Women's History Month - March 2007

From the American Revolutionary War to the present Global War on Terrorism, women have served a vital role in the U.S. Army. Ever since Mary Ludwig Hays McCauley ("Molly Pitcher") replaced her husband when he collapsed at his cannon, women have continually proven that the narrow stereotype, limiting their choice of occupation, was

wrong. As women expanded into different roles in the U.S. Army, it was clear that the heart of a warrior was not limited to one gender. When America went through the Civil War and the world wars of the 20th century, women continued to show their patriotism and their fighting spirit even though they did not receive equal treatment or recognition. Throughout the U.S. Army's history, women have proven that when freedom is threatened, they are equal to any task...and when their country calls, they respond — not in gender-hyphenated roles — but as U.S. Army Soldiers.

Women have served in the United States Army since 1775. They nursed the ill and wounded, laundered and mended clothing, and cooked for the troops in camp; services that did not exist among the uniformed personnel within the Army until the twentieth century. Women are an invaluable and essential part of the Army. Currently, women serve in 91 percent of all Army occupations and make up about 14 percent of the active Army. Women continue to have a crucial role in the War on Terrorism and their sacrifices in this noble effort underscore their dedication and willingness to share great sacrifices.

As we celebrate the second week of Women's History Month, we continue to recognize major accomplishments by women in the military and their contributions to military service. This week we celebrate some Women profiles in history:

Lt. Col. Mary A. Hallaren - The Women's Auxiliary Army Corps was established in May 1942. Mary Hallaren was a member of the first officer training class. Shortly after the first class graduated, U.S. field commanders were calling for a female battalion to help overseas. Hallaren became the battalion's commander. After arriving in England, Halleran began touring the posts and facilities where her WAACs would be working. The commandant at the first post she visited welcomed the female soldiers, but not the regulations that accompanied them. In 1948, Hallaren helped work on the legislation to make the Women's Army Corps a permanent part of the regular Army and Reserves. The legislation finally passed, but with limitations.

Col. Oveta Culp Hobby - From 1942 to 1945, Oveta Culp Hobby served as Director of the Women's Army Corps, and as a result of the success she achieved at this position, was awarded the Distinguished Service Medal. Following World War II, Hobby returned to Houston to help her husband run the Houston Post, and a newly acquired television station. In 1953, President Dwight D. Eisenhower named her head of the Federal Security Agency and later that year she was elevated to a Cabinet position in the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare as its first Secretary, a position she held until 1955 when she resigned and returned to Houston to take care of her ailing husband.

Brig. Gen. Anna Mae Hays - Anna Mae Hays received a commission in the Army Nurse Corps in May 1942. Her overseas assignments included service in India, Korea, and Japan. On June 11, 1970, she became the first woman and the first nurse in American military history to attain general officer rank. During her tenure as Chief she continued to deal with the imposing challenges of recruitment and retention as the Vietnam War reached its height. She received the Distinguished Service Medal, Legion of Merit with Oak Leaf Cluster, and the Army Commendation Medal among her awards and commendations.

Brig. Gen. Elizabeth P. Hoisington - Elizabeth Hoisington advanced through the ranks of the WAC. She served as the Director of the Women's Army Corps from 1966 until 1971. Hoisington was the second woman and first WAC officer to be promoted to the rank of general officer in 1970. Hoisington was promoted on the same day as Hays, simply later in the day.

Col. Debra Lewis - Debra Lewis is a member of the first class with women to graduate from West Point. She also was the U.S. Military Academy's first woman captain of its highly successful intercollegiate equestrian team and was named the 1980 Academy Equestrian of the Year.

Capt. Linda Bray - In 1989 over 700 women went to Panama in support of Operation Just Cause. Capt. Bray led 30 soldiers of the 988th Military Police Company into combat to seize an enemy objective near Panama City. Her role ignited the debate over the role of women in the Army.

Brig. Gen. Coral Pietsch - Coral Pietsch was the first-ever woman general officer in the Judge Advocate General Corps. Brigadier General Pietsch was also the first woman Asian-American general officer in the U.S. Army.

Sgt. Leigh Ann Hester - During an ambush of her convoy in Iraq, Sergeant Hester and her squad repelled at least 30 insurgents. The actions of Sergeant Hester and her comrades earned them great praise for their tactics and actions. Leigh Ann Hester became the first woman to earn the Silver Star Medal for exceptional valor since World War II.

Numbers such as "411," (area code) 555-1212 or any other directory assistance number are not to be used.

This new number will be used when calling from a department land-line, cell phone or Blackberry. When calling for assistance, you will hear, "Welcome to Directory Assistance for the State of New Jersey. Cell phone users should NOT use the auto-connect feature which costs the state and additional 15 cents for each such call. State cell phone and Blackberry users are directed to add this number to their dialing directories.

Another way to further cut costs when looking for telephone numbers is the Web's phone books. Whenever possible these sites should be used as the primary source of directory assistance.

NJ Bar Association offers free legal assistance program

The New Jersey Bar Association has created the Military Legal Assistance Program.

This *pro bono* program provides assistance to New Jersey residents who have served overseas as active duty members of reserve components of the armed forces after Sept. 11, 2001.

Individuals who have been adversely affected upon their return from deployment and the program currently offers assistance to the following areas: family law, employment law and debtor-creditor law.

The Military Legal Assistance program will refer members of the military who contact the state bar association to volunteers qualified to assist them with their specific legal issues. Volunteers who accept a case through the program must agree to handle such case from inception to resolution without compensation or reimbursement for expenses.

Microsoft software available for Army Guardsmen

The Microsoft Home Use Program (HUP) is eligible to all Army personnel including, active duty, reserve, Guard, and civilians currently employed by the Army.

The program allows individuals to get a licensed copy of Microsoft Office desktop applications to install and use on a home computer.

The Army awarded a six – year Enterprise License Agreement (ELA) for Microsoft products on May 30, 2003. The MS ELA established by the Army is a "Volume License" agreement with Software Assurance, and as a "Volume License" owner, the Army is entitled to exercise the Home Use Program.

Army Guard members taking advantage of this offering are responsible for paying the administrative costs for obtaining the software and may use the software as desired. Guard members can only obtain one version of the software at any given time.

"Troops to Teachers" program helps service members become teachers

Troops to Teachers (www.ProudtoServeAgain.com) is administered by the Department of Defense and Department of Education and managed by the Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support (DANTES). The program helps eligible military personnel begin second careers as public school teachers by providing referral assistance, placement services, and - for those electing to teach at high-need schools - financial stipends and bonuses.

Members of the National Guard and Reserves with 10 or more years of service are eligible for the program, provided they commit for an additional three years.

Scholarship, Education News

Bill Extends Education Eligibility

A bill which extends eligibility for higher education tuition assistance to certain former members of New Jersey National Guard and increases the number of tuition-free credits available to National Guard members and their dependents was signed into law by Governor Jon. S. Corzine on Jan. 24.

The legislation would allow National Guard members who are called into active duty to utilize state tuition assistance credits after their enlistment expires.

Under the old law, active members of the New Jersey National Guard may receive up to 15 credits per semester tuition free from public institutions of higher education in the State. Similarly, the child or surviving spouse of a National Guard member killed in the performance of his duties may also receive this benefit.

This bill, A-2542, amended the law to extend eligibility for this higher education tuition benefit to members of the New Jersey National Guard whose use of the free tuition benefit is interrupted by a deployment to active duty. The change would permit these soldiers to receive their earned educational benefits should their enlistment expire, or should they be medically discharged, prior to completing their studies.

The new law will also increase the number of credits eligible for funding under this program from 15 to 16 per semester.
