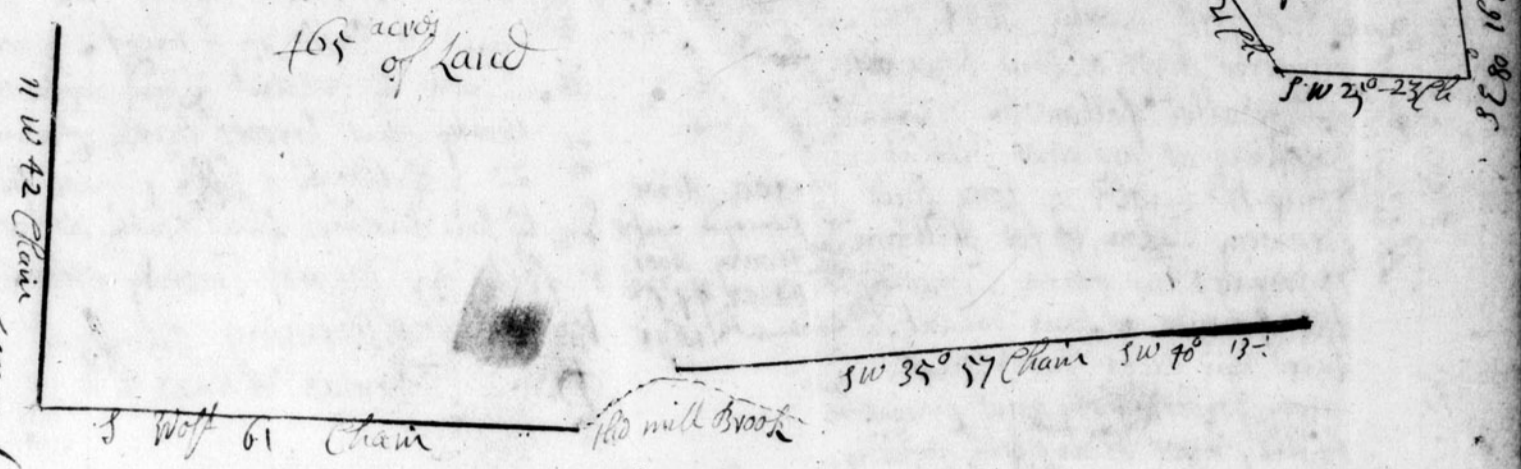


Mahokkomack Run

Mahokkomack Run

60 Acres of Land



Westphalia

By Virtue of a Warrant from the Council of proprietors for 2500 Acres of Land bearing date of 28 of July 1712 to be surveyed into Thomas Stouffer and by virtue of an Act of the Council of bearing date of 28 of April 1713 Thoro is surveyed these two tracts of Land into Johannes Westphalia Claus Westphalia Simon Westphalia Tobias Quick Remova Quick and Carochius Walchert lying upon a branch of Mahokkomack in the Western Division of Township of New Jersey

The Bigger Tract **Beginneth** at a post standing by a side branch called Mahokkomack for a corner and so from thence North west 42 Chains to another corner post

Thence South West Sixty and Chains to a small Black oak by side of a brook

Thence down the said brook South Easterly twenty degrees two Chain & a half

Thence South West by Ten degrees and Chains & another still down of land to the other corner

Thence South West by thirty five degrees fifty seven Chains to a corner post

Thence South West by forty degrees thirteen Chains to a post called Mahokkomack

Thence up of land of several courses Thence to a post mentioned corner containing four hundred and sixty five Acres of Land surveyed June of 1717 by me

and returned By me John Reading Surveyor General

The Last Tract **Beginneth** at a corner standing by a side branch Mahokkomack below the other tract from thence South West by eighty degrees twenty and Chains to a corner post

Thence South West by twenty five degrees twenty three Chains to a corner post

Thence South Easterly eighty degrees sixteen Chains to a post called Mahokkomack

Thence by the land the several courses Thence to a post mentioned corner containing sixty Acres of Land both Tracts containing in all whole five hundred Acres besides the usual allowance for High Ways surveyed June of 18th June 1713 - by me John Chapman & returned By me John Reading Surveyor General
