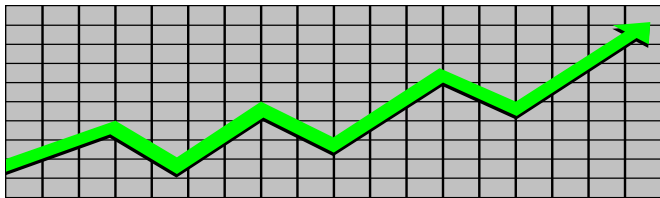

JULY 2016

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of July, the TANF caseload had decreased by 6,851 cases, from 27,787 in July 2015 to 20,936 in July 2016, a decrease of 24.7%.
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since July 2015 were Monmouth (-35.4%), Ocean (-35.4%), Sussex (-39.4%) and Hunterdon (-40.4%) .
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 5,987 or 28.6% were child-only in July 2016.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (889), Camden (821) and Hudson (629).
- Essex (9,512), Passaic (6,684), Hudson (6,102), Camden (5,966) and Atlantic (3,712) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in July 2016.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In July 2016, there were 430,217 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 15,135 or 3.5%, since July 2015.
- There were 858,572 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of July 2016, a decrease of 27,327 or 3.1% since July 2015.
- The two counties having the highest caseload increase since July 2015 are Middlesex (0.7%) and Bergen (0.5%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 2,766 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in July 2016, a decrease of 2,338 or 45.8% since July 2015.
- In July 2016, EA payments were made for 569 SSI recipients.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 2,695 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in July 2016, a decrease of 1,908 or 41.5% since July 2015.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in emergency assistance payments were Hunterdon (59.2%), Burlington (63.1%) and Warren (71.7%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 24,794 to 17,450 since July 2015, a decrease of 29.6%.
- There were 8,126 Employable GA and 9,324 Unemployable GA cases in July 2016.
- The county that showed a percent increase in GA cases was Salem (3.6%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since July 2015 were Warren (43.2%), Cape May (44.6%) and Passaic (46.1%) .
- In July 2016, GA cases showed a 5.3 percent decrease since June 2016.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

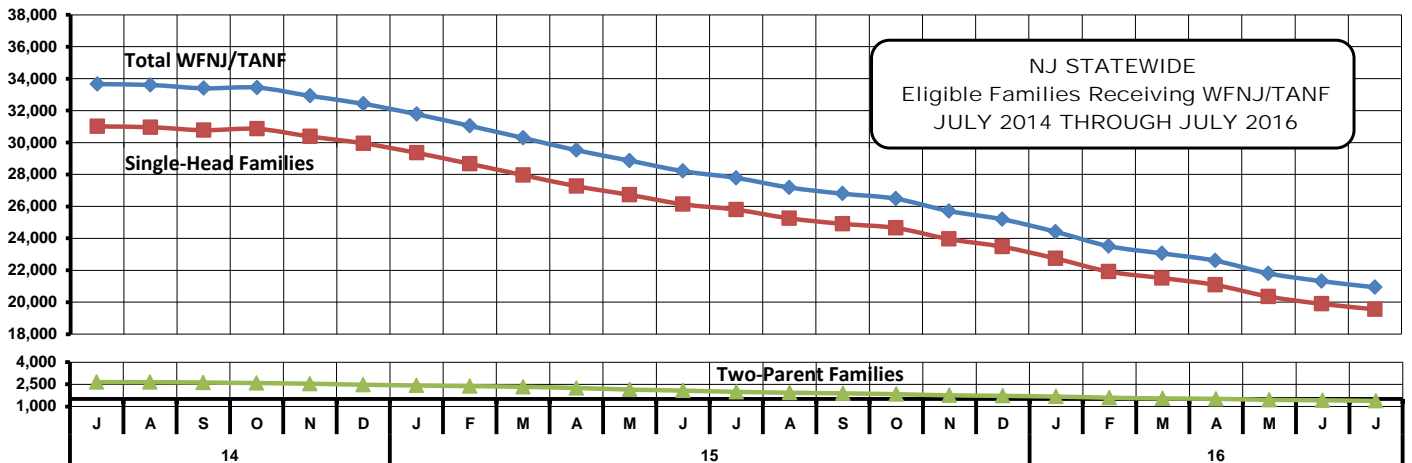
- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$337 million from April 2016 to June 2016, an increase of 0.1 percent over the same period for FFY 2015.
- Total distributions decreased 2.2% from June 2015.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of July 2016, there were 2,262 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 476 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (539), Camden (271) and Passaic (260).
- There were 3,091 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

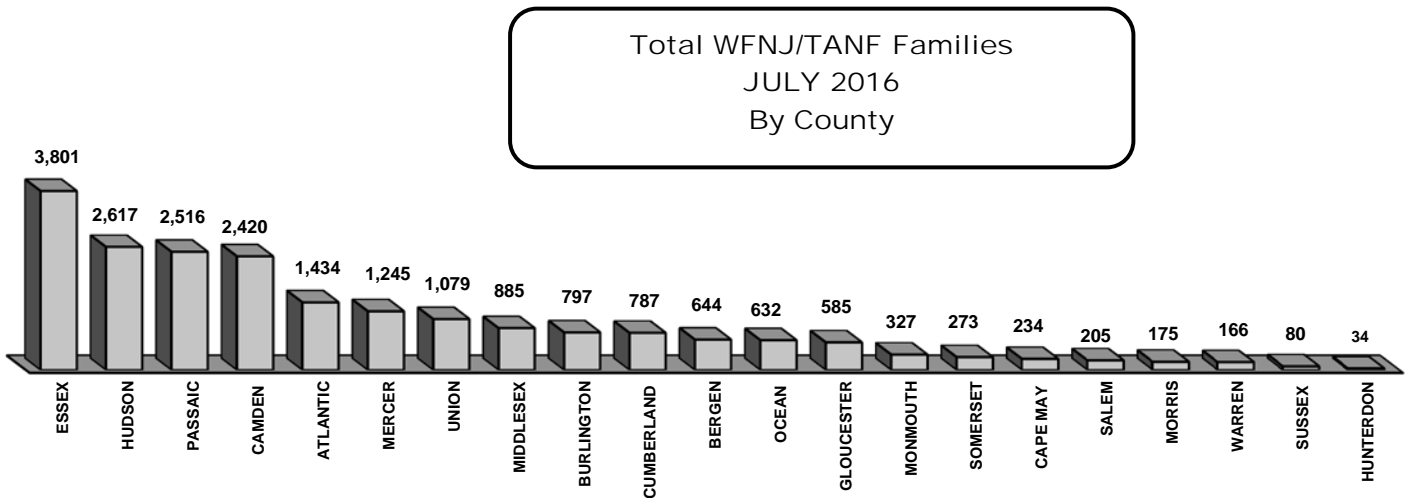

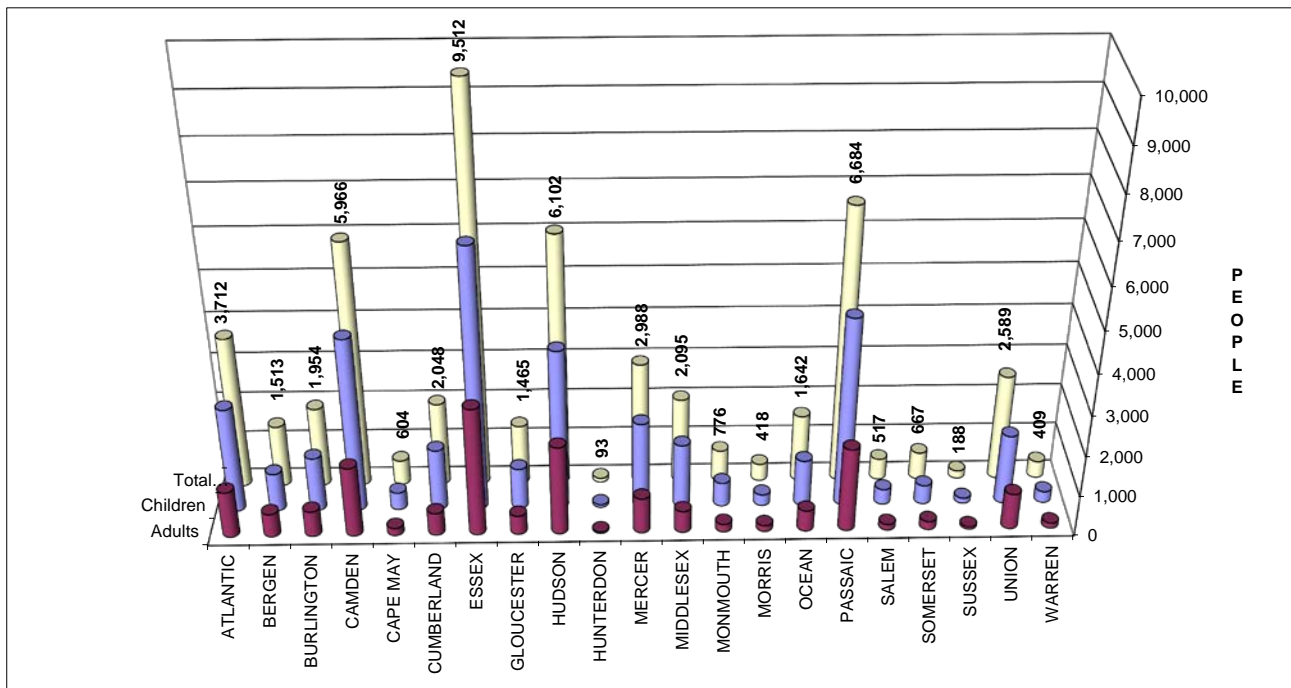

Ending With JULY 2016

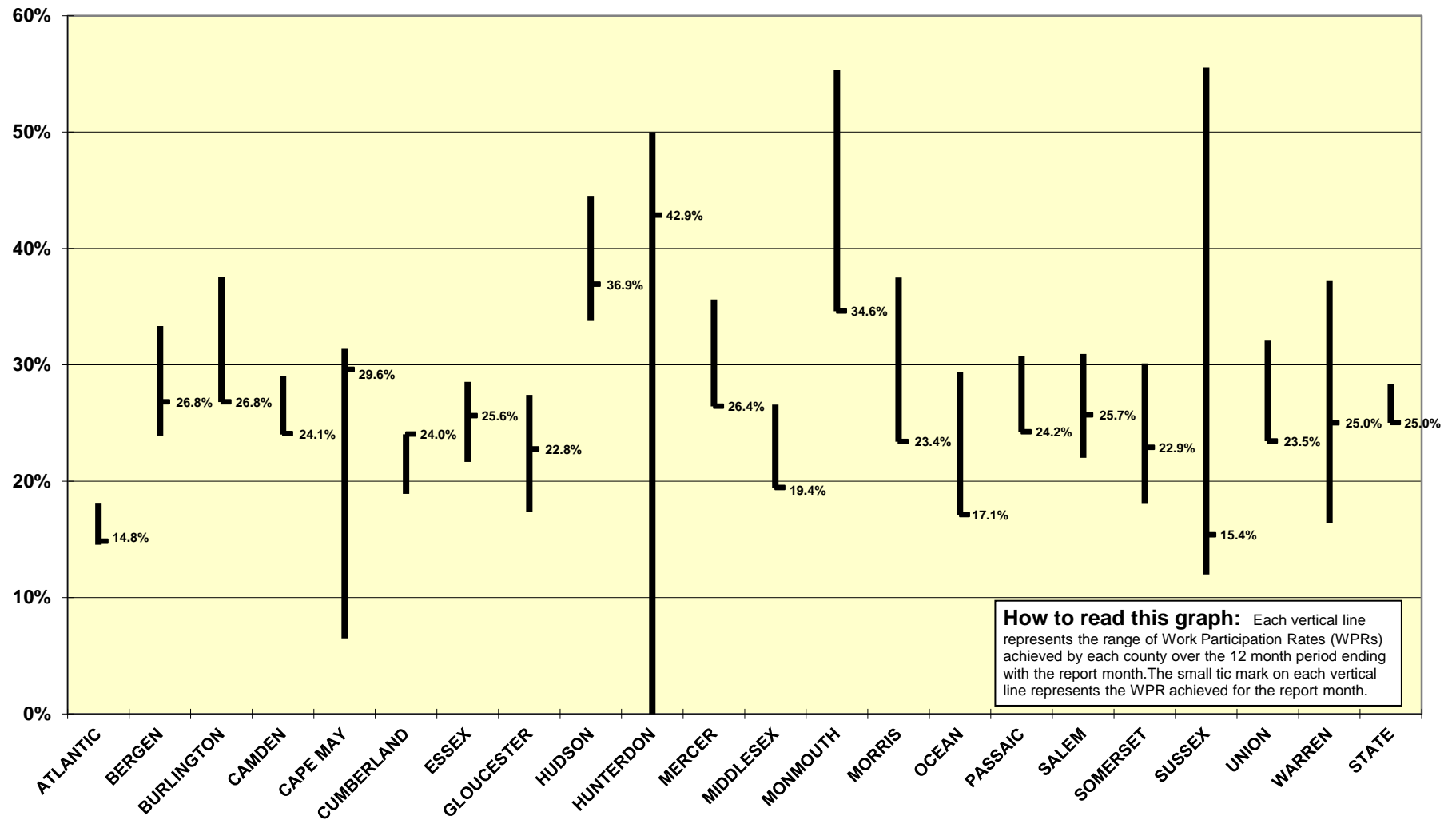
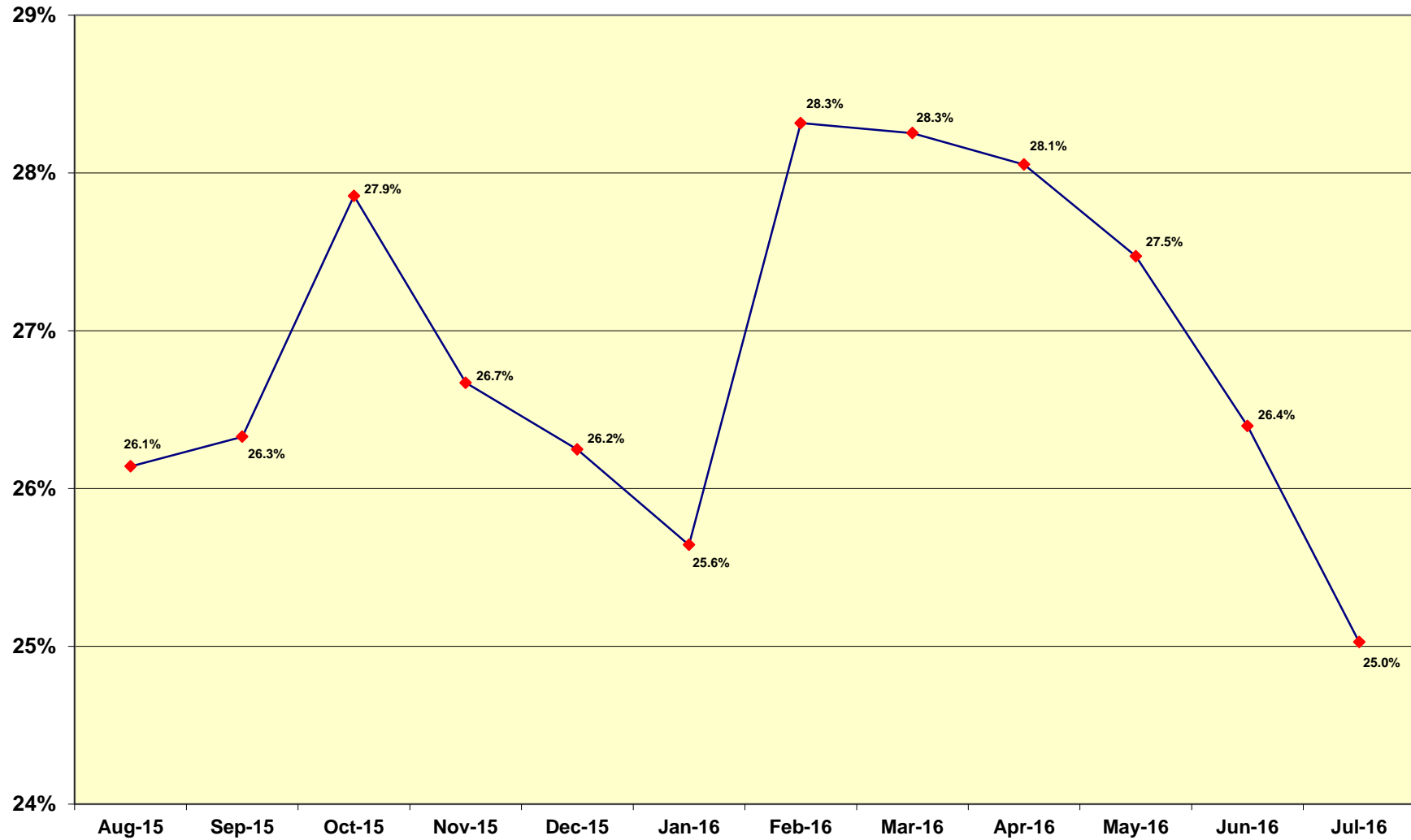

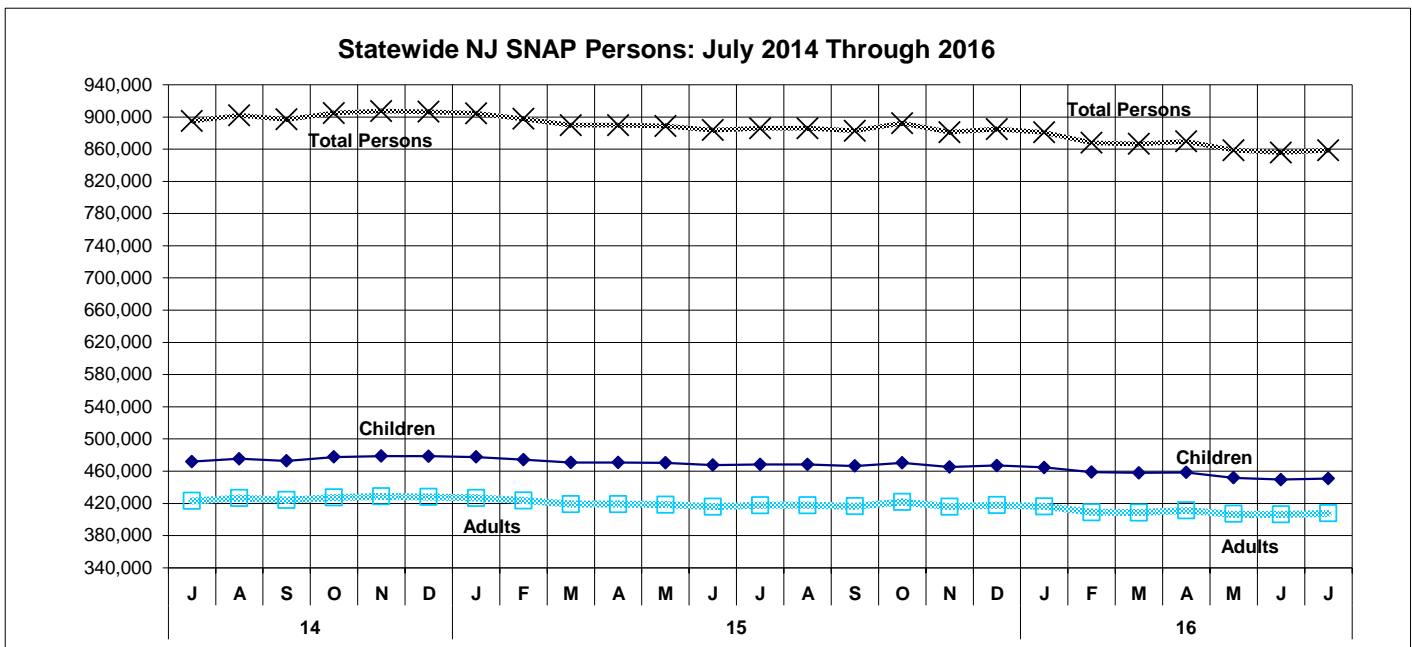

JULY 2014 THROUGH JULY 2016 (STATEWIDE)**



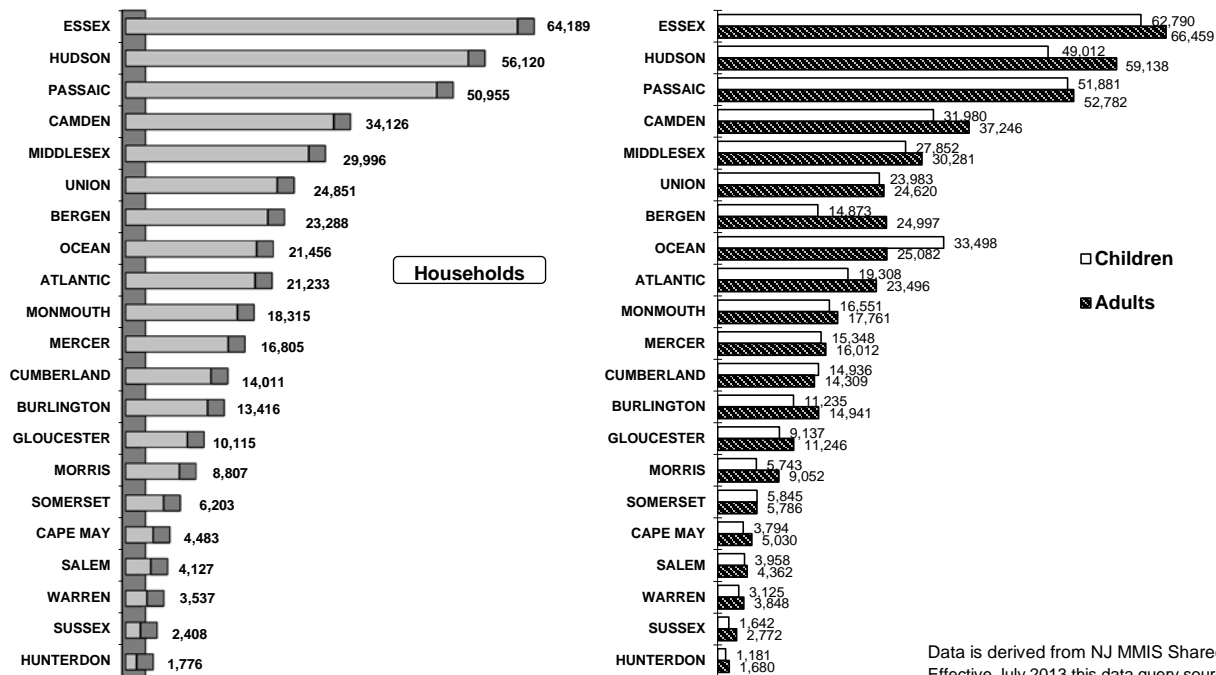

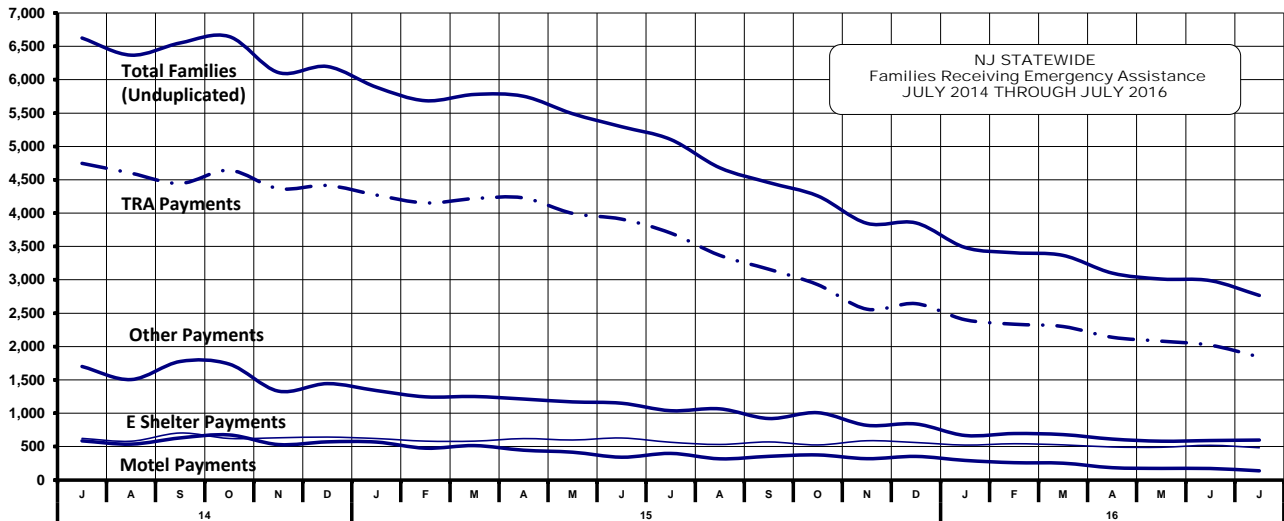

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
