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## **Milltown Road-North Main Street/CR 606 lane closures tonight as bridge replacement project begins in North Brunswick Northbound traffic to be shifted overnight**

**(Trenton)** – The New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) today announced overnight lane closures and a traffic shift on the Milltown Road-North Main Street/CR 606 Bridge over Route 1 as a bridge deck reconstruction project begins in North Brunswick, Middlesex County.

Beginning at 9 p.m., tonight, Thursday, October 8, NJDOT's contractor, Earle Asphalt, is scheduled close one lane in each direction on the Milltown Road-North Main Street/CR 606 Bridge over Route 1 to prepare for a traffic shift.

By 6 a.m. Friday, October 9, northbound traffic will be shifted onto the southbound side of the bridge, with one lane maintained in each direction. The traffic shift will allow the contractor to demolish and reconstruct the northbound side of the bridge. The traffic pattern is anticipated to remain in place until summer 2021.

In the coming weeks, lane closures will be required as necessary on Route 1 in both directions between Ryders Lane and the Route 130 junction to allow for installation of temporary shielding underneath the bridge deck. Two lanes will remain open at all times during construction.

The \$8.7 federally-funded Milltown Road/North Main Street/CR 606 Bridge over Route 1 project will replace the existing bridge deck, which is in poor condition. The project is being constructed in stages to minimize impact to traffic. When this stage is completed in the summer 2021, work will begin on the southbound side of the bridge deck. In addition to replacing the bridge deck, the project will demolish and reconstruct the abutments, pier, and install new overhead sign structures. The project is expected to be completed by late summer 2022.

Variable message signs are being utilized throughout the project limits to provide advance notification to motorists of all traffic pattern changes associated with the bridge replacements. Throughout the project, NJDOT provided information before upcoming road closures.

The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
