Route 70 eastbound single lane closure tonight to restripe in Cherry Hill, Camden County Restriping necessary to narrow lanes

(Trenton) – A single lane on Route 70 eastbound will be closed tonight between Haddonfield Road/Grove Street and Kings Highway/Route 41 in Cherry Hill, Camden County.

Beginning at 7 p.m. tonight, Friday, April 21, until 6 a.m. tomorrow, Saturday, April 22, a single lane on Route 70 eastbound is scheduled to be closed between Haddonfield Road/Grove Street and Kings Highway/Route 41. The lane closure is necessary to restripe the roadway. At least one lane of traffic will be maintained overnight. By 6 a.m. Saturday, lanes on Route 70 eastbound will be narrowed from 12 feet to 11 feet. Motorists are advised to slow down, use caution and expect delays or plan an alternate route.

The work is part of a \$151 million state-funded Route 70 corridor safety and improvement project that will upgrade traffic signals at 27 intersections, replace or install four Dynamic Message Signs, improve drainage, sidewalks, and resurface approximately 9 miles of Route 70 between Route 38 in Cherry Hill and Cooper Avenue in Evesham. In addition to milling and paving Route 70, the N. Maple Ave loop ramps and the Route 70/Route 73 interchange ramps will be repaved as well. The project is expected to be completed by winter 2026. The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
