In Pursuance of an Order bearing Date of 1755 Ordering the full Quantity of Acres of Land to be Surveyed unto Abraham Leeds in any part unappropriated in the Western Division of New Jersey

I Have Surveyed part of the Same in Two Separate Surveybooths Situate in Gloucester County Lying on Two Small Branches (that puts in a branch of Little Egg Harbour River - Called Affciunk) That is to say one Survey lying on a small branch that puts in the westerly Side of said Affciunk and is Bounded as Followeth viz: Beginning at a Forked Top pine market four blades Eight Nicks Standing in y<sup>e</sup> Edge of y<sup>e</sup> Cripple the Southerly Side of y<sup>e</sup> Small branch and Runs from thence down the same (1) South Seventy one Degrees East five Chains to a corner near y<sup>e</sup> head of a Saw Mill pond called Goshion Mill. Then a cross y<sup>e</sup> branch (2) North Nineteen Degrees East Two Chains Then (3) North Seventy one Degrees West five Chains Then (4) South Nineteen Degrees West Two Chains to y<sup>e</sup> place of Beginning in which bounds Contains one Acre of Cedar Swamp. Strict measure

The Other Survey Situate on a small branch that puts in y<sup>e</sup> Easterly side of said Affciunk and is thus Bounded viz: Beginning at a pine market four blades Eight Nicks Lettered A L Standing in y<sup>e</sup> Edge of y<sup>e</sup> Cripple y<sup>e</sup> Southerly side of said Small branch

Branch near y<sup>e</sup> head of the Ceders and runs from thence down y<sup>e</sup> S:  
branch (1<sup>st</sup>) South eighty one Degrees Thirty Minutes West Six Chains to  
a Small pine markt four Clafs light Nicks Standing near some  
plains or meadow ground Then Crossing said Small branch (2<sup>d</sup>) North  
Nine Degrees West one Chain & Eighty five links to a post Then  
up y<sup>e</sup> Swamp (3<sup>d</sup>) North eighty one Degrees Thirty Minutes East  
Six Chains Then (4<sup>th</sup>) South Nine Degrees East one Chain & Eighty  
five links to y<sup>e</sup> place of Beginning in which bounds contain <sup>one</sup> ~~one~~  
Acre and ~~Sixteen~~ <sup>Seventeen</sup> Perches of Cedar Swamp Strict measure  
With the usual Allowance for highways there Remains but  
Two Acres of Cedar Swamp in y<sup>e</sup> aforesaid Surveys.
