I-78 westbound Local ramp to I-78 westbound to be closed and detoured tonight in Springfield, Union County I-78 westbound Express right lane to be closed overnight

(Trenton) – The I-78 westbound Local ramp to I-78 westbound at Exit 48 will be closed and detoured tonight for concrete deck repairs in Springfield, Union County. In addition, the right lane on I-78 westbound Express is scheduled to be closed before the Local and Express lanes merge.

Beginning at 11 p.m. tonight, Friday, July 7, until 6 a.m. tomorrow, Saturday, July 8, NJDOT's contractor, IEW Construction, is scheduled to close the I-78 westbound Local ramp to I-78 westbound at Exit 48/Route 24 westbound to make concrete deck repairs to the I-78 westbound Bridge over Route 24 eastbound. In addition, the I-78 westbound Express right lane will be closed just before the bridge at Milepost 49.2. The three right lanes on I-78 westbound after the Local and Express lanes merge are scheduled to be closed. At least one lane will be maintained during construction. The following detour will be in place:

I-78 westbound Local ramp to I-78 westbound detour:

- Motorists on I-78 westbound Local wishing to take the ramp to I-78 westbound/Clinton will be directed to take Exit 48 to Route 24 westbound to I-287/Springfield/Morristown
- Take Exit 7B-A to Route 124 westbound/River Road/Summit/Chatham
- Take Exit 7A to Route 124 westbound/Chatham
- Keep left to take the ramp to Route 24 westbound/Summit
- Take the ramp to I-78 westbound/Clinton

The work is part of a \$22.6 million state-funded maintenance project to repair concrete structures at various locations in eight counties throughout North Jersey.
