

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#### DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS FEBRUARY 2009

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, Food Stamps, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance (GA) and Child Support and Paternity. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider.

#### WFNJ/TANF

- At the end of February, the TANF caseload decreased by 419 cases, from 37,728 in February 2008 to 37,309 in February 2009, a 1.1% decline.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since February 2008 include Hunterdon (59.2%), Sussex (23.6%), and Ocean (18.5%).
- The counties that decreased the most since February 2008 were Camden (-3.9 %), Union (-5.1%) and Hudson (-7.3 %)
- Of the WFNJ/TANF families, 9,761 or 26.2% were child-only cases in February 2009
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,702), Hudson (1,325), and Camden (1,161).
- Essex (21,290), Hudson (11,817), and Camden (10,075) counties have the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in February 2009.

#### **FOOD STAMP PROGRAM**

- February 2009 there are 234,563 households receiving food stamps. Food Stamp households increased by 31,070, or 15.3%, since February 2008.
- There were 480,723 persons receiving food stamps as of February 2009, an increase of 62,259 or 14.9 % since February 2008.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since February 2008 are Hunterdon (37.9%), Morris (24.5%), and Somerset (23.9%)

#### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 4,813 families receiving emergency assistance (EA) in February 2009, an increase of 289 or 6.4% since February 2008.
- In February 2009, EA payments were made for 1,450 SSI recipients

#### DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS FEBRUARY 2009

#### **GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

#### **GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 7,140 emergency assistance payments made to GA recipients in February 2009, an increase of 361 or 5.3% since February 2008.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Morris (61.2%), Gloucester (48.3%), and Bergen (39.5%).

#### **GA Program**

- The total numbers of persons for GA has increased from 39,520 to 45,478 since February 2008, an increase of 15.1%.
- There were 28,124 Employable GA and 17,354 Unemployable GA recipients in February 2009.
- Essex (63.7%), Hunterdon (39.4%), and Sussex (32.3%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA persons since February 2008.

#### CHILD SUPPORT AND PATERNITY (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support and Paternity Program was about 290 million dollars from October 2007 to September 2008, an increase of 7.7 percent over the same period for FFY 2007.
- Total distributions increased over 13 percent from September 2007.

#### **WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of February 2009, there were 3,847 families where at least one member is employed and an additional 284 families where WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active recipients were: Essex (955), Hudson (509), and Camden (334).
- There were 3,957 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.







WFNJ/TANF Work Paticipation Rates for 12-Month Period Ending with FEBRUARY 2009 Statewide



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





## Total Food Stamp Recipients FEBRUARY 2009 By County








#### **ACRONYMS**

ACSES: Automated Child Support Enforcement System

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if the eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

FOOD STAMP PROGRAM (FS) - Authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) of 1996. PRWORA establishes Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, WFNJ/TANF for families with children, and WFNJ/GA (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. The emphasis is on achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.
