

EXPLANATORY NOTES
WFNJ Statistical Summary (Figure 14)

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, Food Stamps, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance (GA) and Child Support and Paternity. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider.

### WFNJ/TANF

- At the end of September, the TANF caseload decreased by 1,275 cases; from 38,488 in September 2007 to 37,213 in September 2008, a 3.3% decline.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since September 2007 include Hunterdon (26.8%), Sussex (5.7%), and Cape May (3.2%).
- The counties that decreased the most since September 2007 were Middlesex (-6.0 %), Hudson (-7.9%) and Camden (-9.0 %)
- Of the WFNJ/TANF families, 9,593 or 25.8% were child-only cases in September 2008
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,775), Hudson (1,388), and Camden (1,139).
- Essex (22,355), Hudson (12,319), and Camden (9,448) counties have the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in September 2008.

### FOOD STAMP PROGRAM

- September 2008 there are 218,697 households receiving food stamps. Food Stamp households increased by 16,439, or 8.1%, since September 2007.
- There were 449,099 persons receiving food stamps as of September 2008, an increase of 31,435 or 7.5 % since September 2007.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since September 2007 are Ocean (17.4%), Hunterdon (16.5%), and Morris (15.4%)

### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 4,946 families receiving emergency assistance (EA) in September 2008, an increase of 131 or 2.7% since September 2007.
- In September 2008, EA payments were made for 1,745 SSI recipients

### **GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

### **GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 7,266 emergency assistance payments made to GA recipients in September 2008, an increase of 705 or 10.7% since September 2007.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Morris (59.7%), Ocean (50.4%), and Sussex (43.4%).

### **GA Program**

- The total numbers of persons for GA has increased from 38,161 to 42,619 since September 2007, an increase of 11.7%.
- There were 25,387 Employable GA and 17,232 Unemployable GA recipients in September 2008.
- Essex (41.0%), Morris (34.0%), and Sussex (30.5%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA persons since September 2007.

### **CHILD SUPPORT AND PATERNITY (Quarterly Report)**

- The total collection for the Child Support and Paternity Program was about 290 million dollars from October 2007 to September 2008, an increase of 7.7 percent over the same period for FFY 2007.
- Total distributions increased over 13 percent from September 2007, and a slight increase in the percent of collections distributed from 97.4% in September 2007 to 102.3% in September 2008.


### **WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of September 2008, there were 4,781 families where at least one member is employed and an additional 310 families where WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active recipients were: Essex (1,270), Hudson (618), and Camden (425).
- There were 4,477 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





### TANF WORK PARTICIPATION RATES BY COUNTY

Note: TANF Work Participation Rates (WPRs) for Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2008 (beginning October 2007) are not yet available for publication. Owing to early implementation issues with the eTimesheet application now used to track nearly all activity other than paid employment, the WPR figures currently available do not accurately reflect actual participation levels achieved in the initial months of FFY 2008. As can be expected with the introduction of a new system component such as the eTimesheet, numerous end-users have encountered some initial difficulties in adjusting to the new applications. Accordingly, publication of TABLES 3 and 4 is being temporarily deferred. Future editions of the Current Program Statistics will include the updated WPR figures for all completed months within FFY 2008.





To retain consistency, all Food Stamp data is restated from July 2003 to present, but readers should be aware that current series indicates counts higher than were reported by the previous series. This apparent increase is due to basing the counts on "during the month" frame of reference for the current series, as distinguished from the "point in time" (end of month) snapshot frame of reference that characterized the previous series.







### Number WFNJ Families Receiving EA by County SEPTEMBER 2008



### **ACRONYMS**

ACSES: Automated Child Support Enforcement System

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if the eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**FOOD STAMP PROGRAM (FS)** - Authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS**: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) of 1996. PRWORA establishes Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, WFNJ/TANF for families with children, and WFNJ/GA (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. The emphasis is on achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.

### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.
