FINAL AGENCY DECISION

OAL DKT. NO. HMA 10189-17

As Director of the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services, I

have reviewed the record in this matter, consisting of the case file, the documents in evidence and the Initial Decision. No Exceptions to the Initial Decision were filed. Procedurally, the time period for the Agency Head to file a Final Agency Decision is October 2, 2017, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:14B-10, which requires an Agency Head to adopt, reject or modify the Initial Decision within 45 days of the agency's receipt. The Initial Decision was received on August 18, 2017.


I hereby ADOPT the Initial Decision affirming the denial of NJ FamilyCare benefits. The undisputed evidence in the record indicates that Petitioner's monthly income exceeds the maximum income limit under this program. There is simply no authority that permits the relaxation or waiver of the income limits in any individual case.

However, if Petitioner needs assistance with his prescription costs, I suggest he apply for the Pharmaceutical Assistance to the Aged and Disabled (PAAD) program. Petitioner may also be eligible for assistance with prescription costs through the Rx4NJ program. ORDERED:

That the Initial Decision affirming the denial of eligibility based upon excess income is hereby ADOPTED as the Final Decision in this matter.
