Route 70 eastbound and I-295 interchange ramps scheduled to be closed this weekend in Cherry Hill Ramp closures necessary for milling and paving

(Trenton) – The ramp from Route 70 eastbound to I-295 southbound and the ramp from I-295 northbound to Route 70 eastbound are scheduled to be closed and detoured tonight in Cherry Hill, Camden County.

Beginning at 10 p.m. tonight, Friday, May 31 until 6 a.m. Sunday, June 2, the ramps from Route 70 eastbound to I-295 southbound and from I-295 northbound to Route 70 eastbound are scheduled to be closed and detoured. The ramp closures are necessary for milling and paving. The following detours will be in place:

Route 70 eastbound to I-295 southbound:

- Motorists on Route 70 eastbound wishing to take the ramp to I-295 southbound/Delaware Memorial Bridge will be directed to turn right onto Marlkress Road
- Turn left onto Old Cuthbert Road
- Turn left onto Route 70 westbound
- Take the ramp to I-295 southbound/Delaware Memorial Bridge

I-295 northbound Exit 34A to Route 70 eastbound:

- Motorists on I-295 northbound wishing to take Exit 34A to Route 70 eastbound/Marlton will be directed to take Exit 34B to Route 70 westbound/Cherry Hill/Camden
- Take the jughandle to Covered Bridge Road/U and Left Turns
- Turn left onto Route 70 eastbound

The work is part of a \$151 million state-funded Route 70 corridor safety and improvement project that will upgrade traffic signals at 27 intersections, replace or install four Dynamic Message Signs, improve drainage, sidewalks, and resurface approximately nine miles of Route 70 between Route 38 in Cherry Hill and Cooper Avenue in Evesham. In addition to milling and paving Route 70, the North Maple Avenue loop ramps and the Route 70/Route 73 interchange ramps will be repaved as well. The project is expected to be completed by winter 2026.
