## **I-295 southbound lane closures tonight as Missing Moves project advances in Camden County** **Lane closures necessary to implement a traffic shift**

**(Trenton)** – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced an overnight lane closure on I-295 southbound tonight to establish a traffic shift as the I-295/Route 42 Missing Moves project advances in Bellmawr, Camden County.

Beginning at 8 p.m. tonight, Friday, June 12, until 6 a.m., Saturday, June 13, NJDOT's contractor, South State Inc., is scheduled to close two lanes of I-295 southbound from Creek Road to Almonesson Road to place construction barriers on left shoulder and implement a new traffic pattern. At least one lane will be maintained overnight.

By Saturday morning, all three lanes of traffic will be reopened and shifted toward the right shoulder from approximately Creek Road to Almonesson Road. The shift will create a work zone on the left side of the southbound lanes to begin the reconstruction and widening of the bridge over Big Timber Creek.

The \$180 million federally-funded project will build new ramps connecting Route 42 northbound to I-295 southbound, and I-295 northbound to Route 42 southbound in order to allow for the direct movement of traffic between the two roadways. These are commonly known as the "missing moves." The project will also include the demolition and reconstruction of the Creek Road Bridge over I-295 between Route 42 and Almonesson Road. The majority of the project will be built off of the roadways and will have minimal impact on traffic on Route 42 and I-295. The project is expected to be completed in late 2023.

Variable Message Signs are being utilized to provide advance notification to the motoring public of all traffic pattern changes associated with the work. The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
