# DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS FEBRUARY 2015

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

### WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of February, the TANF caseload had decreased by 3,235 cases, from 34,276 in February 2014 to 31,041 in February 2015, a decrease of 9.4%.
- The counties where the family caseload percentage increased since February 2014 were Burlington (14.6%), Morris (7.3%), and Bergen (0.3%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since February 2014 were Salem (-24.6%), Monmouth (-28.0%), and Hunterdon (-31.3%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 7,454 or 24.0% were child-only in February 2015.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,119), Camden (1,012), and Hudson (824).
- Essex (16,549), Passaic (8,900), Hudson (8,752), Camden (8,149), and Atlantic (5,502) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in February 2015.

# **NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In February 2015, there were 451,087 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 24,428, or 5.7%, since February 2014.
- There were 897,688 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of February 2015, an increase of 43,912 or 5.1% since February 2014.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since February 2014 are Bergen (12.6%), Burlington (12.6%), and Union (12.0%).

### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 5,685 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in February 2015, a decrease of 250 or 4.2% since February 2014.
- In February 2015, EA payments were made for 1,394 SSI recipients.

# DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS FEBRUARY 2015

### **GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

### **GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 4,897 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in February 2015, an increase of 129 or 2.7% since February 2014.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Burlington (142.3%), Union (27.2%), and Somerset (25.9%).

### **GA Program**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 31,607 to 27,680 since February 2014, a decrease of 12.4%.
- There were 16,267 Employable GA and 11,413 Unemployable GA cases in February 2015.
- Burlington (24.0%), Bergen (22.3%) and Cape May (17.6%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA cases since February 2014.
- In February 2015, GA cases showed a 2.9 percent decrease since January 2014.

# **CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)**

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$317 million from October 2014 to December 2014, an increase of 0.3 percent over the same period for FFY 2014.
- Total distributions decreased 1.2% from December 2013.

# **WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of February 2015, there were 3,351 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 508 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (934), Hudson (379), and Camden (281).
- There were 3,152 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.









# **ACRONYMS**

**CASS**: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) -** Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS**: Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS**: General Assistance Automated System

**NJKiDS**: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE**: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA**: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA**: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, WFNJ/TANF for families with children, and WFNJ/GA (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
