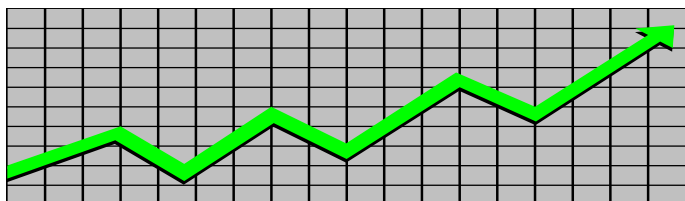

## **DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS**

### **MARCH 2023**

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

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#### **WFNJ/TANF**

- As of the end of March, the TANF caseload had increased by 774 cases, from 10,379 in March 2022 to 11,153 in March 2023; an increase of 7.5%.
- The counties with caseloads that increased the most since March 2022 were Bergen (57.5%), Sussex (47.8%), and Mercer (28.6%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since March 2022 were Hunterdon (-18.6%), Passaic (-12.6%), and Warren (-11.5%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 2,565 or 23% were child-only in March 2023.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (444), Hudson (321), and Essex (253).
- Hudson (4,786), Essex (4,089), and Camden (4,006) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in March 2023.

#### **NJ SNAP (Formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In March 2023, there were 419,941 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 46,413 or -10%, since March 2022.
- There were 833,744 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of March 2023; a decrease of 63,523 or -7.1% since March 2022.
- The counties having the highest SNAP caseload increase since March 2022 were Warren (9.8%), Hunterdon (8.7%), and Ocean (8.4%).
- The counties having the highest SNAP caseload decrease since March 2022 were Hudson (-22.4%), Union (-18.9%), and Passaic (-18.5%).

#### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 1,462 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in March 2023; an increase of 66 or 4.7% since March 2022.
- In March 2023, EA payments were made for 680 SSI recipients.

## **DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS MARCH 2023**

- There were 1,837 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in March 2023; a decrease of 281 or -10.8% since March 2022.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Cumberland (375%), Morris (33.3%), and Union (30.2%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Cape May (-100%), Sussex (-83.3%), and Warren (-43.6%).

### **GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 15,332 to 10,162 since March 2022; a decrease of -33.7%.
- There were 6,607 Employable GA and 3,555 Unemployable GA cases in March 2023.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases was Somerset (3.9%) since March 2022.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since March 2022 were Passaic (-56.1%), Hudson (-55.7%), and Essex (-46.9%).
- In March 2023, GA cases showed a 1.92% increase since February 2023.

### **CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (QUARTERLY REPORT)**

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$273 million from January 2023 to March 2023; a decrease of -2.33% over the same period from FFY 2022.
- Total distributions decreased -3% from March 2022.

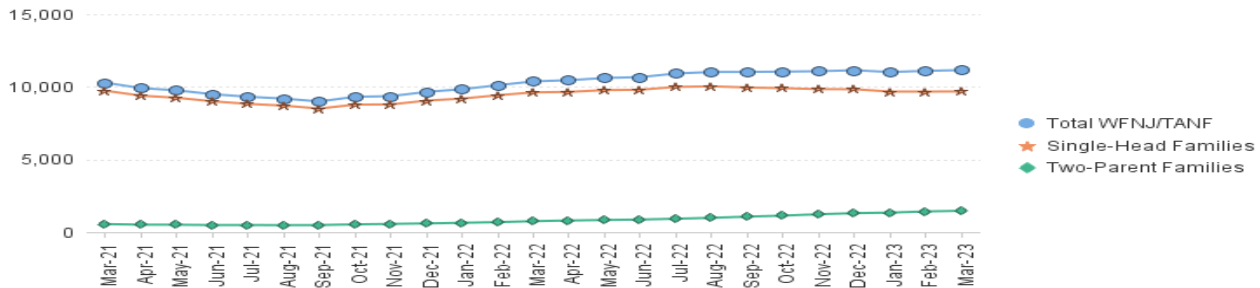
### **WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of March 2023, there were 535 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 158 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Hudson (100), Essex (90), and Camden (58).
- There were 218 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

**MARCH 2021 THROUGH MARCH 2023**



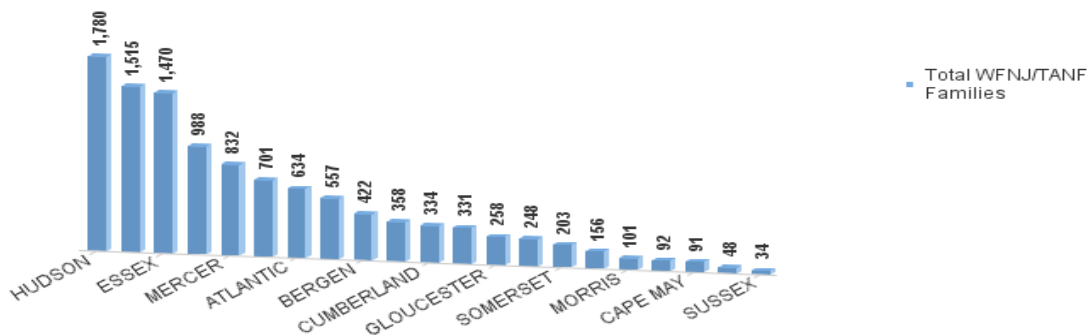

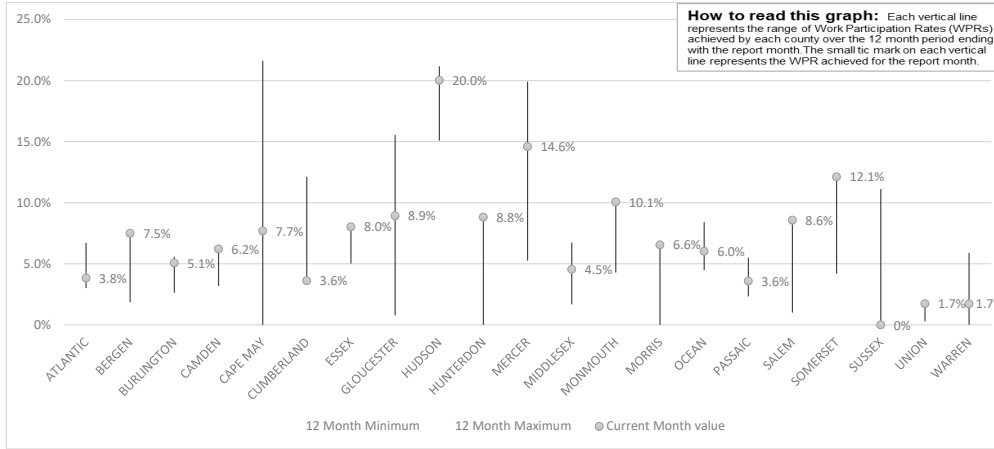

Ending with MARCH 2023

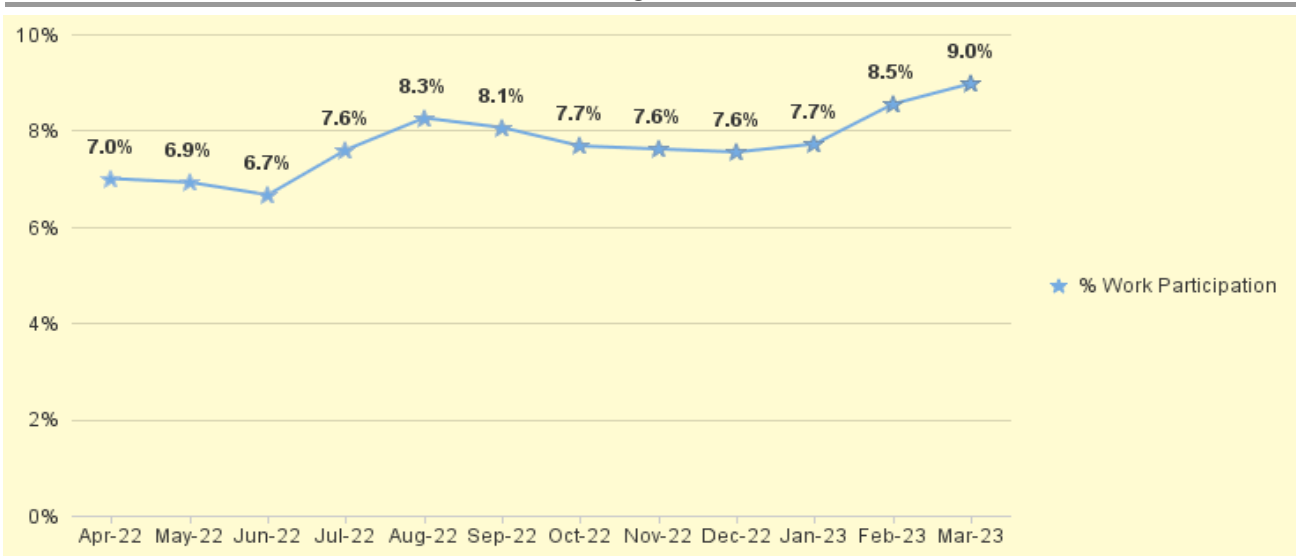

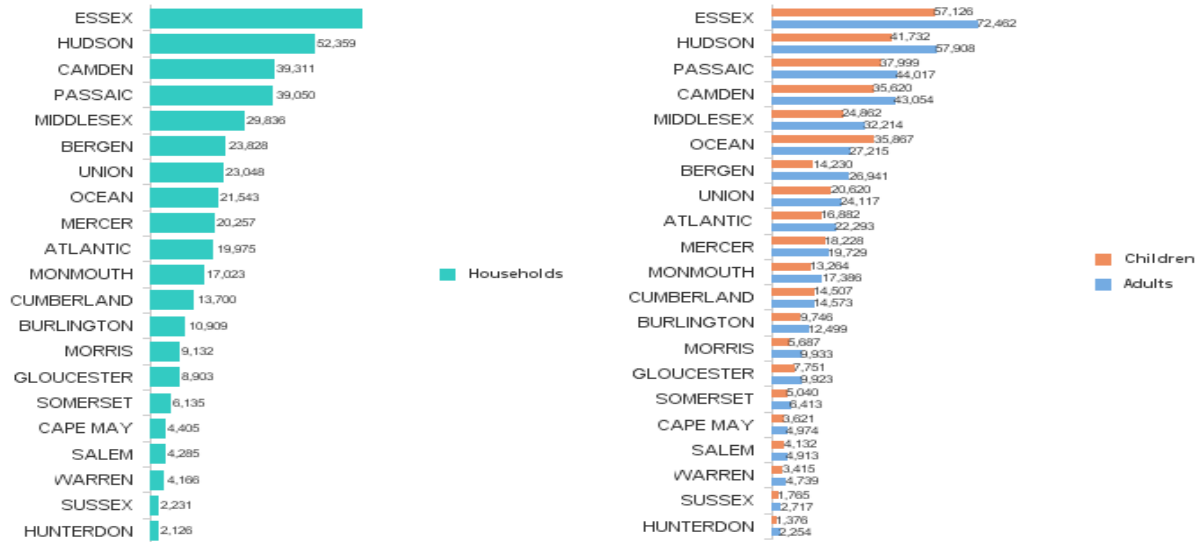

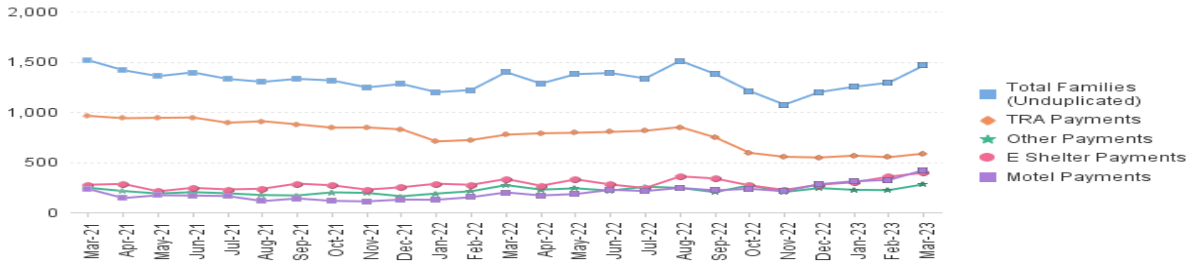

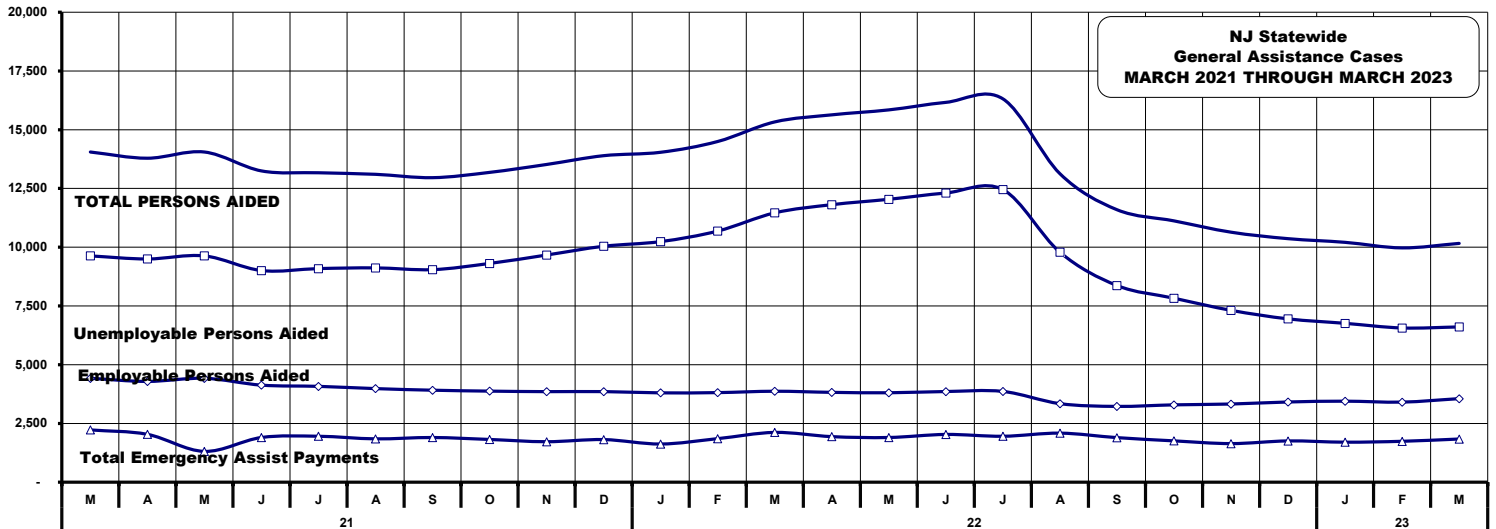
**Number WFNJ Families Receiving EA by County MARCH 2023**

## **ACRONYMS**

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as NJ SNAP (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS:** Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS:** General Assistance Automated System

**NJKiDS:** New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE:** The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA:** Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ:** Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
