FINAL AGENCY DECISION

OAL DKT. NO. HMA 06889-17

As Director of the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services, I have reviewed the record in this matter, consisting of the case file, the documents in evidence and the Initial Decision. No exceptions to the Initial Decision were filed. Procedurally, the time period for the Agency Head to file a

Final Agency Decision is September 18, 2017 in accordance with an Order of Extension. The Initial Decision was received on June 8, 2017.

I hereby ADOPT the Initial Decision affirming the termination of NJ FamilyCare benefits. The undisputed evidence in the record indicates that Petitioner's monthly income exceeds the maximum income limit for her child to qualify for benefits through the Middlesex County Board of Social Services. However, based upon my review of the record, it appears that he may be eligible for another segment of NJ FamilyCare with a higher income level. For this reason, I find that the case should be forwarded to the State vendor to determine eligibility.¹


THEREFORE, it is on this ^{2nd} day of August 2017,

ORDERED:

That the Initial Decision affirming the termination of Medicaid eligibility based upon excess income is hereby ADOPTED as the Final Decision in this matter, and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That the Middlesex County Board of Social Services forward this case to the State vendor to evaluate eligibility for other NJ FamilyCare plans with higher income limits.
