


Background Statistics





Bloomsbury Borough Flyover






















- The Highlands Municipal Build-Out Report for Bloomsbury Borough was completed by the Highlands Council in collaboration with the municipality prior to a finding of Administrative Completeness of the Petition.
- The Report is dated June 2009.

- Summary of Bloomsbury Borough's Fair Share Obligation
 - Rehabilitation Share: 0 Units
 - Prior Round Obligation: 17 Units
 - Growth Share Obligation: 2 Units
- Summary of Bloomsbury Borough's Fair Share Plan
 - **Rehabilitation Obligation:** None.
 - Prior Round Obligation: The Plan includes a request for a Vacant Land Adjustment on the Prior Round Obligation of 17 units based on the limited utility and development opportunities in the Borough.
 - **Growth Share Obligation:** 2 credits are proposed through the creation of an accessory apartments within existing structures; specific sites are not yet identified.

Bloomsbury's Petition for Plan Conformance Public Comments Received

- Comment: The New Jersey Highlands Coalition supports Bloomsbury Borough's petition for plan conformance. The NJ Highlands Coalition requests that the Highlands Council monitor future redevelopment projects, such as the Historic Mill site, to ensure that they are consistent with the goals of the Regional Master Plan.
- Response: The Highlands Council acknowledges the New Jersey Highlands Coalition's support for the Borough's Petition for Plan Conformance and will continue to work with the Borough in regard to redevelopment planning that is consistent with the Goals, Policies and Objectives of the RMP.

Bloomsbury's Petition for Plan Conformance Future Highlands Protection Fund Grants

- Highlands Implementation Plan and Schedule – Grant funding is proposed for the following:
 - Restoration Plan to protect/restore streams and to mitigate the impacts of future land uses with a focus on the Musconetcong River, which borders the Borough.
 - Sustainable Economic Development Plan to support the Borough's historic center area and include consideration of the Historic Mill site for redevelopment and enhancement of the surrounding business area, as well as, North Street and the Interstate 78 interchange area and agriculture retention possibilities.





Bloomsbury's Petition for Plan Conformance Future Highlands Protection Fund Grants

- Highlands Implementation Plan and Schedule continued
 - Water Use and Conservation Management Plan to prevent, reduce or eliminate deficits in Net Water Availability, for one subwatershed which results in impaired stream flows and aquifer declines during drought periods.
 - Habitat Conservation and Management Plan to identify species at risk, options for restoration of habitat, and standards for mitigation of unavoidable impacts of public and private projects.
