Route 440 northbound temporary closure required to remove damaged overhead sign structure in Woodbridge, Middlesex County Expect heavy congestion or plan alternate route

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced that traffic on Route 440 northbound will be stopped for approximately 30 minutes this afternoon to remove a damaged overhead sign structure in Woodbridge, Middlesex County.

Beginning at approximately 1:30 p.m. today, Tuesday, March 30, NJDOT's contractor, Power Concrete, is scheduled to stop traffic on Route 440 northbound towards Staten Island near the Route 9/Garden State Parkway interchange for approximately 30 minutes. This will allow the contractor to remove a damaged overhead sign structure that was struck by a dump truck earlier this morning. Motorists should expect heavy congestion on Route 440 in both directions or plan an alternate route.
