## **Route 1&9 northbound ramp to Paterson Plank Road closed and detoured Monday as Route 495 bridge deck replacement advances Closure necessary for a concrete pour on Route 495 westbound**

**(Trenton)** – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced that the Route 1&9 northbound ramp to Paterson Plank Road will be closed and detoured on Monday, June 1 as the Route 495 bridge deck replacement project advances in North Bergen.

Beginning at 8 a.m. Monday, June 1 until 4 p.m., NJDOT's contractor, IEW Construction Group, is scheduled to close and detour the Route 1&9 northbound ramp to Paterson Plank Road to allow a concrete pour on Route 495 westbound. In addition, Paterson Plank Road may have alternating traffic under Route 495 during the same time. Route 1&9 northbound travel lanes will not be effected. The following detour will be in place:

### **Route 1&9 northbound to Paterson Plank Road Detour**

- Traffic on Route 1&9 northbound wishing to use the ramp to Paterson Plank Road will be directed to stay left prior to the ramp and get on Route 3 westbound
- Take the first exit for Route 495/Lincoln Tunnel
- Follow the ramp onto Route 495 eastbound
- Stay in the right lane and take the Columbia Avenue exit to Paterson Plank Road

### **Project Overview**

The \$90.3 million state-funded project to rehabilitate the nine-span Route 495 viaduct includes repairs and reconstruction of the bridge deck, replacement and strengthening of deteriorated structural steel, and the repair and painting of the substructure. Construction began in September 2017 with work under the bridge and along the Paterson Plank Road/Union Turnpike corridor. The second phase of work began on the bridge in August 2018 with the closure of a single lane in each direction on Route 495. Traffic impacts associated with the second phase of construction on Route 495 are expected to last for about two and a half years while the entire bridge deck is replaced. Construction will be accomplished in stages to minimize the impact to motorists.

### **Community Outreach**

NJDOT created a project-specific website – [www.RestoreNJ495.com](http://www.RestoreNJ495.com) – which contains a wealth of information about the Route 495 Bridge rehabilitation, and will be updated with relevant new information as work progresses. The Department is carefully coordinating the Route 495 Bridge rehabilitation project with other regional transportation infrastructure projects to minimize traffic congestion.
