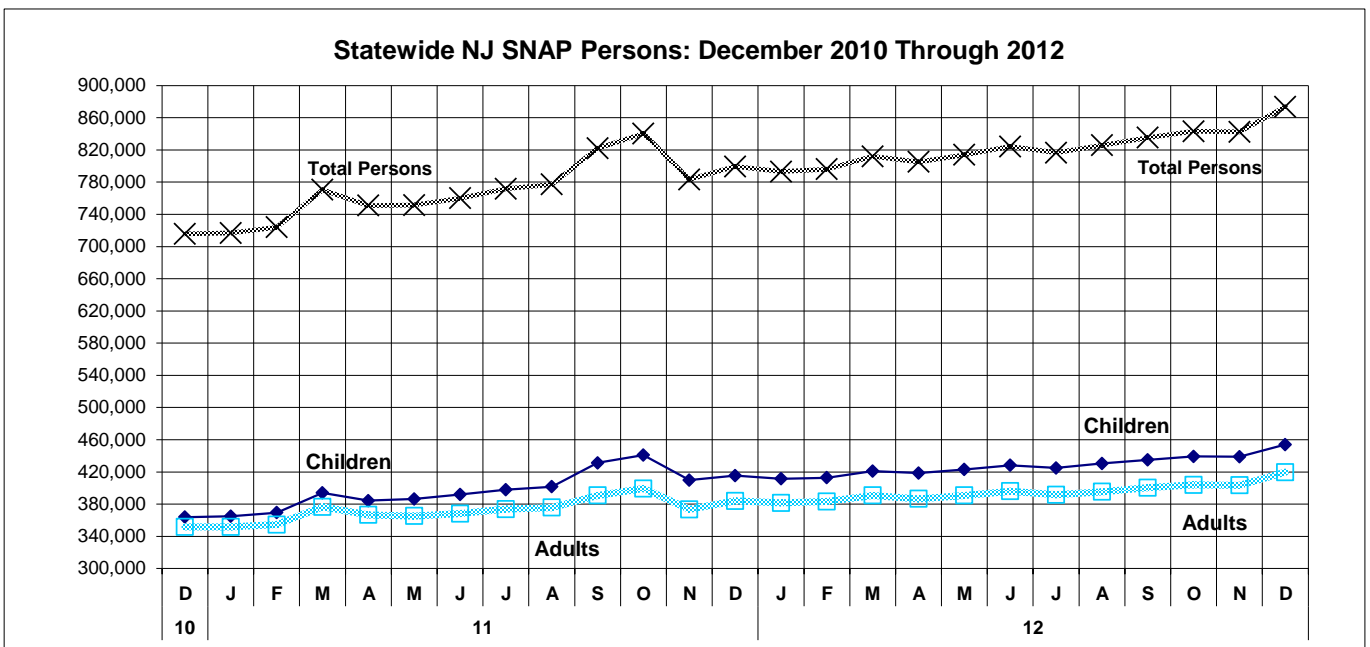

DECEMBER 2010 THROUGH DECEMBER 2012 (STATEWIDE)**



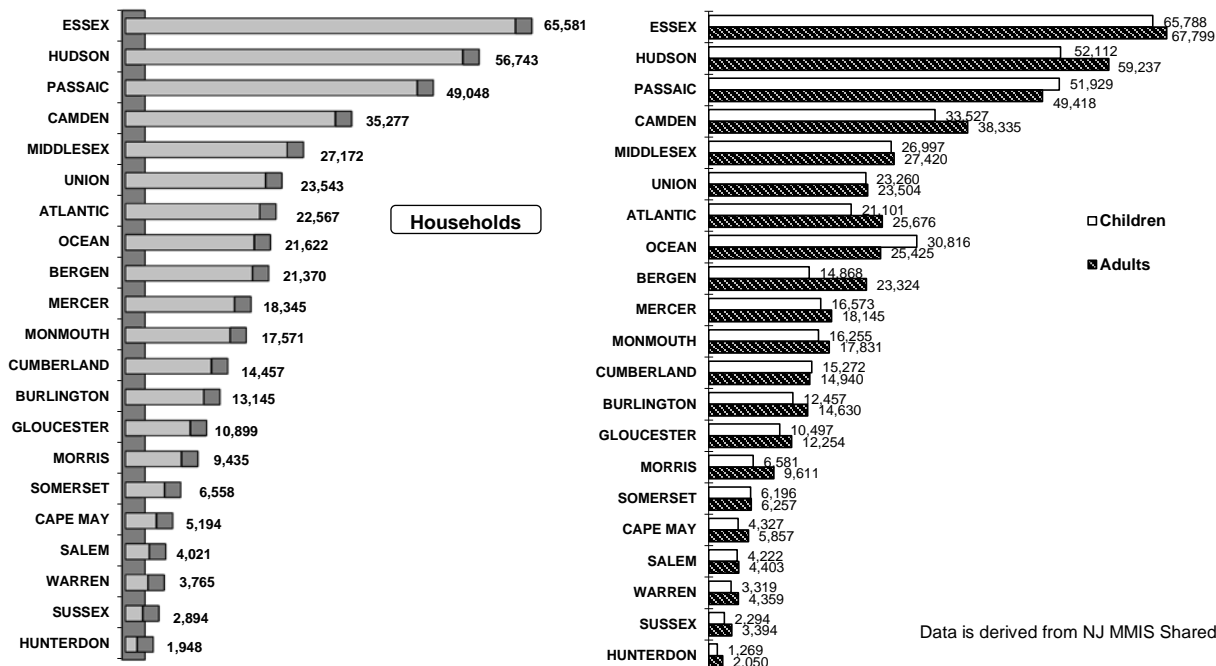

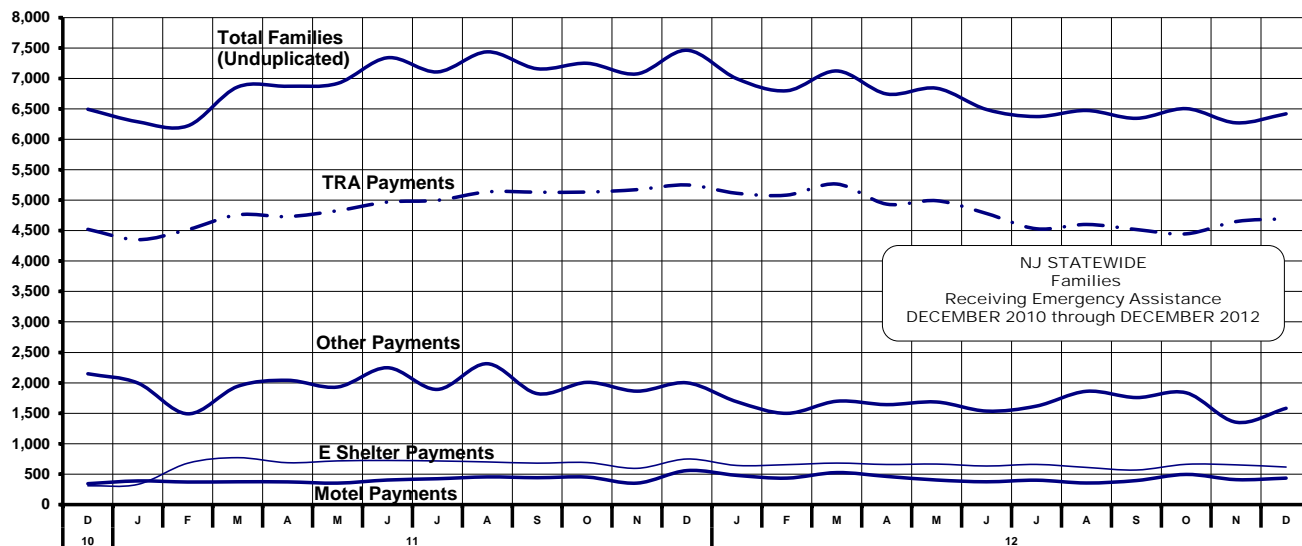

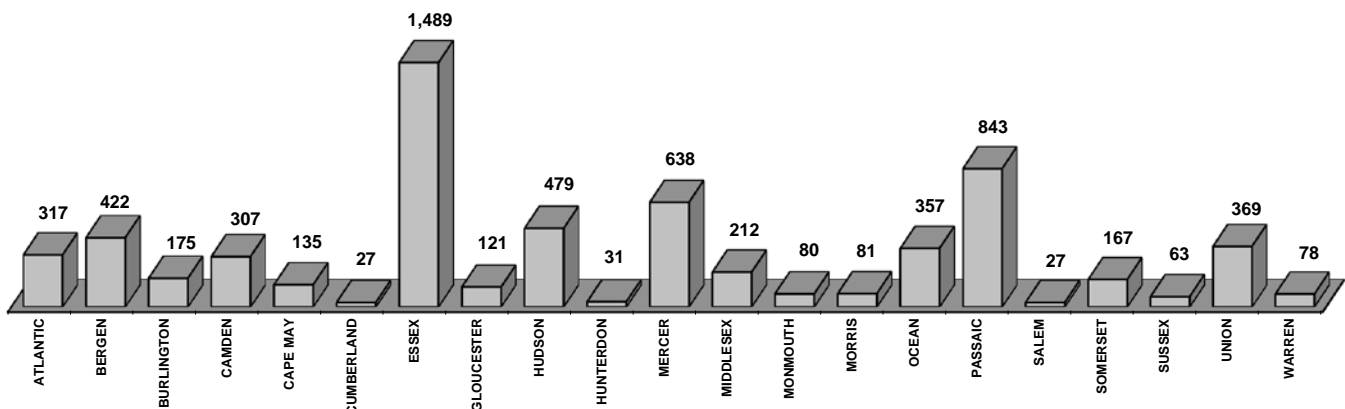

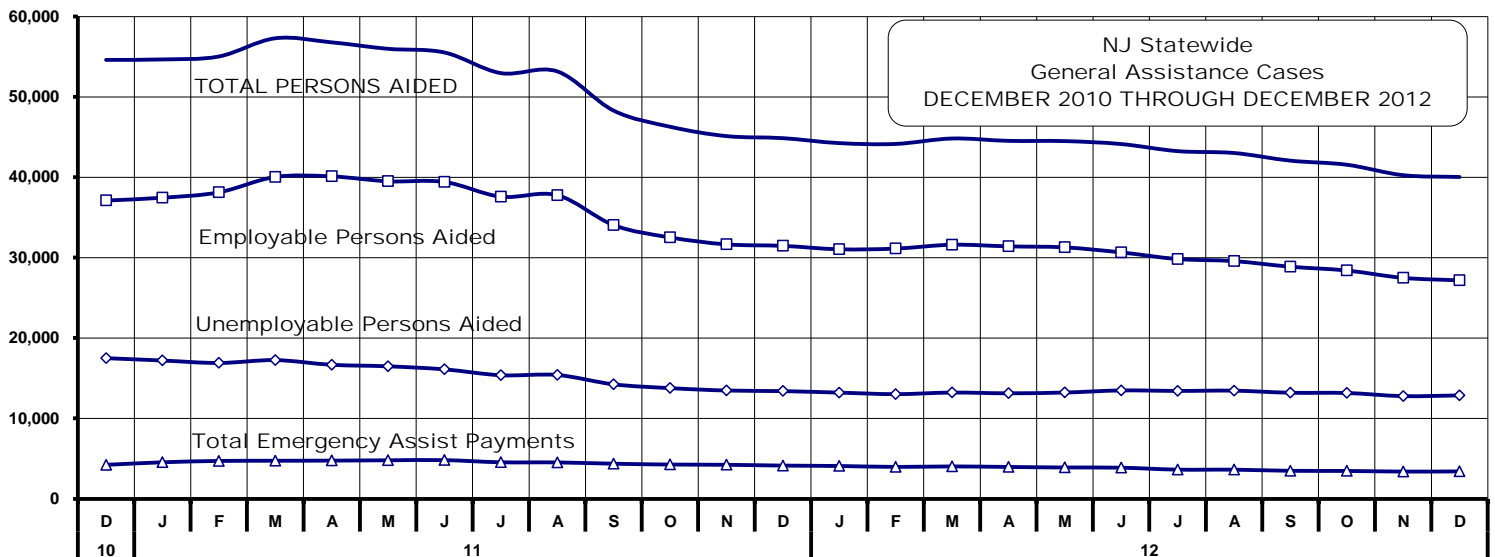

## **ACRONYMS**

**CASS:** Consolidated Assistance and Support System

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS:** Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS:** General Assistance Automated System

**NJKiDS:** New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE:** The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA:** Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ:** Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
