## Larchmont Boulevard to close tomorrow for railroad-crossing repairs in Mount Laurel, Burlington County Signed detour will be in place for several days

**(Trenton)** – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced the start of a railroad crossing rehabilitation project that will require the closure and detour of Larchmont Boulevard in Mount Laurel, Burlington County.

Beginning at 7 a.m. tomorrow, Wednesday, September 8 until 7 a.m. Friday, September 10, Larchmont Boulevard is scheduled to be closed in both directions at the railroad crossing adjacent to Marne Highway/CR 537. This closure will allow NJDOT's contractor to remove and reconstruct the existing railroad crossing and approaches. Motorists are advised to follow the signed detours which will be in place.

The existing crossing and approaches are being replaced with new concrete crossings and new asphalt approaches in order to provide a safer and smoother railroad crossing. This federally-funded project is included within NJDOT's railroad grade-crossing safety program which repairs, upgrades, or removes approximately 50 crossings each year, statewide.

The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
