As Director of the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services. I have reviewed the record in this matter, consisting of the Initial Decision, the documents in evidence and the contents of the OAL case file. No exceptions to the Initial Decision were filed. Procedurally, the time period for the Agency Head to render a Final Agency Decision is October 14, 2014, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:14B-10, which requires an Agency Head to adopt, reject, or modify the Initial Decision within 45 days of the agency's receipt. The Initial Decision was received on August 29, 2014.

Based upon my review of the record, I hereby ADOPT the findings. conclusions and recommended decision of the Administrative Law Judge in their entirety and incorporate the same herein by reference. I agree with the Administrative Law Judge that the credible evidence in this record indicates that Petitioner does not satisfy the clinical eligibility criteria necessary to qualify for adult day health services pursuant to N.J.A.C. 8:86-1.5.

As noted in the Initial Decision, Respondent has performed a new assessment and will be issuing a new determination letter. If Petitioner disagrees with the determination, she may request a new fair hearing at that point.

THEREFORE, it is on this quantity day of September 2014,

ORDERED:

That the Initial Decision affirming the termination of eligibility for adult medical day care services is hereby ADOPTED as the Final Decision in this matter.
