## HOUSING

**NJ HMFA Housing & Mortgage Finance Agency** - increasing the availability and accessibility of affordable housing throughout NJ. Funds distributed by formula for road improvement projects such as resurfacing, rehabilitation or reconstruction and signalization. Municipalities may apply for bikeways, bridge preservation, mobility, pedestrian safety, quality of life, roadway preservation and roadway safety. ### **ENVIRONMENT/ENERGY/OPEN SPACE**

\* NJDEP – CAFRA impervious cover limits and vegetative cover requirements, Division of Land Use Regulation - Under the Coastal Zone Management Rules, CAFRA-regulated development located within a CAFRA center that is a Center, Core and/or Node recognized by the State Planning Commission and reviewed and accepted by the NJDEP for the purposes of CAFRA, receives higher impervious cover limits than development located outside of a CAFRA center. #### NJ GREEN ACRES PROGRAM

Site Specific Incentive Acquisition - Funding is available in the form of a Green Acres 25% or 50% matching grant, depending on whether the municipality or county has an open space tax (or approved alternative) and an adopted Open Space & Recreation Plan. Green Acres loans are available at 2% interest, payable over thirty years. If your Open Space & Recreation Plan is more than six years old, you must review it as part of the master plan re-examination process and update as needed and notify your Green Acres of any plan updates. <u>https://www.nj.gov/dep/greenacres/state.html</u>

Outdoor Recreation (Non-Urban Aid) – Green Acres provides loan funding for the development of outdoor recreation facilities. All non-Urban Aid development loans are at 2% interest, payable over twenty years. For park development projects located in Densely or Highly Populated Municipalities or sponsored by Highly Populated Counties, funding is available in the form of a 25% matching grant, with the balance as a loan, subject to available funding. Projects sponsored by Densely Populated Counties are eligible for funding is in the form of a 50% matching grant, with the balance as a loan, subject to available funding. <u>https://www.nj.gov/dep/greenacres/local\_faq.html</u>

Stewardship Grants - The Preserve New Jersey Act made funding available to local governments for stewardship activities, defined as "an activity, which is beyond routine operations and maintenance, undertaken by the State, a local government or qualifying tax exempt nonprofit organization to repair or restore lands acquired for recreation and conservation purposes for the purpose of enhancing or protecting those lands for recreation and conservation purposes." Green Acres has decided to focus its limited Stewardship funding on natural resource and conservation projects and not active recreation facilities. Local governments seeking to make improvements to recreation facilities (such as ballfields) may apply for Green Acres park development funds. Stewardship funding will be in the form of a 50% matching grant or, for projects in Urban Aid municipalities 75% matching grants.

\*Smart Growth Approvals - The Department assigns ranking points to projects that serve municipalities that the State Planning Commission has approved under the Center Designation or Plan Endorsement Process. In addition, projects located in or benefiting areas designated as BDAs, TDR receiving areas or Transit Villages also receive 15 points, Please note that if a local entity has not received SPC designation, projects within that entity would receive zero points for this element: a. Projects located predominantly within or designed to provide service to a designated growth

area that lies within an Urban Center or Urban Complex are eligible for 20 points.

b. Projects located predominantly within or designed to provide service to a designated growth area that lies within a municipality that has received Plan Endorsement of its Master Plan from the NJ SPC are eligible for 25 points.

\*Downtown Business Improvement Zone Loan Fund (NJ DCA) - The DBIZ Loan Fund provides 0% loans to support purchases, leases, condemn or acquire land or interest therein as necessary for right of way or other easement to or from the zone; relocate and move persons displaced by the acquisition of land; the rehabilitation and redevelopment of land; acquisition, construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation or installation of parking and other public facilities and improvements; costs of appraisals or other professional services directly related to effectuating the improvement.

# **COVID 19 Resources for Businesses**

### New Jersey Economic Development Authority (NJEDA) 1-800-JERSEY -7

**Small Business Assistance Grant (\$5 million)** - The NJEDA established an emergency assistance grant benefiting businesses with NAICS Codes (44, 45, 71, 72, 811, and 812). Grants are available up to \$5k to small businesses in retail, arts, entertainment, recreation, accommodation, food service, and other services to stabilize operations and reduce the need for layoffs or furloughs;

Small Business Assistance Loan Program (\$10 million) - Direct working capital business loans up to \$100k

**NJEDA** offering a 80% loan guarantee for working capital loans to entrepreneurs to encourage continued investment in the innovation and technology economy.

**US Economic Development Administration (USEDA)** - **\$**1.5 billion CARES Act through South Jersey Economic Development District (SJEDD) and Increased allocations to revolving loan funds throughout New Jersey.

### Small Business Administration (SBA)

#### SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loans/Emergency Economic Injury Grants

Loans can be up to a maximum of \$2 million available for both small businesses and private nonprofits with a \$10k grant advance. This is the only program that can be applied for directly online – the others are through SBA lenders.
