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# DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS DECEMBER 2017

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

#### WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of December, the TANF caseload had decreased by 3,693 cases, from 19,217 in December 2016 to 15,524 in December 2017, a decrease of 19.2%.
- The county where the family caseload percentage increased since December 2016 was Somerset (2.6%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since December 2016 were Warren (-28.4%), Cape May (-33.0%) and Bergen (-34.2%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 4,850 or 31.2% were child-only in December 2017.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (741), Essex (730) and Hudson (509).
- Essex (6,917), Camden (5,279), Passaic (4,822), Hudson (4,525) and Atlantic (2,944) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in December 2017.

#### **NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In December 2017, there were 386,564 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 30,684 or 7.4%, since December 2016.
- There were 771,617 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of December 2017, a decrease of 61,289 or 7.4% since December 2016.
- The county that showed a percent increase for NJ SNAP benefits as of December 2017, was Warren (1.0%).
- The counties having the highest caseload decrease since December 2016 are Burlington (-10.4%), Union (-10.4%) and Ocean (-12.0%).

#### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 1,740 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in December 2017, a decrease of 718 or 29.2% since December 2016.
- In December 2017, EA payments were made for 417 SSI recipients.

#### **GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

#### **GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 2,104 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in December 2017, a decrease of 447 or 17.5% since December 2016.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in emergency assistance payments were Middlesex (1.9%), Ocean (9.4%) and Sussex (11.1%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in emergency assistance payments were Hunterdon (-36.1%), Monmouth (-42.9%) and Cumberland (-62.5%).

#### **GA Program**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 15,761 to 13,130 since December 2016, a decrease of 16.7%.
- There were 5,606 Employable GA and 7,524 Unemployable GA cases in December 2017.
- The county that showed a percent increase for GA cases was Cape May (7.1%) since December 2016.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since December 2016 were Gloucester (-28.6%), Union (-29.9%) and Salem (-30.6%).
- In December 2017, GA cases showed a 0.8 percent decrease since November 2017.

#### **CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)**

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$300 million from October 2017 to December 2017, a decrease of 4.0 percent over the same period for FFY 2017.
- Total distributions decreased 6.9% from December 2016.

#### **WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**


- During the report month of December 2017, there were 1,574 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 300 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (370), Camden (248) and Hudson (171).
- There were 2,072 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.







# **ACRONYMS**

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) -** Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS**: Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS**: General Assistance Automated System

**NJKiDS**: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE**: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA**: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA**: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ**: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
