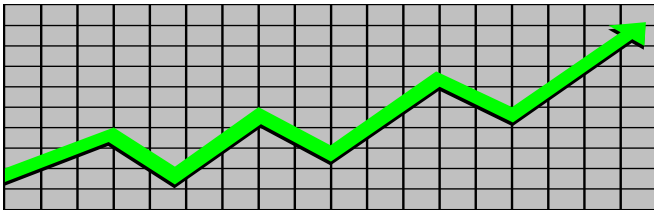

## DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS

DECEMBER 2021

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

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### **WFNJ/TANF**

- As of the end of December, the TANF caseload had decreased by 1,023 cases, from 10,678 in December 2020 to 9,655 in December 2021; a decrease of -9.6%.
- The counties with caseloads that increased the most since December 2020 were Hunterdon (12.2%), Salem (8.5%), and Morris (3.8%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since December 2020 were Sussex (-40%), Essex (-34.5%), and Warren (-24.6%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 2,824 or 29.2% were child-only in December 2021.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (498), Hudson (333), and Passaic (295).
- Hudson (3,739), Camden (3,554), and Essex (3,061) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in December 2021.

### **NJ SNAP (Formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In December 2021, there were 468,377 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 56,857 or 13.8%, since December 2020.
- There were 902,873 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of December 2021; an increase of 102,382 or 12.8% since December 2020.
- The counties having the highest caseload increase since December 2020 were Essex (23.9%), Union (18.2%), and Atlantic (17.2%).

### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 1,278 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in December 2021; a decrease of 117 or -8.4% since December 2020.
- In December 2021, EA payments were made for 570 SSI recipients.

**DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS  
DECEMBER 2021**

- There were 1,813 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in December 2021; a decrease of 131 or -6.7% since December 2020.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Burlington (62.7%), Hudson (13.2%), and Middlesex (12%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Gloucester (-88.2%), Cape May (-42.1%), and Bergen (-40.5%).

**GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 13,231 to 12,758 since December 2020; a decrease of -3.6%.
- There were 9,086 Employable GA and 3,672 Unemployable GA cases in December 2021.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases were Camden (21%), Union (14.2%), and Morris (12.7%) since December 2020.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since December 2020 were Atlantic (-100%), Gloucester (-33.1%), and Warren (-23.4%).
- In December 2021, GA cases showed a -5.6% decrease since November 2021.

**CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (QUARTERLY REPORT)**

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$270 million from October 2021 to December 2021; a decrease of -8.3% over the same period from FFY 2021.
- Total distributions decreased -11.7% from December 2020.

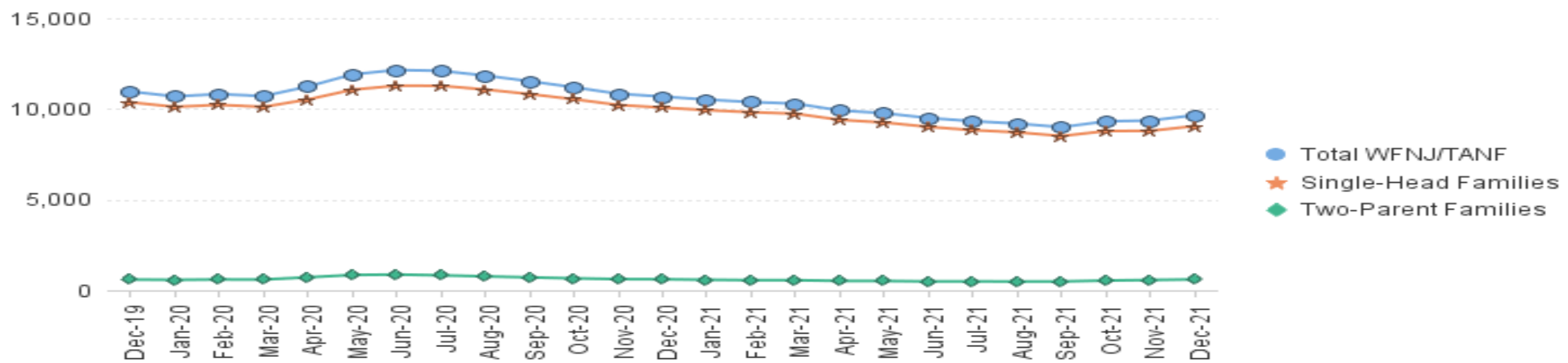
**WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of December 2021, there were 265 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 78 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment-related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (48), Hudson (43), and Atlantic (33).
- There were 216 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

**DECEMBER 2019 THROUGH DECEMBER 2021**



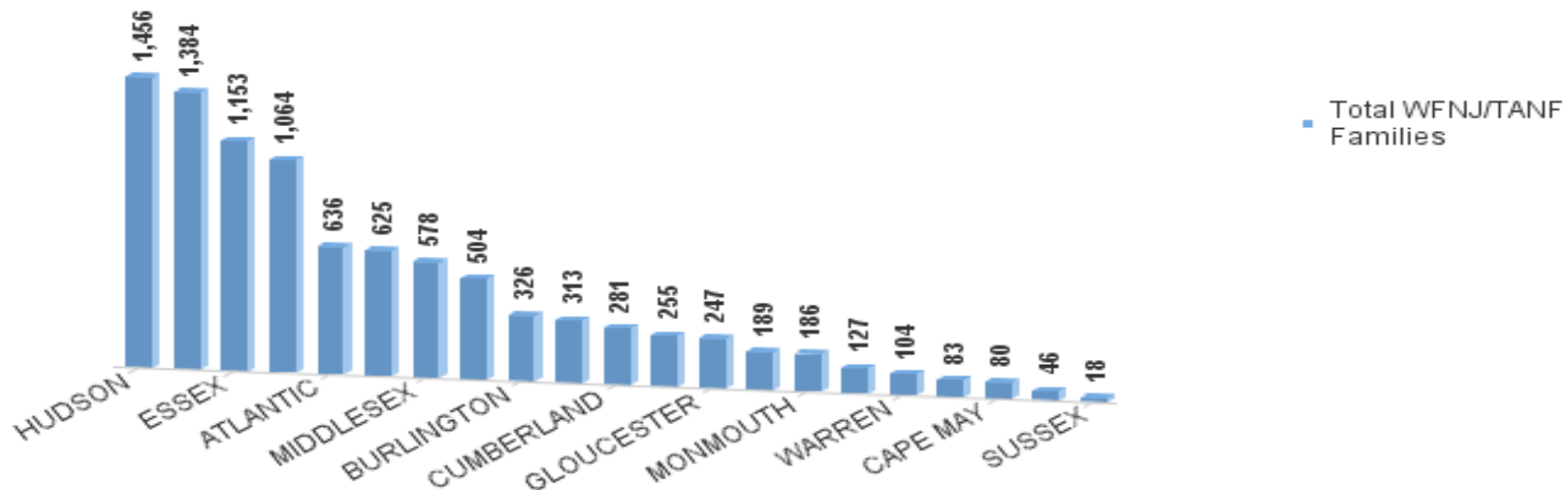

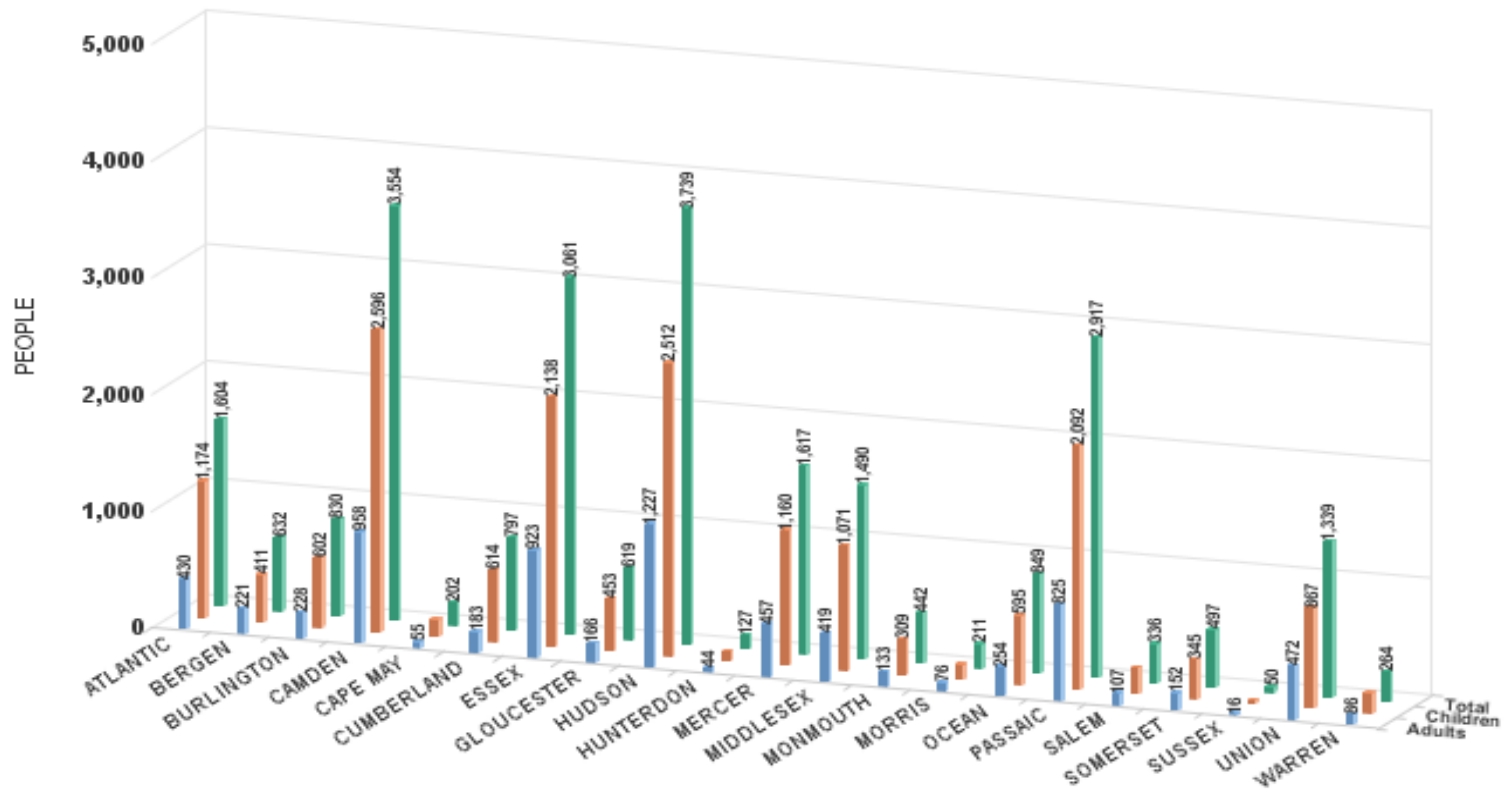

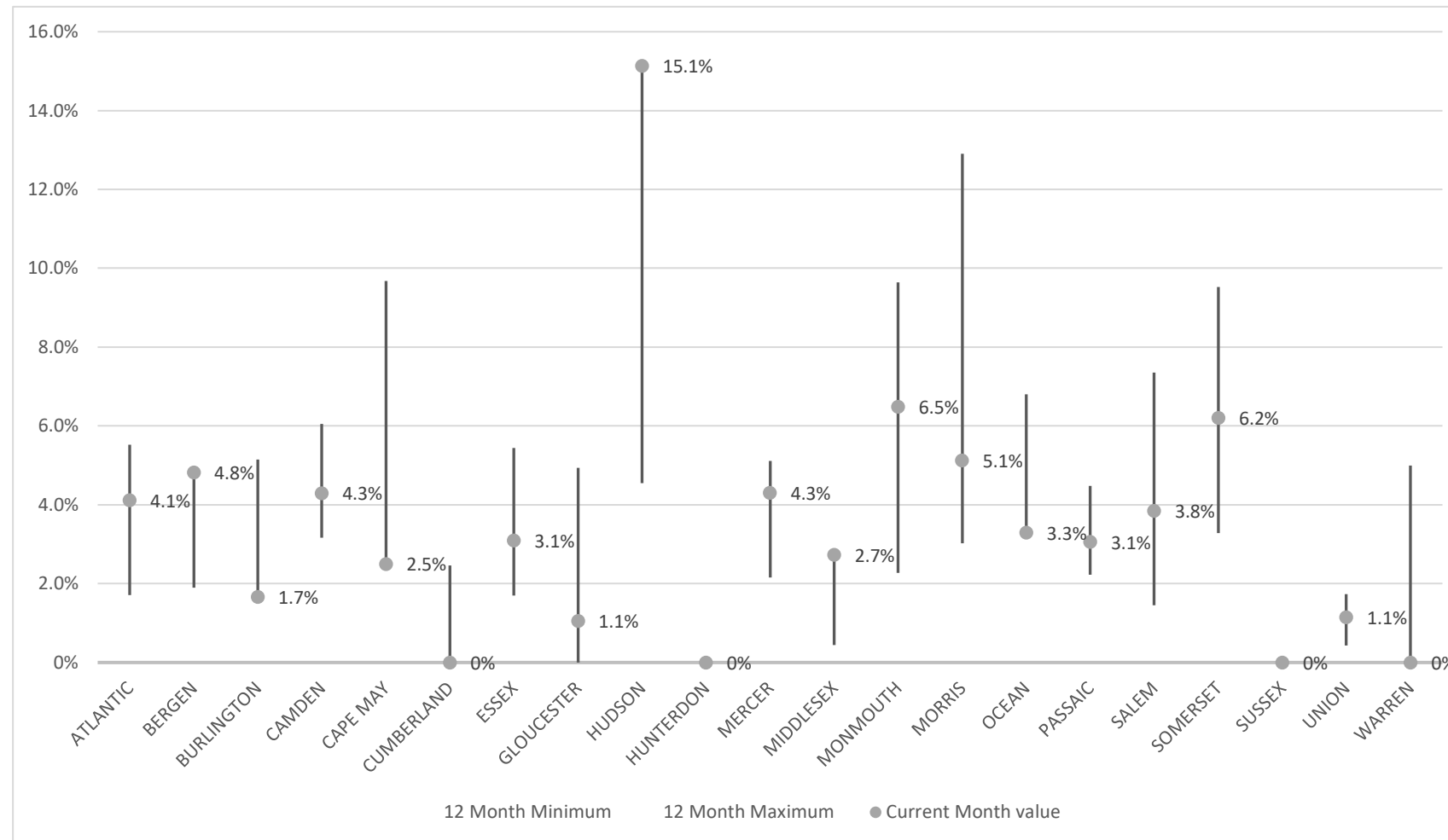

Ending with DECEMBER 2021

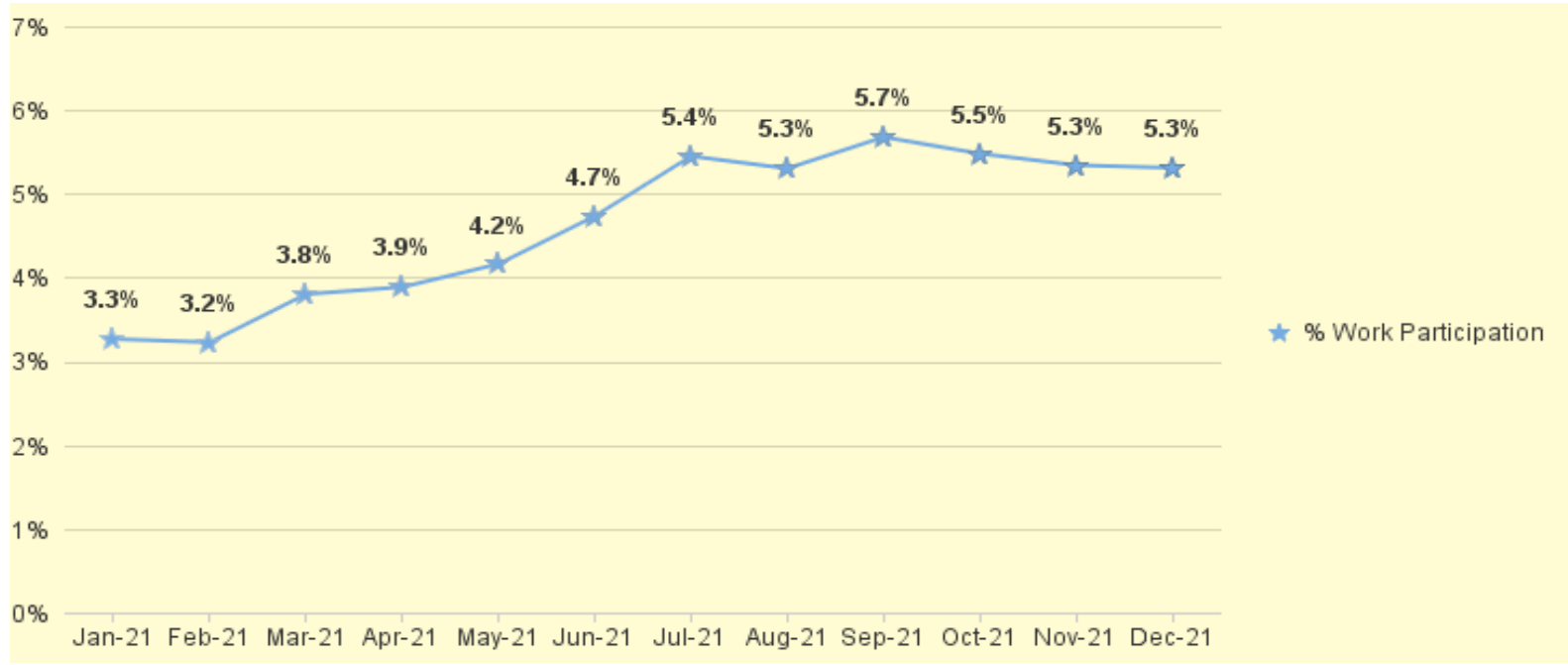

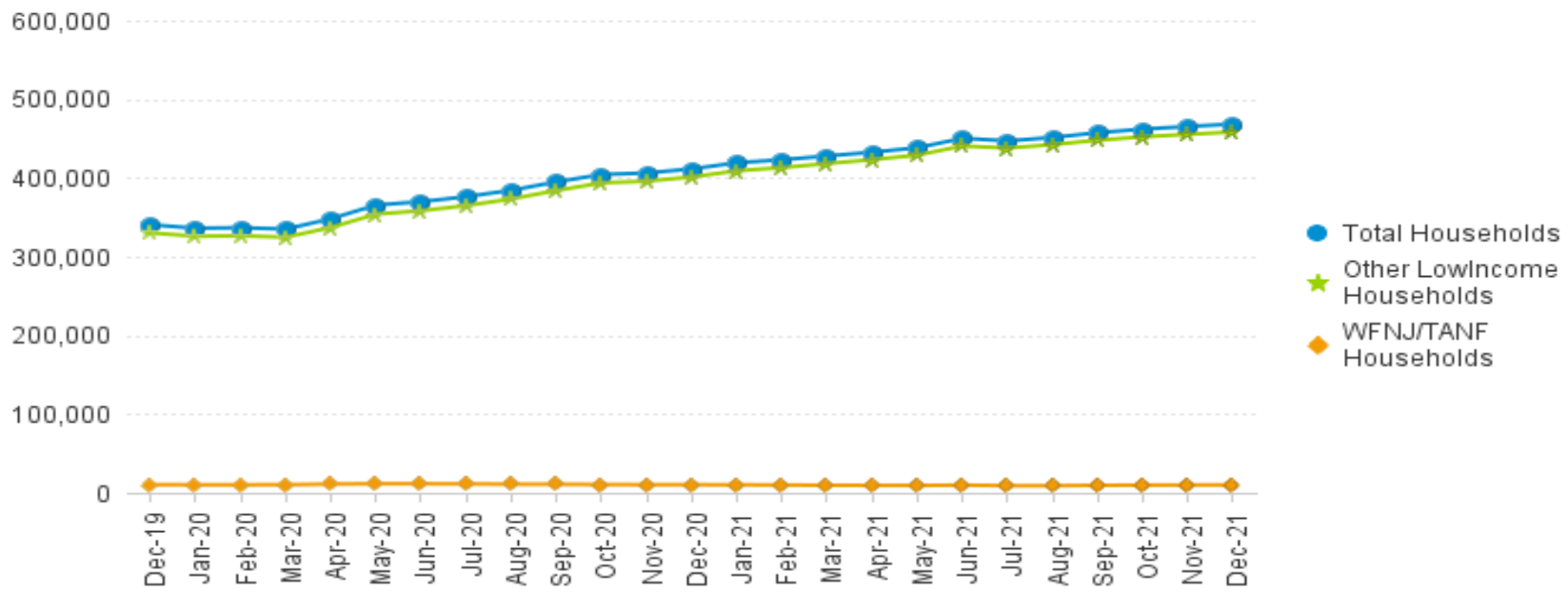

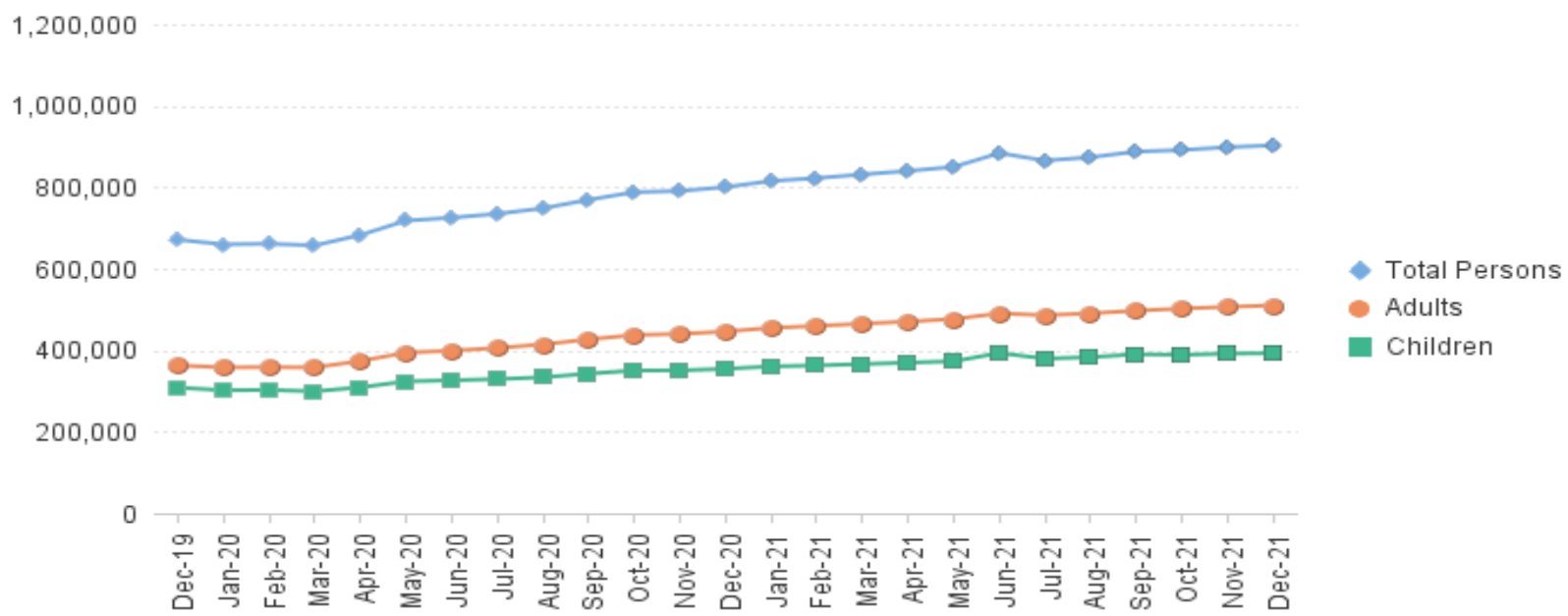

**Statewide NJ SNAP Persons: DECEMBER 2019 Through DECEMBER 2021**



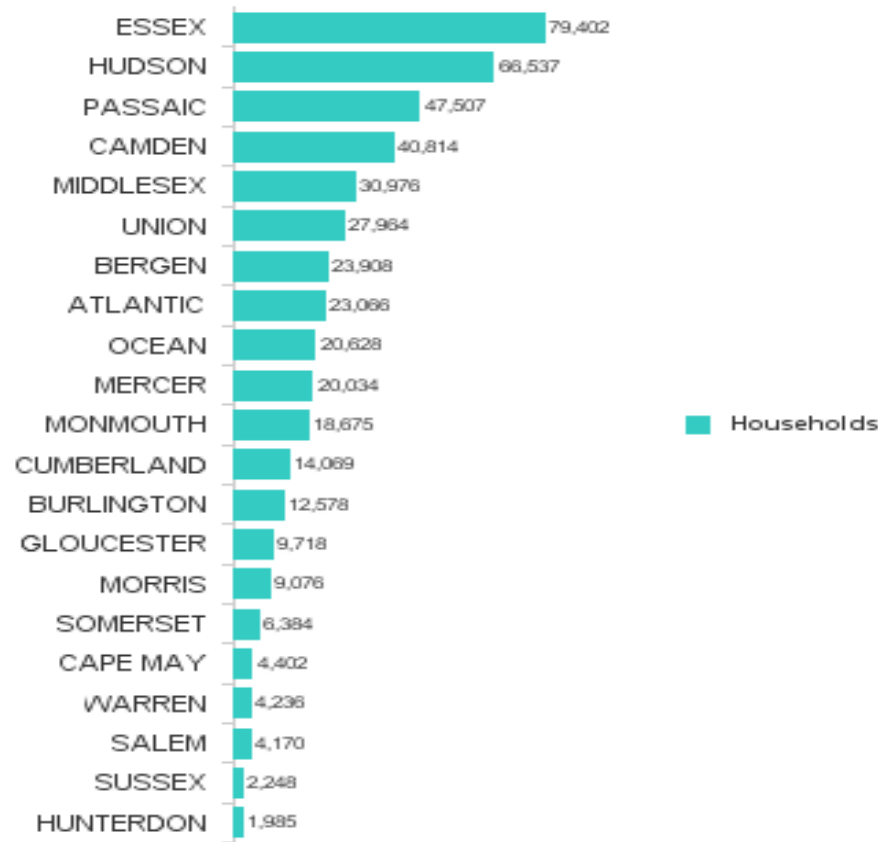

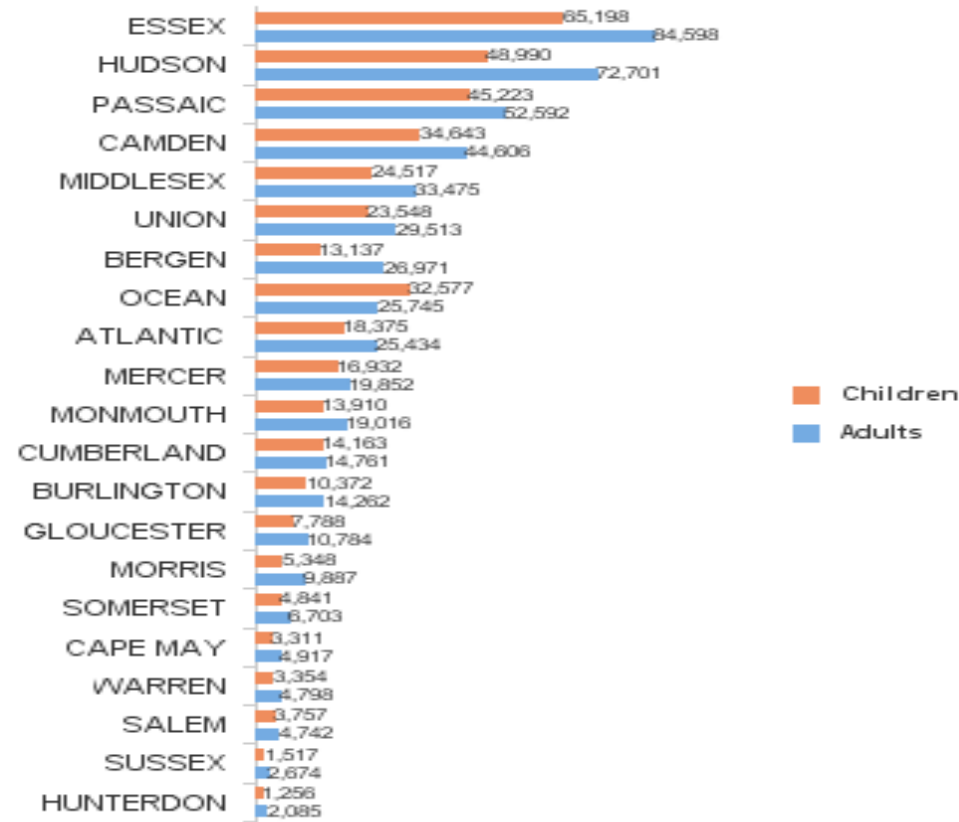

**DECEMBER 2021 by County**



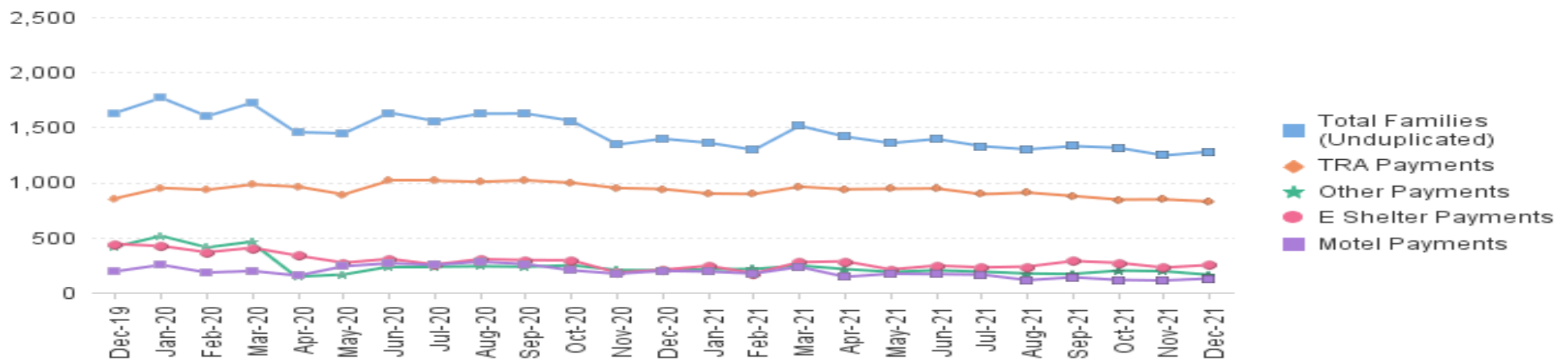

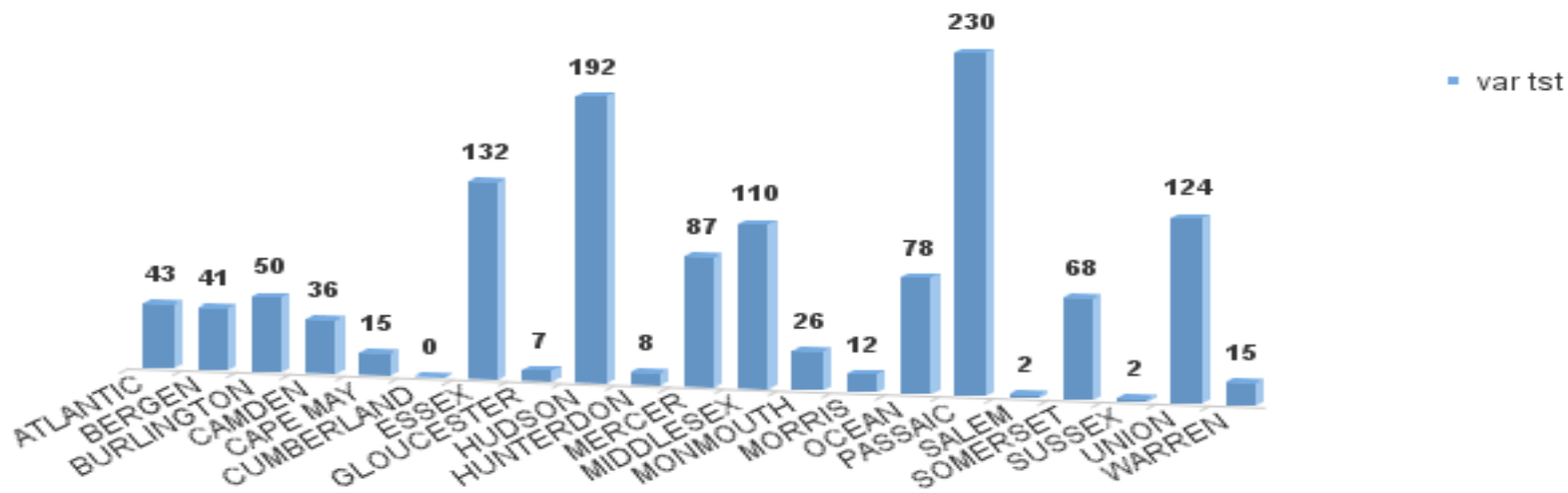

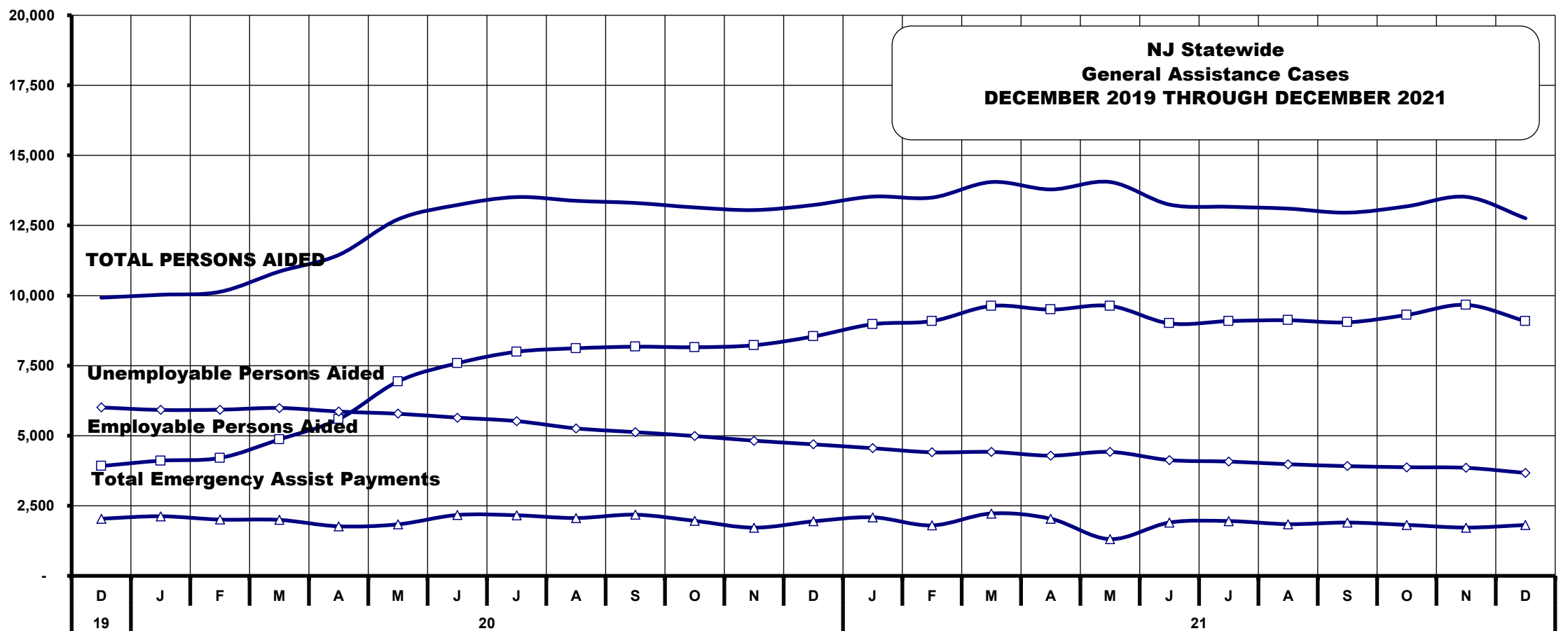
**Number WFNJ Families Receiving EA by County DECEMBER 2021**

## **ACRONYMS**

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as NJ SNAP (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment

**FAMIS:** Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS:** General Assistance Automated System

**NJKIDS:** New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE:** The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA:** Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ:** Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
