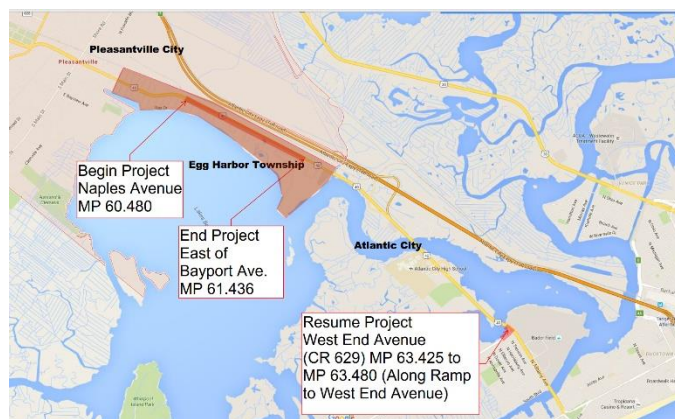

Please come at a time that is convenient for you. You will have an opportunity to review exhibits of the draft study findings, ask questions and discuss any concerns with NJDOT representatives and the Designer, WSP. Property owners with rental units are advised that tenants are also invited and encouraged to participate.

### BACKGROUND

The project is located in two distinct parts: from MP 60.480 (Naples Avenue) to MP 61.436 (Bayport Avenue) in Egg Harbor Township, and from MP 63.425 to MP 63.480 (Ramp from Route 40 eastbound to West End Avenue) in Atlantic City. Route 40 is an evacuation route that experiences flooding conditions, primarily due to tidal surges from the Lakes Bay and Beach Thorofare.



### THE PROPOSED PROJECT

#### *Egg Harbor Township:*

The project involves raising the roadway (including sidewalks and driveways) as much as 2.5 feet, upgrading an existing drainage outfall at Venice Avenue, and extending an existing sea wall at Brenta Avenue approximately 800 feet eastwardly to help mitigate flooding from tidal surges. Additionally, scour countermeasures will be installed at the existing outfall located in Lakes Bay across from the development near Dunlin Lane. As part of the improvements, existing underground and aerial utilities will need to be relocated.

#### *Atlantic City:*

The project involves installing sheeting along the ramp from Route 40 EB to West End Avenue to the vicinity of N. Harrisburg Ave. and upgrading an existing drainage outfall, in order to mitigate flooding that occurs at the ramp from tidal surges. As part of the improvements, existing aerial utilities will need to be temporarily relocated.

### ENVIRONMENTAL

While the Route 40 corridor is mainly developed, some minor environmental impacts will result from project activities. NJDOT will secure the appropriate approvals for impacts to wetlands, riparian zones, and coastal areas. Mitigation for environmental impacts will be provided as necessary.
